MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 29, 1913.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 22, 1913.

Present :—Mr. E. B. Alexander, Chairmah; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; the Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. A. J. Martin; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Lieut-Col. M. L. Hearn, R.A.M.C.; Mr. W. Sutherland Ross; Mr. T. Leese; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; and Mr. T. H. Chapman.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 16, 1913, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 16, 1913, be confirmed.

The Chairman, with leave of Council, read his draft address of welcome to His Excellency Sir Robert Chalmers, K.C.B., for the approval of the Members.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene proposed that the Chairman's draft address of welcome to His Excellency Sir Robert Chalmers, K.C.B., be adopted, and that the sum of Rs. 500 be voted to defray the cost of a casket and an illuminated copy of the address. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

2. With regard to the first question on the agenda, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, who had given notice of the same, stated that he would withdraw the question in view of the Chairman having informed him that a prosecution had been authorized.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman whether he had made any inquiries with regard to the subject matter of his letter No. 123 of June 15, 1913, who is responsible for keeping personal files of officers of this Council, and whether sufficient precautions are taken to prevent these files being tampered with, and moved that, in future, all personal files be kept in the Record Office of this Council, and in charge of the Recordkeeper.

The motion was not seconded.

The Chairman, however, explained that Dr. W. P. Rodrigo's letter, No. 123 of June 15 last, referred to the personal file of H. E. de Silva, who took an action against the Council, claiming damages for wrongful dismissal. The action was dismissed. The system of keeping personal files of all officers of the Council was begun only in 1912. They are kept in the offices of the Heads of the Departments concerned. There is a standing order prohibiting the issue of his personal file to any officer without the written permission of the Head of the Department. It would be inconvenient to keep these personal files in charge of the Recordkeeper of the Secretariat.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked whether the Chairman will make a statement for the information of the Ratepayers, under what circumstances the scarcity of water at Hulftsdorp reported, in *The Ceylonese* of the 10th instand occurred, and whether all possible precautions have been taken to prevent its recurrence.

The Chairman stated that "a prolonged drought was the primary cause of the scarcity of water at Hulftsdorp. The Chairman is unable to take any precaution to prevent the recurrence of such a circumstance. It had been explained more than once previously that Hulftsdorp is at such an elevation that it cannot be supplied when the water in the reservoir sinks 12 feet. The new main from Labugama will bring in so much more water that there will be no likelihood of the water level being reduced in the reservoir to such an extent as to leave Hulftsdorp without a supply when the new main has been completed."

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that this Council do apply for the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council—

- (a) To incur the necessary expenditure, not exceeding Rs. 5,000, to construct at the Home for the Aged a water carriage latrine for the use of inmates of the said home, or, in the alternative, (b) to pay over to the Rev. Superioress in charge of the Home for the Aged the sum of Rs. 5,000, to enable her to expend the same in the construction of a water-carriage latrine for the use of the inmates of the said home.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that the Council do contribute half the sum asked for, if the other half be subscribed by Government or made up by contributions from the public. Dr. David Rockwood seconded.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked the permission of Council to confine his motion to the alternative (b).

On a show of hands being taken the amendment was declared lost, 5 voting for it and 13 against. The original motion was then put to the Meeting and carried.

- (22) Symond's road and Maradana road junction improvement—Fixing of a lamp bracket to a tramway pole at the junction of Symond's road and Maradana. Recommended payment of Re. 1 per annum to Messrs. Boustead Brothers for the use of a tramway pole for fixing a lamp bracket.

13. To consider a letter from the Officer Commanding, Barracks, Colombo, requesting a reduction in the charge for the conservancy of all Military Quarters and Barracks in Colombo, in view of the connection of some of the Military buildings with the water-borne system of conservancy.

Resolved, that the Chairman's draft reply to the Officer Commanding, Barracks, Colombo, be approved.

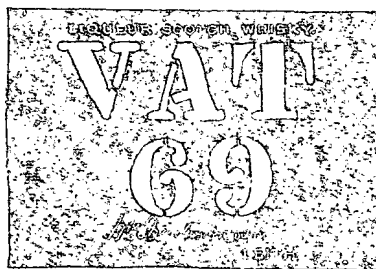
