CEYLON GOVERNMENT ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP.

AN examination will be held by the Ceylon Government in April, 1914, for the award of a scholarship to be held in the Engineer Class at the Madras Engineering College.

If candidates of sufficient merit present themselves a scholarship will be awarded, which will under certain conditions lead to an appointment in the Ceylon Public Works Department. The scholar will be trained as a Civil Engineer.

The scholarship will entitle the holder to the following allowances for the three years of his course in the Engineer Class :—A subsistence allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem, and an outfit and travelling allowance at the rate of Rs. 300 per annum paid half-yearly. Fees and deposits required for the Engineer Class will be paid by Government. In the event of his passing the College final examination at the end of the three years' course, the scholar will receive the same subsistence allowance for an additional year, during which he will be employed on works in India. He will also during this additional year receive the same travelling allowances as are drawn by Indian students under the same circumstances. All allowances will be contingent on the good conduct and satisfactory progress of the student.

2. The scholar will, if he obtains the B.E. degree and receives a certificate of good conduct and satisfactory progress during the year spent on works, be offered an appointment as Assistant Engineer, Local Division, in the Public Works Department on an initial salary of Rs. 2,400 per annum, and will be eligible, provided his qualifications are sufficient, for appointment to the higher grades upon vacancies occurring. The scholar will be required before appointment to execute a bond of Rs. 1,000 pledging himself to enter Government service in the Public Works Department.

3. The examination will be confined to candidates whose age will be under 22 on June 30, 1914, and who are nominated by His Excellency the Governor. Before receiving such nomination candidates must have passed one of the following examinations :—

- (a) Intermediate B.Sc. Examination of the University of London.
 - (b) The Intermediate Examination in Arts of the University of London with a pass in one of the Mathematical or Science subjects.
 - (c) The B.A. Examination of the University of Madras with Mathematics or Physical Science (II.—A).
4. The physical fitness of all the candidates will be tested before they are admitted to the examination.
5. The subjects of examination will be as follows :—

Compulsory.

- (1) Arithmetic.
- (2) Drawing, Freehand and Geometrical.
- (3) English Language and Composition.
- (4) Pure Mathematics.

Optional.

Not more than two of the following :—

- (5) Applied Mathematics.
- (6) Chemistry, Theoretical and Practical.
- (7) Physics, Theoretical and Practical.

The range of the work in the Mathematical and Science subjects will be the same as that prescribed in the Intermediate Examination in Arts of the University of London.

6. Applications for His Excellency the Governor's nomination must be submitted to the Director of Public Works not later than March 7, 1914. Each candidate must send in with his application two certificates of character, one of which must be from the Principal of the last school which he attended.

7. Candidates nominated by His Excellency the Governor will be required to pay a medical fee of Rs. 10·50 and an examination fee of Rs. 25.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

EXAMINATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

LOCAL REGULATIONS.

THE following examinations of the University of London will be held at Colombo in accordance with the time tables given in the regulations for each examination, viz.:—

- Pass Examination : Matriculation Examination (January and June).
- Pass Examination : Intermediate Examinations in Arts and Science.
- Pass Examination : Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts.
- Intermediate Examination in Laws.
- Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws.
- Intermediate Examination in Divinity.
- Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Divinity.
- First and Second Examination for Medical Degree.

2. Candidates should notify to the Director of Education their intention to present themselves for any of these examinations of the University of London four calendar months prior to the date of examination, in order that application may be made in time for the question papers.

3. The admission fee for the examination and a certificate of character should be forwarded with the notification. The fee should be forwarded by Bank draft only, payable to the University of London, and not by Money Order. No cash or Bank draft or Money Order in favour of the Director of Education will be accepted. The University fee for Matriculation Examination is £2, and that for any of the other examinations is £6.

N.B.—The University fee should not under any circumstances be remitted direct to the University of London.

4. If a candidate withdraws his name, or fails to present himself at the examination, the fees shall not be returned to him. He should pay the usual fee for every subsequent entry for the examination.*

5. The entry forms will be given to the candidates to be filled up on the first day of examination.

6. The optional subjects for which a candidate desires to enter should be stated by him in his notification for admission to the examination, if optional subjects are prescribed for that examination.

7. Matriculation Examination—

(a) Candidates who enter for the examination as private students should forward with their notifications for admission to the examinations certificates from their private tutors, stating their qualifications and whether they have a reasonable chance of passing the examinations.

(b) Certificates of birth (showing that the candidates have completed their sixteenth year) should be forwarded at the same time, the age being reckoned up to, and inclusive of, the first day of the examination. A duly certified copy of the certificate of registration of birth or of the baptismal register is required in every case. Those who have already forwarded certificates of birth for a previous examination should mention the year and the examination for which they forwarded the certificates. A certificate of character should also be forwarded. The certificates of character and birth and the admission fee should accompany the notification for admission to the examination.

(c) An Indian candidate who is not resident in the Island cannot be admitted to the examination unless he shows an attendance of six months or more in one of the English High Schools or Colleges of the Island. He should forward, with his application, a certificate from the Manager or Principal of the High School or College which he has been attending, stating that he has been attending the School or College regularly for a period of six months. He should also forward, in addition to the University fee, a local expenses fee of Rs. 5 by Money Order or Bank draft in favour of the Director of Education, with his notification for admission to the examination.

Graduates of Indian Universities are exempted from the rule of passing the Matriculation Examination before taking up the higher examinations of the University. Candidates who are not resident in Ceylon will be admitted to any examination of the London University held in Ceylon only when there are candidates from Ceylon for the same examination.

APPENDICES.

I.

Statute 113 :—

113. Provided also that the Senate may admit as Internal Students and as candidates for any of the higher degrees (except in medicine and surgery) without their having previously taken any lower degree the following persons (that is to say) :—

- (1) Graduates of Universities approved by the Senate for this purpose ;
- (2) Persons who have passed the examinations required for a degree in some University approved as aforesaid ;
- (3) Persons who have obtained from the University of Cambridge a certificate stating that they have satisfied the Examiners in a Tripos Examination qualifying as a final examination for a first degree ;
- (4) Persons who have passed or obtained Honours at the Second Public Examination of the University of Oxford, provided that they have also either passed or obtained Honours at the First Public Examination, or have passed such other examination or examinations as under the provisions of the University of Oxford are accepted as statutablely equivalent thereto.

* Candidates who entered for the Matriculation Examination in or before January, 1902, will for the present be admitted to subsequent Matriculation Examinations upon payment at every such entry of a fee of £1, provided that they comply with the above Regulations. Colonial Candidates who withdraw their names after having entered for, or who fail to present themselves at, an examination, will be required to pay the full fee of £2 upon every re-entry.

II.

Statute 116 :—

116. Every candidate for admission as a student of the University shall pass such Entrance or Matriculation Examination, or fulfil such other tests of fitness to be admitted as a student, as may be from time to time prescribed.

REGULATION AS TO EXEMPTION FROM THE MATRICULATION EXAMINATION.

Graduates of such British, Colonial, and Foreign Universities as are approved by the Senate for that purpose, and those who have passed all the examinations required for a degree in those Universities, also women who have obtained Tripos Certificates granted by the University of Cambridge, and women who have obtained certificates showing that, under the conditions prescribed by the Delegacy for Local Examinations at Oxford, they have passed the Second Public Examination of that University or have obtained Honours in the Oxford University Examination for Women in Modern Languages, may on application be registered as Matriculated Students on payment of the registration fee of £2 without passing the Matriculation Examination.

Students who hold the Scotch School-Leaving Certificate, having passed on one and the same occasion in the Higher or Honours grade in all the subjects required by the regulations for the Matriculation Examination, and students who have obtained at an *Abiturienten Examen* the *Zeugnis der Reife* from a Gymnasium or Real-Gymnasium within the German or Austrian Empire, or who hold a *Maturitäts-Zeugnis* of a Gymnasium or Oberrealschule or an *Eidgenössische Maturitäts-Zeugnis* of Switzerland, also students who hold the *Leaving Certificate* of a Gymnasium of the Russian Empire, will be registered on the same conditions as the Graduates above referred to.

The Standing of Registered Students shall date, for the purposes of External Examinations, from the Matriculation Examination immediately preceding the date of registration. (See Extract from Statute 120 below.) To secure that a registration under Statute 116 shall date from any Matriculation Examination, such registration must be completed before the commencement of the next Matriculation Examination.

Oxford and Cambridge Graduates in First or Second Class Honours can be admitted to their Degree Examination after two years from their registration.

N.B.—Applications for registration must be accompanied by the proper fee and official documentary evidence of qualification in accordance with the above regulation. Cheques must be made payable to the "University of London," and crossed "London and Westminster Bank, South Kensington Branch." The fee and evidence must be forwarded together by registered post.

EXTRACT FROM STATUTE 120.

"No student shall be admitted to the Final Examination for a degree until the expiration of at least three years after Matriculation, unless the Senate in special cases otherwise determine."

EXTRACT FROM THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CAMBRIDGE LOCAL EXAMINATIONS.

C. *The University of London*.—The holder of a Senoir Certificate is entitled to exemption from the Matriculation Examination of the University of London, if the candidate has at one and the same examination passed (1) in English Language and Literature including English Composition, or History together with English Composition, or Geography together with English Composition, (2) in Arithmetic, Geometry, and Algebra, and (3) in three of the following subjects or combinations of subjects not counted under (1) above :—Latin, Greek, French, German, Spanish, Greek, or Roman History, English History or History of the British Empire, Physical Geography, Logic, two subjects in Mathematics other than those mentioned above, Chemistry (Theoretical and Practical), Experimental Mechanics, Heat together with Sound and Light, Electricity and Magnetism, Botany, provided that either Latin, or Mechanics, or Heat together with Sound and Light, or Chemistry, or Botany is included, and provided further that one language is included.

Candidates who enter with the object of gaining exemption from the Matriculation of the University of London, and desire to be informed immediately on the publication of the Class Lists whether they have satisfied the conditions for exemption, should communicate with the General Secretary, Syndicate Buildings, Cambridge, in the course of the week of examination. The centre and index number should be stated.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 21, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (0 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 14 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1914, viz., 239,528) was 22·4, as against 27·2 in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 134 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 43 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·2, as against 37·0 in the previous week, 35·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 134 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 45 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-four deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 18 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 in Maradana hospitals, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Kotahena.

2. Sixteen deaths (of which 3 are suspected to be due to *Plague*) were ascribed to *Pneumonia*, as against 19 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Slave Island, 3 in St. Paul's, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Maradana hospitals, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Wellawatta.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 12 from *Enteritis*, 10 from *Debility*, 5 from *Senility*, 5 from *Worms*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Accidents*, one an injury to foot and the other a prick at a post-mortem examination, 1 from *Dysentery*. There was 1 case of *Blood Poisoning* and 1 of *Congestion of the Lungs* (both of which are suspected to be due to *Plague*) and 28 from *Other Causes*.

5. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Slave Island. There were 16 cases reported, against 10 in the previous week.

6. Three cases of *Measles* were reported, against 9 in the previous week; and 19 of *Chickenpox*, against 20 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·8°, against 80·7° in the preceding week and 80·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·912 in., against 29·913 in. in the preceding week and 29·827 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·52 in., against 0·01 in. in the preceding week and 0·55 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
