#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 16, 1913, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 12, 1913.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. Labrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 19 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
  - 2. The following documents were submitted:-
    - (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1912 to July 31, 1913, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for July.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July.
  - 4. Correspondence:
- (1) Letter No. 10 of July 25 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Treasurer has forwarded to the Council a sum of Rs. 1,375, the Government grant for the fifteen months ending September 30, 1914, for Lady Horton's walk and connected paths.—Read.
- (2) Letter No. 11 of July 29 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, re compensation to local bodies for loss of revenue owing to the new opium system.—Read.
- (3) Letter No. 12 of August 1 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that a sum of Rs. 3755 has been forwarded to the Council, as the Government grant for the conservancy of the Kandy lake.—Read.
- (4) Letter No. 13 of August 6, 1913, intimating that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased to sanction the payment from Municipal Funds of an annual contribution of Rs. 240 as a subsidy in aid of the Kandy Industrial School.—Read.
- (5) Letter No. 427 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, intimating that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has approved the proposal that the lease to the Council of the Military land at Mahaiyawa be cancelled, and that the plot be vested in the Council for the information of the Chairman.—Read.
- (6) Letter No. 176 of August 4 from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, forwarding for the information of the Council a copy of letter No. 611 of July 31, 1913, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Director of Public Works, regarding the maintenance of the Garrison cemetery, Kandy.—Read.
- (7) Letter No. 173 of August 1 from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, re Advisory Committees under the Excise Ordinance. On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee.

Mr. Weerasooria proposed, that Mr. L. H. S. Pieris be nominated an Unofficial Member in the Advisory Committee for the Municipal area.—Mr. Labrooy seconded.

There being no other name proposed, the Chairman declared Mr. Pieris duly selected.

The Council resumed, and the appointment of Mr. Pieris was confirmed.

- 5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Labrooy moved—(1) "That the scavenging of the town and the removal of night soil be given on contract from January 1, 1914, on such terms and for such period as the Council may think fit, and that the question be referred to a Select Committee consisting of Messrs. Beven, Jonklaas, Dr. de Saram, the mover, and the Chairman—three to form a quorum. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.
- (2) Mr. Labrooy moved—"That this Council do take steps to have all cesspits closed and dry-earth closets substituted in their place, except where it is absolutely impracticable to do so." Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.
- (3) Mr. Labrooy moved—"That this Council do take immediate steps to have all cesspits, which are reported by the Inspectors to be in an insanitary state, closed, and fresh ones opened where it is impracticable to substitute dry-earth closets for them." Mr. Tomalin seconded.—Carried.
  - 6. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-
- (1) Finance and Assessment.—That the salary of the assistant to the Sinhalese Teacher, Municipal School, be raised from Rs. 15 to Rs. 20 per mensem.

  Resolved.—That the recommendation be adopted.
- (2) That the salary of the Chief Inspector be raised from Rs. 1,310 to Rs. 2,000 per annum by increments of Rs. 100 a year.
- Mr. LaBrooy moved that the matter be deferred for consideration pending the appointment of a Committee to report on the working of the Health Department, which it was his intention to propose at the next Meeting of Council.
- Mr. Weerasooria seconded.

  Mr. Beven was of opinion that the Council should either accept or reject the recommendation before them, and that
  Mr. LaBrooy's suggestion was therefore not in order.

Mr. LaBrooy's motion was put to the Meeting and carried by five to two.

(3) That the commission paid to Distraining Officers W. D. C. Appuhamy and D. K. Gunasekera be raised from 5 per cent. to 8 per cent. on town collections. Also that the commission for collection of village rates be as follows:—

For recovery on receipts without costs, 6 per cent.; for recovery on warrant, 5 per cent.

Resolved—That the recommendation be adopted.

(4) Municipal Works.—That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to (a) No. 360, Peradeniya road, K. G. Deonis Appuhamy; (b) No. 41, Trincomalee street, A. Abubakker Ajim; (c) Nos. 76 and 77, King street, A. Ibrahim Saibo; (d) No. 10, Castle Hill street, C. Sahul Hameed.

Resolved—That the recommendation be adopted.

7. Supplemental Budget No. 1 of 1913. Resolved—That the Budget be passed.

8. To restore to office Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene, who has ceased to be a Member of Council through having failed to attend three consecutive Meetings.

Mr. Pieris moved—That Mr. Wijegoonewardene be restored to office, as provided in section 30 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.
