- Health Officer's Report for August.
- Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of August.
- The Reservoir Readings for August.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during August.

4. Correspondence :—

- Letter No. 14 of August 18, 1913, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 144 to the widow and five children of the late N. Ismail, Overseer, under the Municipal Council.—Read.

- (ii.) Letter of August 16 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Secretary, Planters' Association of Ceylon, intimating that there is no provision in the Customs Ordinance under which duty can be waived on the clock which is to be placed on the Victoria Commemoration Buildings, Kandy, for the information of the Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy.—Read.
- (iii.) Letter of August 30 from the Manager, Kandy Industrial School, thanking the Municipal Council for the contribution of Rs. 20 a month made to the school.—Read.
- (iv.) Letter of August 26 from the Mr. E. Beven suggesting that Government be asked for the services of an Engineer, connected with the Colombo Waterworks, to advise the Council as to the steps to be taken in regard to the leak in the reservoir. It was agreed to await Mr. Tomalin's report on the leak before any steps were taken in the matter.
- (v.) Letter of September 16 from the Secretary, Planters' Association, asking for a free supply of electric current sufficient to light the face of the Alexander Wardrop memorial clock at night.

Resolved—That he be informed that the Council regret they cannot fall in with the suggestion.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris was to ask—Whether a less objectionable site has been yet found for the toddy tavern, presently situated on the Railway approach road, and, if so, when the tavern is to be transferred and to move for papers.

In view of the tavern having been already removed to another site Mr. Pieris begged leave to withdraw the question.—This was allowed.

6. The following motion stood in the name of the Chairman :—

That it is desirable, for the convenience and safety of the public using the Lewella ferry, that a foot suspension bridge be built to supplement the ferry within the Municipality of Kandy, and that the Municipal Council should carry out this work which seems likely to cost about Rs. 6,000, and that the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council be asked, under section 130 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, for the establishment of the necessary tolls and for the Council to take and receive the said tolls.

With the leave of the Council the Chairman amended the motion as follows :—

That it is desirable, for the convenience and safety of the public using the Lewella ferry, that a foot suspension bridge be built to supplement the ferry within the Municipality of Kandy.

That if the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council can be obtained, under section 130 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, for the establishment of the necessary tolls and for the Council to take and recover the said tolls, this Council will consider the desirability of undertaking the work either at its own cost or with assistance. Mr. Jonklaas seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That a Special Committee be appointed to consider what steps should be taken to increase the usefulness and efficiency of the Sanitary Department. Mr. Weerasooria seconded.—Carried.

The following were appointed to serve on the Committee :—

Messrs. Beven, Jonklaas, Pieris, Dr. de Saram, the mover, and the Chairman, three to form a quorum.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That in the opinion of this Council it is necessary that a second reservoir be built, and that, in order to enable the Council to do so, Government be requested to assist the Council by a contribution of a part of the expenses of building the same and by lending the services of a skilled Engineer.

Mr. Beven thought it best to appoint a skilled Engineer first to report on the water supply of the town.

Mr. LaBrooy, with the leave of the Council, withdrew his motion, pending the bringing in of a substantive motion to the above effect by Mr. Beven at the next Meeting.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That this Council do sanction the placing of another dozen seats round the lake for the use of ladies and children, and that such seats may be reserved for women and children only. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved that the following by-law be passed :—

That all motor horns, except those having a single note and actuated by hand, be forbidden within Municipal limits. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

The Chairman pointed out that it would be best to write to the Inspector-General of Police and inquire when the rules dealing with the nuisance were likely to be passed.

This was agreed to, and Mr. Pieris withdrew his motion.

11. Report of the Special Committee on the question of a house of detention for vagrants in Kandy.

It was agreed to write to Government and inquire whether, in the event of the Council deciding to establish a house of detention for vagrants in Kandy, Government would hand over the Katugastota hospital and grounds for the purpose.

12. To consider the question of an address of welcome to Sir Robert Chalmers on his arrival in Kandy.

Mr. LaBrooy moved—That a sum of Rs. 300 be voted for an illuminated address and a silver casket. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

A draft address framed by Messrs. Beven and Jonklaas was submitted to the Meeting and adopted.

13. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

#### *Finance and Assessment.*

- (i.) That a gun be purchased for the use of the police for the destruction of stray dogs not exceeding Rs. 30.
- (ii.) That a vote of Rs. 100 be obtained for expenditure under the head "Tax on Vehicles and Animals."
- (iii.) That the Superintendent of Municipal Works be given a loan of Rs. 900 for the purchase of a motor bicycle, amount to be repaid by monthly instalments of Rs. 30.

#### *Municipal Works.*

- (iv.) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to (a) No. 1,008½, Peradeniya road, D. Samarakoon; (b) No. 827, Trincomalee street, P. M. Abdul Cader; (c) No. 11, Colombo street, S. M. Hassim; (d) No. 16, Lady McCarthy's road, E. Hewavitarana.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

During the month 430 cattle, 188 buffaloes, 88 sheep, and 374 goats were passed. Six head of cattle, 3 buffaloes, 1 sheep, and 7 goats were rejected. Four livers and 4 lungs of cattle, 7 livers and 1 lung of buffaloes, 3 livers of sheep, and 3 livers and 41 lungs of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. Twenty-four cases of chickenpox, 2 cases of measles, 2 cases of enteric fever, and 2 cases of continued fever were reported.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:—

No. 1,371 of September 27, 1913.

Maurice John Cary & Charles Cowie Stephen.

"Improvements in apparatus for smoke curing Rubber Latex."

Abstract:—

The inventors state:—

"This invention relates to an improved machine for preparing or curing rubber latex in a manner similar to Amazonian or Brazilian methods, or for smoking coagulated latex to form what are commercially termed 'Smoked Sheet Rubber' or 'Smoked Crepe Rubber.'

"The operation of the machine is as follows:—

"Smoke and heated air are prepared in a heat and smoke generator, and by rotating the centrifugal impeller fan the heated air and smoke is drawn through duct D through fan F and duct d1 directly through the top, on to the inside, of one end of smoke box B in the direction shown by black arrows. At intervals baffle plates direct the smoke and heated air down to the bottom of the smoke box, until the other end is reached.

"From the smoke box the smoke and heated air pass through duct d2 and enters through the top at one end of the smoke box, as shown by red arrows; the smoke and heated air, due partly to the impeller fan and partly to the natural draught in the smoke outlet will travel along smoke box B1, as shown by red arrows, which is provided with baffles in a manner similar to those in smoke box B and the smoke and heated air finally escape through the smoke outlet as shown by red arrows.

"The trays are made to travel in the same direction as the smoke and heated air; that is to say, tray T is passed through smoke box B in the direction of the black arrows and reaches the position of tray T1; it is then passed across to the position occupied by tray T3 and travels through smoke box B1 in the direction of the red arrows until the tray T1 assumes the position of T2. All the trays will be made to follow in the same path and in the same rotation until they have become

heated and covered by a deposit of condensed smoke; at this stage latex will be distributed from latex holders through cocks and distributors on to the trays and the latex forms in a series of layers in each tray until a required thickness is secured. At no time will the distributors be in contact with the heated air, smoke, trays or the contents of the trays, due to the spaces U and U1; and the distribution of latex through distributors is under perfect control by means of the cocks."

The claims are:—

(1) In apparatus for smoke curing rubber latex the combination in one or more smoke boxes of smoke filter, baffles, ducts and impeller fan substantially as described and illustrated for the purpose of permitting a continuous concentrated contact to be maintained between smoke and heated air being circulated and rubber latex being cured while within the boxes, thereby enabling the rubber latex to form in layers adhesive to each other, thoroughly smoke cured by the action of heat and smoke in a manner similar to that employed in Brazil substantially as described and illustrated in Specification and sheet of drawings.

(2) In apparatus for smoking, curing or heating rubber latex, shallow boxes and trays in combination constructed and operated substantially as described and illustrated for the purpose of causing smoke and heated air to impinge sharply upon the rubber latex which is distributed into the trays outside the smoke boxes from latex holders while the latex holders and distributors are not in contact with smoke or heated air substantially as described and illustrated in the specification and drawings.

(3) Apparatus substantially as described and illustrated for the purpose of creating synchronous movement through a horizontal plane of heated air, smoke and trays upon which rubber latex, coagulated or in liquid form, is deposited the unidirectional motion permitting close and continuous contact between the heated air, smoke, trays and rubber latex coagulated or in liquid form while within the boxes substantially as described and illustrated in specification and sheet of drawings.

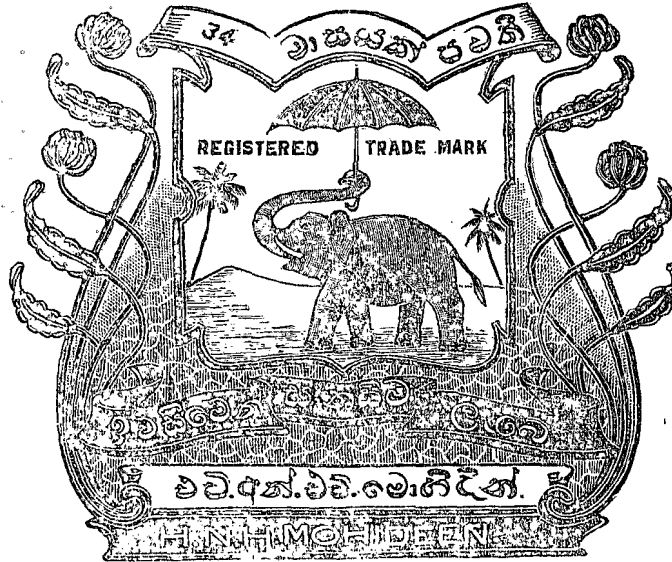

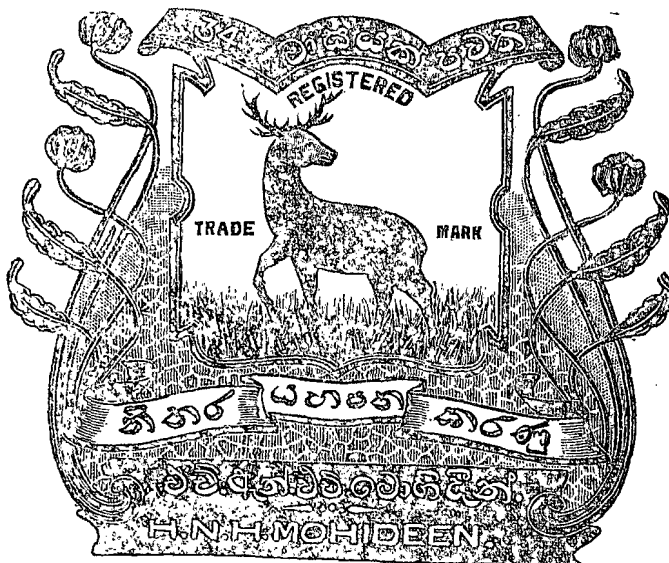
