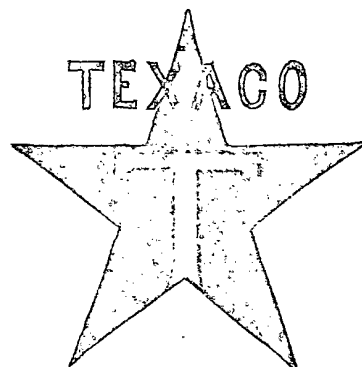

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

*No. 1,315 of December 7, 1912 (date applied for under section 50 of the Ordinance, August 6, 1912).**Der Fiskus des Schutzgebietes Kamerun.*

"Improved process for increasing the output of para rubber trees."

Abstract.—The inventor states :—

The invention relates to a process for tapping Para rubber trees (*Hevea Brasiliensis*). The process consists in the outer dead bark, which is more particularly brittle and fragile, being scraped off. The consequence of this measure is an irritation produced on the tree, which results in a striking increase of the output of latex and rubber.

The process is carried out by scraping off by means of a knife or other suitable scraper the outer dead layers of bark, up to the green cork cambium, namely from the ground to the highest level of tapping. After a few weeks, the process can be repeated, as a new layer of cork is very soon formed.

The claim is :—

A process for increasing the output of the Para rubber tree, consisting in irritating the inner bark of the tree by scraping off with a knife or other suitable scraper the outer dead bark from the ground to the highest level of tapping.

"Improvements in the methods of collecting rubber latex and in the method of and in apparatus for estimating the amount of indiarubber in rubber latex."

Abstract :—

The inventor states :—The objects of this invention are as follows :—To rapidly estimate the quantity of latex brought in by the cooly; to estimate the quantity of wet rubber contained in the latex; and to preserve the latex and keep it free from acid during the time it is being tested and transported to the factory by the addition of ammonia in just sufficient quantity required and no more.

The claims are :—

(1) In methods of collecting rubber latex the addition to latex at or about the point or time of collection of the amount of ammonia requisite to prevent coagulation, the amount of ammonia required being determined from latexometer readings of the latex, substantially as in the manner hereinbefore described.

(2) In apparatus for estimating the amount of indiarubber in rubber latex a metal bucket, to be used as a standard of capacity for that purpose, such bucket having a low capacity lower part and a high capacity higher part, substantially as hereinbefore described and as illustrated.

(3) In apparatus for estimating the amount of indiarubber in rubber latex a graduated staff for use in the bucket of Claim 2 such staff being so marked as to give the required information by a direct reading or by reference to a table or the like of information, substantially as hereinbefore described.

(4) In apparatus for estimating the amount of indiarubber in rubber latex a strainer for straining the latex substantially as hereinbefore described.

(5) In apparatus for estimating the amount of indiarubber in rubber latex a register for recording the requisite information relating to the latexometer readings of latex, substantially as hereinbefore described.

"A combined cup and lip in conjunction with a spout for collecting latex."

Abstract.—This invention consists of a cup provided with an elongated lip (resembling a saucepan handle) but which is hollowed to form a channel for conducting the latex along it. The end of that lip is flanged upwards at right angles and the edge is cut hollow-crescent shaped. That flanged end is intended to hook under the downwardly flanged end of a spout driven slantingly into the bark of the tree. The cup with the elongated lip being simply hooked under the flanged end of the spout would inevitably drop unless, as the inventor states, spout and cup are placed in a downwardly slanting position so that the bottom edge of the cup rests against the tree and by the friction between cup and tree causes an upward tilt of the flanged end of the lip against the flanged end of the spout.

The claim is :—

1. The combination of a cup and lip with a spout substantially as described and illustrated for collecting latex from rubber and other trees or plants.

"Improvements in apparatus for drying tea leaf."

*Abstract.*—The inventor states :—This invention relates to apparatus for drying tea leaf ; and is of the type in which an inclined rotating hollow cylinder is employed, the walls of which are formed of wire gauze, surrounded by a casing the tea leaf being subjected to a current of heated air to effect the drying thereof.

The improvements in this invention consist in the general construction, combination and arrangement of parts of the apparatus, the main features of which are the construction of the rotary cylinder, the air for drying purposes being conveyed in a conduit to the whole of the under side of the periphery of the rotary cylinder, and being supplied to such conduit at a point near to exit of the treated leaf the conduit extending along the extreme length of the rotatory cylinder, and also providing the outer casing with adjustable apertures for controlling the exit of the air, and means for feeding the leaf centrally into the rotatory cylinder.

The claims are :—

(1) In apparatus for drying tea leaf a hollow perforated drying cylinder constructed in the manner above described, in combination with means for centrally feeding the leaf to the upper end of cylinder ; means for supplying a current of heated air through a conduit situated below and communicating with the whole underside of the drying cylinder, the air being supplied to such conduit at a point near the exit of the treated tea leaf from the cylinder, and adjustable means for allowing the air to escape near the upper part of the casing, as and for the purpose shown and described.

(2) In apparatus for drying tea leaf, as claimed in claim 1, extending the casing which surrounds the drying cylinder below such cylinder so as to form the conduit for conveying the air to the drying cylinder, substantially as shown and described.

(3) In apparatus for drying tea leaf the construction, combination and arrangement of parts as described and illustrated in the drawings annexed.
