The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth Class of the Civil Service, will also be held on April 21, 1914, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

It is also hereby notified that candidates will be given the option of using Codes in the examination in the Criminal Procedure Code and the Penal Code; they must, however, state when sending in their names what their decision is, as the character of the papers set for those who use Codes and those who do not will be different.

The examination for officers in the Police Department and the Forest Department, and the vivâ voce examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department, the Irrigation Department, and the Railway Department, will be held at the same time and place.

Candidates are required to send in their names so as to reach this office not later than March 31, 1914.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up Sinhalese or Tamil, and whether they wish to have the option of using Codes.

The hours of examination will be from 10.30 A.M. to 1.30 P.M. and from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M., exclusive of the viva voce examinations, which will be specially arranged for.

WITH reference to the Minute on the Local Division of the Civil Service dated November 7, 1913, published in the Gazette of December 5, 1913, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that Greek be added to the list of voluntary subjects for the examination for entrance into the Local Division of the Civil Service, and that 1,500 marks be assigned for this subject.

His Excellency has also been pleased to approve the under-mentioned syllabus for this subject :-

#### GREEK.

The paper will include (1) questions on grammar; (2) unprepared passages for translation into English, with questions; (3) one or more easy unprepared passages for translation into English, a vocabulary of unfamiliar words being given; (4) one or more unprepared passages of ordinary difficulty for translation into English; (5) easy sentences for translation into Greek; (6) one or more continuous passages for translation into Greek.

N.B.—This alteration will not be brought into force until after the examination to be held on June 2, 1914, and following days (vide Notification dated February 11, 1913, published in the Gazette of the 13th idem).

## "THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902."

## Rule referred to.

(b) Goods of every description landed from steamers and boats at Kankesanturai will be conveyed from the Customs premises at that port to Jaffna at the rate of Re. 1 25 per ton, if forwarded in consignments of not less than 4 tons. This charge includes the cost of loading into trucks at Kankesanturai and unloading from trucks into carts at Jaffna. No reduction in rates will be granted in the opposite direction between Jaffna and Kankesanturai.

#### AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Alteration of figure "40" in rule 2, line 2, to "35," and the addition of the words." Officers joining the Association after January 14, 1914, must be under the age of 35" as a footnote to rule 10.

The rules as amended reading as follows:--

- Every subordinate officer of the Railway under the age of 35 holding a pensionable appointment and drawing a salary of less than Rs. 3,500 per annum shall be eligible for admission as a member of the Association.
- 10. In addition to the payment referred to in rule 9, the retiring officer (or, in case of death, his nominee, next of kin, or heirs at law) shall receive a donation calculated at the rate of Rs. 2 per head of the members on the roll who are liable for payment at the date of retirement (or death); provided, however, that the officer shall have been a regular contributor to the funds of the Association for a period of not less than one full year.

Provided also that, in the case of officers joining the Association after January 1, 1901, and whose age at the time of joining exceeds 30 years, the donation shall be calculated at the following scale:-Rs. c.

Exceeding 30 years and not exceeding 40 ... 1 50 Exceeding 40 years and not exceeding 45 ... 1 0

Persons joining after the passing of these rules shall be paid a donation calculated at the following cale :-

Rs. c. Not exceeding 25 2 0 Exceeding 25 and not exceeding 30 1 50 Exceeding 30 and not exceeding 40\* 1.

\* Officers joining the Association after January 14, 1914, must be under the age of 35.

"THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCES, 1892 TO 1909."

T is hereby notified that the following regulations made by the Sanitary Board of the Ratnapura District, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, under and in pursuance of section 9 E of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinances, 1892 to 1909," in respect of the towns of Balangoda and Rakwana, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, and shall come into operation from the date hereof.

The regulations dated December 3, 1913, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette of December 5, 1913, are hereby cancelled.

## REGULATIONS REFERRED TO

## Cattle Galas.

1. No person shall keep for the purpose of letting out or renting out the same any cattle shed or halting place for cattle within the limits of the town without a permit from the Board. Such permit may impose such conditions as the Chairman shall consider necessary for the preservation of public health; and the person keeping such cattle shed or halting place for cattle shall be bound to observe such conditions. Any permit under this by-law shall be free of charge.

2. The owner or tenant of every cattle stall, cattle halting place, or gala shall have the same covered with a tiled or ironed roof and paved with cement concrete, and provided with a suitable concrete drain for conveying the urine and washings into a covered receptacle constructed in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct, the contents of which shall be daily removed at the expense of such owner or tenant and disposed of so that no nuisance is caused thereby.

3. Every cattle stall, halting place, or gala shall be daily washed and always kept clean. It shall be whitewashed at least once in three months.

4. All dung and dry refuse shall be removed daily by the owner or tenant of such cattle stall, halting place, or gala and disposed of so that no nuisance is caused thereby.

# "THE BUTCHERS ORDINANCE, 1893."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 23 of "The Butchers Ordinance, 1893," has been pleased to confirm the following rules framed by the proper authority, to wit, the Hon, the Government Agent of the Southern Province, for the management of the slaughter-house at Elpitiya, and the same are hereby published for general information.

#### Rules referred to.

1. No person licensed to carry on the trade of a butcher at Elpitiya shall slaughter cattle and sheep at any place other than the slaughter-house at. Kurundugahabedda, near the Elpitiya bazaar.

2. The Police premises at Elpitiya are hereby appointed as the spot in which the licensed butchers of Elpitiya shall, as required by section 12, sub-section (1), of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, expose for public view all cattle intended for slaughter for a period of not less than 24 hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.

3. No cattle or sheep shall be slaughtered at the said slaughter-house except on such days and between such hours as may be determined by the Hon. the Government Agent of the Southern Province, notice of which shall be posted at the said slaughter-house, nor until after they have been inspected and approved of by the Medical Officer of the division or the Apothecary in Charge, or some person appointed for the purpose by the Hon. the Government Agent of the Southern Province, as fit to be slaughtered for human food.

4. Cattle rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

5. The said Medical Officer or Apothecary in Charge, or some one appointed by the Hon. the Government Agent of the Southern Province, may prohibit the slaughter of any animal, notwithstanding it has been approved as aforesaid, if it should before slaughter be found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human food.

6. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcase shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said Medical Officer or the Apothecary in Charge, or some person appointed by the Hon. the Government Agent of the Southern Province, shall cause the meatt o be immediately destroyed, or so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for human food.

7. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any cattle which have not been approved as aforesaid as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of which the said Medical Officer, or the Apothecary in Charge, or the person appointed by the Hon. the Government Agent, Southern Province, has prohibited as provided in rule 5.

8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the direction of the said Medical Officer or the Apothecary in Charge, or some one appointed by the Hon. the Government Agent, Southern Province, any meat which the latter has declared unfit for human food.

9. The fee for slaughtering cattle shall be 50 cents for each head of cattle and 25 cents for each sheep.

10. All butchers making use of the said slaughter-house are required to clean it but daily after use.

11. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall keep a register in the annexed form of all cattle brought to the slaughter-house:—

New Course in Tropical Sanitation and Hygiene.

ARRANGEMENTS have been made for a new course to be held during the October and May Sessions. This will be open to students who have already attended the ordinary curriculum, and in exceptional cases Medical Officers of Health, Sanitary Officers, and others interested in preventive medicine, who are not students of the school, will, with the permission of the School Committee, be admitted.

The course will consist of lectures and demonstrations, and will extend over two months. For those who desire it, one month laboratory work, under direction, will be added to enable students who have taken the ordinary course to be signed up for six months, the period required for the Diploma in Diseases and Hygiene of the Tropics of the Conjoint Board in London. Three months' study is required for the Cambridge Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene, and one year for the London M.D. (Part VI., Tropical Medicine.)

The course will comprise Bacteriology, Entomology, Helminthology, Protozoology, Hygiene, Chemical Analyses

of Water and Food, Elementary Surveying, Port Health Examination, &c.

Fees for the Course.—To students of the school, £1. 1s. per week; to non-students, £16. 16s. for the full course of eight or twelve weeks.

#### STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 14, 1914.

-The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 120 (2 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 6 Tamils, 22 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1914, viz., 239,528) was 26 1, as against 21 1 in the preceding week, 29 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24 4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 109 (5 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.7, as against 29.2 in the previous week, 26.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 109 total deaths, 15 were of infants under one year of age, as against 13 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 22 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 9 were in Maradana, including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 Slave Island.

- 2. Six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Fort and Galle Face, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. No deaths from Enteric Fever were registered. There were 2 in the previous week; the weekly average for last year was 3.
- 4. Eight deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 8 from Debility, 7 from Enteritis, 6 from Senility, 3 from Diarrhea, 3 from Congestion of Lungs (probably Plague), 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Accidents (1 by a fall from a tree and the other from a hackery), and 36 from Other Causes.
- 5. Nine deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 15 in the previous week. Of these, 4 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Kollupitiya. There were 24 cases reported, as against 11 the previous week.
- 6. Two cases of Measles was reported, against 1 in the previous week; and 13 Chickenpox, against 18 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.9°, against 81.3° in the preceding week and 79.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.852 in., against 29.861 in. in the preceding week and 29.813 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.01 in., against 2.66 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
