NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 256 of "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1898," as amended by "The Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 8 of 1913," do hereby exempt from service as jurors in the Supreme Court the persons for the time being holding any of the following offices, to wit:-

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the roads and paths which the railway crosses between the stations of Kollupitiya and Mount Lavinia, in the Western Province, and more fully set out in the schedule hereto, to be "minor crossings" for the purpose of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare each of the said roads and paths to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance as from and after the date hereof, and that such "minor crossings" shall not be closed by gates.

Excise Notification No. 28.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 31 (1) of the above-named Ordinance, has made the following addition to the rule in Section I., under the head "Appeals," of the rules published by Excise Notification No. 9 dated May 16, 1913, and that the said addition was confirmed by a resolution of the Legislative Council on February 16, 1914:—

Addition referred to.

After the words-

"All appeals from orders made under this Ordinance by the Excise Commissioner or by Government Agents shall be presented to His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council within fourteen days from the date on which the order appealed from has been received by the appellant."

"Such appeals-

"(a) Shall be in writing.

"(b) Shall contain a plain and concise statement of the grounds of objection to the order appealed against, and a demand of the form of relief claimed.

(c) Shall be delivered to the Colonial Secretary within the aforesaid period of fourteen days."

It is also hereby notified that candidates will be given the option of using Codes in the examination in the Criminal Procedure Code and the Penal Code; they must, however, state when sending in their names what their decision is, as the character of the papers set for those who use Codes and those who do not will be different.

The examination for officers in the Police Department and the Forest Department, and the vivâ voce examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department, the Irrigation Department, and the Railway Department, will be held at the same time and place.

Candidates are required to send in their names so as to reach this office not later than March 31, 1914.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up Sinhalese or Tamil, and whether they wish to have the option of using Codes.

The hours of examination will be from 10.30 A.M. to 1.30 P.M. and from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M., exclusive of the viva voce examinations, which will be specially arranged for.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, No. 3 OF 1897."

IT is hereby notified for public information that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to vary Regulation No. 34, Part V., of the Regulations dated September 17, 1907, and published in the Government Gazette No. 6,207 of September 20, 1907, by the addition thereto of the following regulation (to be numbered 34 A), namely:—

34 A. Any building or place to which rats have direct access from drains, or in which rat holes are found not properly blocked up and cemented, shall be considered insanitary, and no such building or place shall be used for the storage of grain, and if the owner or occupier shall fail to carry out such works as the proper authority may consider necessary to prevent the direct access of rats and to block up rat holes, he shall be guilty of an offence.

"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, 1889."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 28, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 119 (0 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 25 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1914, viz., 239,528) was 25.9, as against 22.4 in the preceding week, 25.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 128 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.9, as against 29.2 in the previous week, 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 128 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nineteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 24 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Slave Island, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana hospitals, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Twelve deaths (of which 3 are suspected to be due to *Plague*) were ascribed to *Pneumonia*, as against 16 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Fort and Galle Face, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Maradana hospitals, 1 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. No death; from Enteric Fever were registered. There were 3 in the previous week, as against 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Seven deaths from Enteritis were registered, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Debility, 5 from Worms, 4 from Accidents (1 each due to drowning, burns, a fall, and a motor car), 3 from Dysentery, 2 from Septicæmia (probably due to Plague), 1 from Diarrhæa, 1 from Tetanus, and 43 from Other Causes.
- 5. Twelve deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week. Of these, 5 were in St. Paul's, 4 in Pettah, 2 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Kollupitiya. There were 13 cases reported, against 16 in the previous week.
- 6. No cases of *Measles* were reported. There were 3 in the previous week. Fifteen cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, against 19 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $80\cdot7^{\circ}$, against $79\cdot8^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $80\cdot5^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29\cdot890$ in., against $29\cdot912$ in. in the preceding week and $29\cdot822$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0\cdot03$ in., against $1\cdot52$ in. in the preceding week and $0\cdot92$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
