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## Part IV.—Land Settlement.

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### FINAL ORDERS.

#### Order under Section 4, Sub-section (1), of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903."

In the matter of the land commonly called or known as Bulatgahahenakumbura, situate in the village of Beralapanatara, in the Morawak korale of the Matara District, in the Southern Province, and of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903."

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 1 of the said Ordinances it was duly declared and notified on February 28, 1913, that if no claim to the land commonly called or known as Bulatgahahenakumbura, situate in the village of Beralapanatara, in the Morawak korale of the Matara District, in the Southern Province, containing in extent 1 rood and 8 perches, and shown as lot 553B in block survey preliminary plan 33 and in the annexed diagram, was made to the Assistant Government Agent of the Matara District within the period of three months from the date specified in the said notice such land would be declared the property of the Crown, and dealt with on account of the Crown (*vide* Notice No. 4,771):

And whereas Talwattage Luwishami of Ketawala made claim thereto, and I, George Frederick Reginald Browning Assistant Government Agent of the Matara District, made due inquiry into such claim; and whereas the said claimant and I, George Frederick Reginald Browning, entered into an agreement dated August 7, 1913, whereby it was agreed that the said claimant should be declared the purchaser of the said land upon payment of a sum of Four Rupees (Rs. 4) only as the purchase amount of the said land; and whereas the said amount has been duly paid by the said claimant, he is hereby, in pursuance of the agreement afore-mentioned, declared to be the purchaser of the said land, as more fully described herein below.

#### *Description of the Land referred to.*

The land commonly called or known as Bulatgahahenakumbura, situated in the village of Beralapanatara, in the Morawak korale of the Matara District, Southern Province, containing in extent 1 rood and 8 perches, shown as lot 553B in block survey preliminary plan 33 and in the annexed diagram, and bounded as follows: on the north by Bulatgahahena, garden claimed by T. Luvishamy; on the east by Bulatgahahena, chena claimed by T. Luvishamy and path; on the south by Bulatgahahena, chena claimed by T. Luvishamy; on the west by Bulatgahahena, garden claimed by T. Luvishamy, and path.
