Frederick Cowlade Money.

"An improvement in apparatus for collecting rubber latex."

Abstract:

The nature and object of this invention is indicated in the claim which is as follows:—

In apparatus for collecting rubber latex a spout of the usual kind having two prongs to drive into the bark of the tree and characterized by having a continuation of the spout bent over on the under side of the spout and forming a curved piece of metal having a projecting tongue formed in it by cutting out the central part of the metal continuation and thus leaving a tongue which is bent outwards on which to hang a collecting cup provided with a hole in its side or an equivalent device which enables it to be hung on to the tongue above described substantially as described and illustrated and for the purposes described.

"A latex spout and coconut shell holder."

Abstract:—

This invention consists of an ordinary spout to drive into the bark of the tree but without tongues or spikes but with the lip bent downwards at right angles. The coconut shell is held in position under the spout by being jammed between that downward bent lip and the tree.

The claim is:—

A latex spout and coconut shell holder consisting of a piece of sheet iron, zinc, or tin-plate one inch square cut and formed into a spout and clip substantially as described and illustrated, and for the purposes described.

NOTICE UNDER "THE JOINT STOCK COMPANIES ORDINANCE, 1861."

In the Matter of the Ceylon Fruit Growing and Preserving Company, Limited; and in the Matter of "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," and Ordinance No. 22 of 1866.

WHEREAS there is reason to believe that the Ceylon Fruit Growing and Preserving Company, Limited, which was incorporated on July 13, 1911, under the provisions of "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," is not carrying on business or in operation and is not capable of being formally wound up:
