**Notification.—General Department.**

No. 1,862.—In exercise of the power conferred by Act I. of 1870, the following rules for quarantine against plague have been made by the Government of Bombay, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council: they have effect from the 3rd instant in the Ports of Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast as a temporary measure:—

- I.—The Commander of every vessel, including buggalows or other native craft, arriving from Bassorah shall, before entering the harbour, indicate by signal the port from which such vessel has come.
- II.—Such Commander shall not, except as hereinafter provided, allow any communication, either with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any other vessel or boat in the harbour.

- III.—Immediately on any such arrival being signalled, the Health Officer of the Port shall go alongside the vessel and ascertain by inquiry from the Commander whether any person on board is suffering, or has during the voyage suffered, from plague, and if the Health Officer is satisfied by such inquiry that no person on board is suffering, or during the voyage has suffered, from plague, he shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage, duly appointed and notified in that behalf by the Resident, there to remain for a period of seven days from the date of arrival in the harbour. The Health Officer shall also direct the Commander to prohibit, during the period for which the vessel remains at the quarantine anchorage as aforesaid, all communication, except such as is hereinafter provided for, between such vessel and the shore or other vessels and boats in the harbour.
- IV.—If the Health Officer shall have reason to believe at the time when the vessel arrives in the harbour that any person on board is suffering, or during the voyage has suffered, from plague, he shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage as aforesaid, and there to remain for a period of fifteen days from the day of arrival in the harbour; and shall further direct that during such fifteen days intercourse between the said vessel and the shore or other vessels and boats in the harbour shall be prohibited as provided in rule III.
- V.—If during the period a vessel is at the quarantine anchorage aforesaid any case or cases of plague should occur on board, the said vessel shall remain in quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the last case occurring, and be subject to all the prohibitions provided for in rules III. and IV.
- VI.—When any vessel has been placed in quarantine as aforesaid, the Health Officer may direct the removal of so many of the passengers and crew as may not be suffering from illness, and whose services may not be required on board the vessel, to such particular spots as may from time to time be selected by the Resident as places of quarantine, there to remain for a period of seven days, or if the vessel has been placed in quarantine for fifteen days, for a period of fifteen days. If a case of plague occurs among such passengers and crew during any such period, they shall remain in a place of quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the occurrence of the last case of such illness.
- VII.—Any mails or cargo which may be brought by any vessel so arriving shall be landed under such precautions as the Health Officer may deem necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.
- VIII.—It will be the duty of the Port Officer to facilitate the conveyance to all vessels in quarantine of such supplies of provisions, stores, and other articles as may be required by those on board. Such supplies will be placed on the boats of the vessels in quarantine to be subsequently removed by members of their crews.
- IX.—All vessels arriving at Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast which may have communicated with vessels coming from Bassorah shall be subjected to the same quarantine as vessels arriving at Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast from Bassorah.

## ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR MAY, 1892.

## WESTERN PROVINCE.

## COLOMBO DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—In Siyané kóralé West the muttes crops are being reaped, and a fairly good return is expected, and yala paddy is thriving. In Héwágam kóralé the muttes crop will not be good, as the plants were flooded while young. In Salpiti kóralé and Alukúru kóralé South fields for yala have been cultivated, and the plants are doing well. In Siyané kóralé East, too, a fairly good muttes crop is being gathered, and yala cultivation has been successful.

## NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Yala paddy generally thriving, but in some parts white stalks called “sudugoba” or “bambupidum” are appearing in the paddy plants instead of ears.

## KALUTARA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Prospect of yala crop fair; some damage has been done by caterpillars in Pasdun kóralé.

*Dry Grain.*—No cultivation.

## CENTRAL PROVINCE.

## KANDY DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Paddy fields being cultivated for yala; Uduwara and Uda Dumbara prospects fair; Harispattu good; Yatinuwara, Tumpane, and Pata Dumbara, bad owing to lack of rain; Pata Hewaheta good, but one-fourth acreage uncultivated owing to drought; Uda Bulatgama ploughing going on; Udapalata yala fields doing well—(plants only about two months old) and the prospect of the crops is good.

*Dry Grain.*—Kurakkan prospect in Uduwara fair; Harispattu good; Yatinuwara bad owing to drought; Tumpane, Pata Héwáheta, Pata Dumbara, and Uda Bulatgama, cultivation delayed owing to want of rain; Uda Dumbara chenas not yet cleared.

## MÁTALÉ DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Yala crops under cultivation—rain wanted.

## NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Kotmalé nil; Uda Héwáheta and Walapané paddy fair, crop for maha being reaped.

*Dry Grain.*—Chenas being cleared in Kotmalé.

## NORTHERN PROVINCE.

## JAFFNA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Threshing of paddy continued in Karachy and Punakari divisions.

*Dry Grain.*—Dry grain crop reaped; reported good.

*Remarks.*—Cutting and curing of tobacco commenced. No rain during the month. The wind in general strong from south and south-west with occasional lulls. Heavy clouds with distant lightning and thunder during last [telegram dated 31st May] three days in the evening in north, north-east, and north-west; wind blowing yesterday in strong gusts from south-west.

## MANNÁR DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Kalapokam crop on the mainland is still being threshed. A very small extent of land cultivated for sirupokam.

*Remarks.*—There was average rain in April, but none at all in May; and the sirupokam will fail if there is no rain shortly.

## VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Sirupokam prospects poor owing to failure of expected monsoon rains. Small extent only sown as yet.—Idaipokam now in plants: will suffer if rain fails altogether.

*Dry Grain.*—Dry grain cultivation confined to small gingelly crops.

## MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Prospects for sirupokam poor owing to want of rain. Very small extent sown.

## SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

## GALLE DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Gravets and Akmimana crop flourishing. The recent rains in Talpé have damaged the crops. In some divisions the condition of crop middling. Gangaboda, crop slightly damaged by rain, but a good harvest may be expected; Wellaboda good; Bentota and Hinidum middling.

## HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Small second maha crop in West Giruwá pattu harvested. Growing yala crops good. East Giruwá pattu small extent sown for yala good. Mágam pattu, second maha. At Tissa good; smaller extent than usual sown for yala owing to scarcity of cattle for ploughing.

*Remarks.*—Supply of food in the whole district good.

## MÁTARA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Gravets, prospect of yala crop, except in one division which was damaged by salt water, good. Paddy crops: in Gangaboda pattu good, though somewhat damaged by godawarrus. Weligam kóralé good. Morawaka damaged by drought, but good in some divisions. Kandaboda pattu little cultivation for yala, but good. Wellaboda pattu very good.

*Dry Grain.*—Gravets, no fine grain; Gangaboda pattu damaged by drought; Weligam kóralé good; Morawaka damaged by drought; Kandaboda pattu fine grain little and just sown; Wellaboda pattu land being prepared for cultivation.

## EASTERN PROVINCE.

## BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Early pinmari partly damaged by insects. Sowing of later pinmari commenced.  
*Remark.*—Paddy Re. 1'30 per bushel; Indian corn and fine grain Re. 1.

## TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Trampling for pinmari cultivation not yet over at Tampalakam and Kottiárpattus: unusual delay on account of cattle disease in both pattus. About one-third of cultivation at Kottiár likely to be abandoned if trampling buffaloes be not secured in time from healthy quarters.  
*Remark.*—Condition of standing crops throughout district is good.

## NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

## KURUNÉGALA DISTRICT.

*Remarks.*—Grain prospects bad. Want of rain severely felt throughout the Province. Paddy and dry grain cultivation much delayed for this reason, and what little has been sown is progressing unfavourably. In Wanní, Dewamedí, and Dambadeni hatpattus foot-and-mouth disease—another serious obstacle.

## CHILAW DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Fields in northern division sown for yala; good crop not anticipated because of scarcity of water in many of the tanks. In central division two-thirds of paddy sown thriving well; rest not so good.  
*Dry Grain.*—Fine grain young crops in want of rain.  
*Remark.*—In southern division grain prospects good.

## PUTTALÁM DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Maha crop gathered in; ploughing for yala crop not commenced owing to want of rain.  
*Dry Grain.*—Chenas being cleared and sown.

## NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

*Paddy.*—Paddy cultivated for meda is in various stages; condition generally good. Damage by flies reported from Nuwaragampaláta. Ploughing and sowing are in progress for yala, but retarded by cattle disease.  
*Dry Grain.*—Mun and mendiri chenas sown; gingelly blossoming. Condition favourable, except in Nuwaragampaláta, where damage to chenas from want of rain is reported.  
*Remark.*—Tanks contain good water supply.

## PROVINCE OF UVA.

*Paddy.*—Crops reported good in Udukinda, Yatikinda, Wellawaya, Wiyaluwa, and Buttale. In Wellassa crop much damaged by flies and worms; in Bintenna also flies have done much damage, and the crops in both these divisions will be far below the average.  
*Dry Grain.*—Crops in Udukinda suffering from want of rain. Cultivation in lower divisions not commenced.

## PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

## RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Second maha crop in Kuruwiti and Nawadun kóralés successfully harvested. Yala crop throughout district sown under favourable prospects, but weather in Meda and Kadawatu kóralés is unfavourable to growth owing to deficient rainfall.  
*Dry Grain.*—Chenas and owita lands prepared for cultivation.  
*Remark.*—Cattle murrain has appeared in Nawadun and Meda kóralés.

## KÉGALLA DISTRICT.

*Paddy.*—Paddy sown for yala in Three Kóralés and Lower Bulatgama in young plants; prospects middling. Four Kóralés partly sown for yala. Prospects in Beligal and Paranakúru kóralés fair; Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés middling.

*Dry Grain.*—Chenas throughout district ready for sowing with hill paddy. Mun and kurakkan partly sown in Four Kóralés—growth poor owing to want of rain. Kurakkan: Three Kóralés and Lower Bulatgama in young plants; prospects poor owing to much rain. Gingely: in Beligal kóralé not growing well owing to want of rain.

*Remarks.*—Paranakúru kóralé not free from cattle murrain. Cases also reported in Ruanwella bazaar. Steps have been taken to check its spread. General outlook fair, provided the south-west rains do not fail.

**RULES adopted at General Meetings of "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association" held at Colombo on the 6th and 20th February, 1892, under the provisions of Section 14 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1891.**

| Members eligible.                      | 1. Every person under the age of forty years holding an appointment in the Public Service or in any <i>quasi</i> Public Department shall be eligible for admission as a Member of the Association.   |
| Enrolment of Members.                  | 2. Application for admission shall be addressed to the Secretary, and shall be in the form hereunto annexed. Membership shall commence from the date of contribution, and Members shall be so inscribed in the Register.<br>Any Member who shall make a false statement in his application shall forfeit all moneys paid by him into the Association, and his privileges as a Member, unless he shall satisfy the Committee of Management that such false statement was not wilfully made.   |
| Pass Book of contributions.            | 3. Every Member shall be provided with a Pass Book, in which his contribution shall be entered at least twice a year, immediately after December 31 and June 30.<br>The Pass Books shall be annually verified by a Member of the Committee of Management with the Account Books of the Treasurer, and shall be initialled by such Member in proof of such verification.  |
| Monthly contributions.                 | 4. Every Member shall contribute to the Funds of the Association monthly a sum equal to 2½ per cent. of his monthly salary. A Member who is also a contributor to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund shall have the option of contributing either at the above rate or at the rate of 1 per cent. of his salary, save when that amounts to less than 50 cents a month, in which case he shall contribute 50 cents a month.  |
| Payment of monthly contributions.      | 5. The monthly contributions shall be deducted by the Pay Clerk from the salary of each Member on the day the salary is paid, and remitted to the Treasurer of the Association with a detailed statement of the contributions.   |
| Withdrawal of Members.                 | 6. Any Member who may retire from the Public Service, or who may be deprived of his situation on abolition of office, may continue his Membership or withdraw from the Association. Should he elect to continue a Member, he shall, if in the receipt of a pension or other allowance, contribute either on the salary last drawn by him, or on his pension or allowance; if not in the receipt of a pension or allowance, he may either continue to contribute at the rate paid prior to his retirement or discontinuance from office, or cease to contribute, and pay only such calls as may be made upon him under rule 10, retaining, nevertheless, his rights and privileges as a Member.<br>Should such Member elect within three months of his retirement to withdraw from the Association, the amount standing to his credit shall be paid to him within one month from the date on which he signifies his intention to withdraw, less any amount he may be indebted to the Association. |
| Resignation or dismissal from Service. | 7. Every Member who may resign or be dismissed from the Public Service shall cease to be a Member of the Association, and shall be entitled to a refund of the amount to his credit, less any amount he may be indebted to the Association, within three months from the date of his application   |

for a refund. In the event of the re-instatement of a dismissed Member he shall be eligible for re-admission under the rules, provided he makes application for such re-admission within three months of his re-instatement.

Deceased  
Members.

8. In the event of the death of a Member the amount to his credit in the books of the Association, less any sum he may be indebted to the Association, shall be paid to his widow and lawful children in the proportion of half to the widow and half to the children in equal shares. Should there be no widow, then the widow's share shall also be equally divided among the children; should there be no children, the whole amount shall be paid to the widow; failing widow and children, the amount shall be paid to his legally constituted heirs; and in the case of an intestate, to his nominee or nominees or to the next of kin, or into court to credit of his estate.

Provided that no nomination shall be valid unless made and reported for registration at least a month prior to his decease.

Provided also that in the case of minors it shall be lawful to the Committee of Management at their discretion, in the absence of a legal guardian, to pay the shares of minors to their natural guardian, if any, or to deposit the amount in the Ceylon Savings Bank until majority is attained. The Committee of Management may draw the interest accruing on moneys so deposited, and pay the same to any person who may satisfy them that the money will be expended on the maintenance or for the benefit of the minors.

Donations.

9. In addition to the payment referred to in the foregoing rule the Committee of Management shall pay to the widow of a deceased Member, within three months of the date of receipt of notice of death, a donation calculated at the rate of Re. 1 per head of the Members on the roll at the date of the Member's death. Provided, however, that in the case of persons who joined the Association subsequent to December 31, 1890, and whose age at the time they joined exceeded twenty-five years, the donation shall be calculated according to the following scale:—

Exceeding 25 years and not exceeding 30 years	...	90 cents per head
Exceeding 30 years and not exceeding 35 years	...	80 do.
Exceeding 35 years	...	70 do.

Should the deceased Member leave no widow, such donation shall be paid to the children in equal shares, and failing widow and children it shall be paid to his legally constituted heirs, and in the case of an intestate to the nominee or nominees, or to the next of kin, or into court, subject to the provisos in the preceding rule.

Calls.

10. The donation paid under rule 9 shall be replaced by a call on Members liable therefor, which shall be payable in two consecutive monthly instalments.

Failure to pay the call within two months will subject the defaulting Member to the penalties prescribed in rule 16 for default of payment of contributions or loans.

11. Whenever the Committee of Management, after the decease of any Member, makes any payment under rules 8 and 9 to any person or persons who at the time appear to the Committee to be entitled to the same, such payment shall be valid and effectual against any demand made upon the Association or the Committee of Management by any other person or persons.

Loans of half  
contribution.

12. It shall be lawful for the Committee of Management to grant a loan to any Member of the Association, provided that the amount of such loan, added to the amount of any loan or loans previously granted and remaining in part or in whole unpaid, shall not exceed in the aggregate one-half of the amount standing to the credit of such Member in the books of the Association; and provided further, that no application for a loan shall be considered if the applicant is in default in payment of any instalment of principal or interest of any sum previously borrowed by him.

- Advances in emergencies. 13. In cases of emergency it shall be lawful for the *ex-officio* Members of the Committee of Management to advance to any Member who shall satisfy them that immediate aid is necessary, a sum not exceeding half his monthly salary. Such advance shall be repaid in full at the end of the month in which it is made; provided always that it shall be lawful for the Committee of Management to convert such advance into a loan under rule 12, subject to the restrictions thereby provided.
- Loans in sickness or distress. 14. In the event of sickness or distress the Committee of Management may, after having carefully inquired into the circumstances of the case, advance to a Member of the Association in any one year a sum not exceeding half a month's salary irrespective of loans and advances granted under rules 12 and 13. Such grants shall be repaid without interest in such manner as may be determined by the Committee of Management.
- Repayment of loans. 15. Loans granted under rule 12 shall be repaid by regular monthly instalments of not less than 1-20th of the amount of the loans. But nothing herein contained shall prevent the earlier repayment of such loans.
- Default in payment of contributions, advances, loans, and calls. 16. Instalments due on account of loans and advances made under Rules 12 and 14, and the interest due thereon, as well as the calls falling due under Rule 10, shall be deducted from the salaries of Members on pay day by the Pay Clerk; but the responsibility of seeing that the amounts due on these accounts, as well as the monthly contributions are duly deducted and remitted to the Treasurer, shall nevertheless rest on the Members themselves. Should any amount due by a Member as monthly contribution or as instalment or interest on account of such loans or advances not be remitted to the Treasurer within fifteen days after it shall fall due, such Member shall be liable to, and shall pay a fine not exceeding one-fourth of his monthly contribution for each default, and if he shall make default for three consecutive months, or neglect to pay the fine or fines imposed on him, he shall *ipso facto* cease to be a Member of the Association, and shall absolutely forfeit all claim to the whole amount to his credit in the books of the Association, and such amount shall thereupon merge into the general fund.
- Interest payable on loans. 17. The interest to be paid on moneys borrowed from the Association shall be at the rate of 1 per cent. per mensem on the amount due at the end of each month. In the calculation of interest the fractional part of a month, if it exceeds fifteen days, shall be taken as a whole month; if fifteen days and under, as half a month.
- Applications for loans. 18. Applications for loans or advances shall be made in writing to the Secretary, who shall enter the same in the Register of Applications for Loans in the order in which they have been received, and shall submit such applications to the Committee of Management for their decision.
- Division of profits. 19. The profits accruing to the funds of the Association as declared by the dividend decided on at the General Meeting shall be placed annually to the credit of the Members in the books of the Association in proportion to the amount standing to the credit of each Member.
- Provision for winding up. 20. This Association shall not be wound up unless with the consent of at least three-fourths of the Members on the roll. In the event of its being wound up, the funds of the Association shall, after payment of all claims, be divided among the Members in proportion to the amount to the credit of each Member in the books of the Association.
- Custody of funds. 21. The Treasurer shall place all moneys received by him on account of this Association in one or more of the local banks in the names of the President, the Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Association, and it shall be competent for the banks to honour the signature of any two of them.
- Quorum for General Meetings. 22. The quorum of Members required to constitute a General Meeting under sections 15 and 16 of the Ordinance is hereby declared to be thirty Members.

Books.

23. The following books, and such others as may be found necessary by the Committee of Management, shall be kept by the Association :—

- (1) Cash Book.
- (2) Ledger.
- (3) Minute Book.
- (4) Register of Applications for Loans or Advances.

Financial year.

24. The financial year of the Association shall run from July 1 to June 30.

REGULATIONS made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council in pursuance of the provisions of the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island."

1. The following officers shall be deemed "authorised persons" under and for the purposes of carrying out these regulations in their respective towns or places as hereinafter specified:—

The Chairman of the Municipal Council,	}	In Colombo Municipal limits.
The Police Magistrate,		
The Superintendent of Police,	}	In any place situated in the Revenue District of Colombo outside the Municipal limits.
The Municipal Sanitary Officer,		
The Assistant Superintendent of Police,		
The Government Agent of the Province,		
The Colonial Surgeon of the Province,		
Any Government Medical Officer of the District,		

2. It shall be lawful for any authorised person to cause persons infected with smallpox in any building where the detention of the patient is in the opinion of the Municipal Sanitary Officer or of any Government Medical Officer likely to prove a source of danger to others, to be removed to some public hospital or other place provided by Government.

Provided that it shall be competent for any such authorised person as aforesaid, in case the removal of any person so infected in any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale is objected to, and the house or place is not otherwise open to objection, to allow the patient to be retained, on condition, however, that the sale of goods shall not be carried on in such house or place during such time as any person shall remain so infected in such house or place.

Provided further, that it shall be lawful for any such authorised person as aforesaid to allow any patient to be removed to any locality which such patient or his or her friends may choose, and to which the Medical authorities of the town or place, if any, do not object, instead of the public hospital or place provided by Government.

3. An authorised person shall have power, in the event of the patient remaining in the infected house, to require the inmates of the said house (with the exception of not more than two who may elect to remain in attendance upon the patient) forthwith to take up their residence in a house of isolation, and remain there for such period (not exceeding fourteen days) as the Municipal Sanitary Officer or any Government Medical Officer may direct.

4. Any person having once taken up his residence in a house of isolation shall not quit the premises even momentarily until the expiration of the time prescribed, except with the permission in writing of the Municipal Sanitary Officer or any Government Medical Officer.

5. Except as provided by these regulations, and except as provided by the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove or assist in removing any person suffering from smallpox from the house or place in which such person shall be to any other house or place, without the sanction in writing of some duly authorised person.

6. It shall be lawful for any authorised person to prohibit the removal for interment of the corpses of persons who have died of any contagious disease along any particular thoroughfare, and to prescribe the thoroughfares leading to the place of interment along which such corpses shall be carried. Information of such prohibition shall be given by notice in writing under the hand of some authorised person, which shall be posted in two or more conspicuous places in the prohibited thoroughfare, and by publication in such other way as may be deemed necessary by such authorised person.

7. These regulations shall come into operation from the 1st day of July, 1892, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1892, or to such other time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall extend the same.

Regulations referred to.

1. Rights of felling timber, of collecting forest produce, or of pasturing cattle in a village forest may be exercised only by the permanent residents of the village or villages named in the Proclamation constituting such forest a village forest.

2. The under-mentioned trees may not be cut without the permission of a Forest Officer empowered to grant such permission, as provided in the Ordinance: kaluwara, kalumediriya, ná, milla, nedun, kos, del, mendora, kina, lunumidella, tala, tekka, or walsapu.

3. No trees of any kind over one cubit in girth at four feet from the ground may be cut without a permit from the Kóralé Mudaliyár.

4. Dead or fallen timber for firewood, sticks for fences and tool handles, and canes and creepers, may be cut without any permit.

5. No person may sell, barter, or give away any timber or forest produce taken from a village forest to persons outside of the village community.

6. No person may cut any timber or collect any forest produce in a village forest in excess of his actual personal requirements at any one time, except to sell, barter, or give away to other members of the village community.

7. No person shall depasture cattle in a village forest in excess of the number required for his own use or that of his household.

### No. 2.—1892.

An Ordinance for the enrolment of Coast Defence Volunteers.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to empower the Governor, in the event of anticipated war, to raise a special force of coast defence volunteers to assist in the service of submarine mine defences, or in any measures involving the employment of steamers, launches, boats, or other vessels: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “The Coast Defence Volunteers Ordinance, 1892.”

Governor may raise a coast defence volunteer force in case of apprehension of war between Her Majesty and any foreign state.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor, if and whenever the immediate outbreak of war between Her Majesty and any foreign state is apprehended, or after such war has been declared, to raise a volunteer force of such strength as he may think fit, to be styled Coast Defence Volunteers, for special services in connection with submarine mines, or the management of steamers, launches, boats, or other vessels which may be required for the purpose of the defence of this Colony.

Engagement of coast defence volunteer force.

3 Such coast defence volunteers shall be engaged for a period of three months if war shall not be declared within that period, and if war shall be declared within that period, then further for the period of the war; but the Governor shall have power to dismiss any member thereof, or to disband the force or any part of the force whenever he may see fit.

Governor may prescribe uniform for coast defence volunteers.

4 The Governor shall prescribe a distinctive uniform for such coast defence volunteers.

Governor may fix rate of pay.

5 The Governor shall fix the rate of pay for all members of the force, and shall lay down the proportion of the several ranks as he may think fit.

Imperial Army Act, 1881, to apply to coast defence volunteers.

6 The provisions of the Imperial Army Act, 1881, and of any other Imperial Act for the time being amending or superseding the same, shall apply to the coast defence volunteers from the date of their enrolment.

Provisions of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1861, No. 8 of 1881, No. 9 of 1881, No. 11 of 1889, and No. 17 of 1890 to apply to coast defence volunteers.

7 The provisions of the Ordinances No. 3 of 1861, No. 8 of 1881, No. 9 of 1881, No. 11 of 1889, and No. 17 of 1890 relating to volunteers, so far as they are not inconsistent with the foregoing provisions, shall apply to the coast defence volunteers as if they were a volunteer corps formed under the said Ordinances, and the coast defence volunteers shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinances, be deemed to have been called out and to be on active service from the date of their enrolment.

WHEREAS it is expedient to allow the Judges to exercise their discretion as to the amount of punishment to be awarded for all offences punishable under "The Ceylon Penal Code," and to amend the said Code in the particulars hereinafter mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Section 68 amended.

1 In section 68 of the said Code, for the word "subject" shall be substituted the word "liable."

Section 114 amended.

2 In section 114 of the said Code, for the words "for twenty years" shall be substituted the words "of either description which may be extended to twenty years."

Section 383 amended.

3 In section 383 of the said Code, for the words "shall not be less than seven years" shall be substituted the words "may be extended to twenty years."

Section 384 amended.

4 In section 384 of the said Code, for the words "shall not be less than seven years" shall be substituted the words "may be extended to twenty years."

To be read with "The Ceylon Penal Code" as one Ordinance.

5 This Ordinance and the Ordinance No. 2 of 1883, intituled "The Ceylon Penal Code," shall be read together as one Ordinance.

No. 4.—1892.

An Ordinance to abolish the Paddy Tax.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to abolish the tax, duty, or share due to the Crown in respect of paddy grown in this Colony: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Tax on paddy abolished.

1 From and after the coming into operation of this Ordinance there shall cease to be levied by and payable to the Crown such tax, duty, or share as by law, custom, or usage (whether general or local) has heretofore been so levied and payable in respect of paddy grown in this Colony.

Provided that nothing in this Ordinance contained shall be held or taken to in any way affect, diminish, or abridge the right or interest of the Crown in any land the property of the Crown, or the right of the Crown to demand, sue for, recover, or receive the half or any other share of paddy grown on land the property of the Crown and to which share the Crown may be in any way entitled.

Repeal.

2 The Proclamation of the 3rd of May, 1800, and section 5 of the Proclamation of the 3rd September, 1801, and the Proclamation of the 22nd of April, 1803, and sections 17, 18, 19, and 20 of the Proclamation of the 21st November, 1818,

and the Ordinances set forth in the schedule hereto, and so much of any other Ordinance as is inconsistent with this Ordinance, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Provided that such repeal shall not affect any right, obligation, or liability accrued or incurred under any enactment hereby repealed, or any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, or liability as aforesaid, and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be carried on as if this Ordinance had not passed.

Commencement,

3 This Ordinance shall commence and come into operation on the Thirty-first day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-two.

An Ordinance to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable on Tobacco, Kerosine Oil, and Spirits.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable under the Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884, respectively, on certain articles imported into this Colony: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

To be read with Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884.

1 This Ordinance and the schedule hereto annexed shall be construed and read as one with the Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884, so far as they are consistent therewith.

Definition clause.

2 For the purposes of this Ordinance "kerosine oil" shall include the liquids commonly known by the names of rock oil, Rangoon oil, Burma oil, kerosine, petroleum, paraffine oil, mineral oil, petroline, gasoline, benzol, benzoline, benzine, and any inflammable liquid that is made from petroleum, coal, schist, shale, peat, or any other bituminous substance, or from any products of petroleum.

Duties imposed on tobacco, kerosine oil, and spirits.

3 From and after the time when this Ordinance shall come into operation, the several duties of customs, as the same are respectively inserted, described, and set forth in figures in the schedule hereto annexed, shall be levied and paid upon the several articles in the said schedule mentioned when imported into this Colony, anything in the aforesaid Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884 to the contrary notwithstanding.

Operation.

4 This Ordinance shall come into operation at such time as the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint.

An Ordinance to amend "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and to make further provision for constructing, repairing, and improving irrigation works in this Island, and for carrying out the purposes of the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Commencement of Ordinance.

1 This Ordinance shall come into operation on the Thirty-first day of December next.

Short title.

2 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1892," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited collectively as "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinances, 1889 and 1892."

Treasurer to pay Rs. 200,000 annually into the irrigation fund.

3 For section 6 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted, namely :—

The colonial treasurer shall, out of the general revenue of the Island, pay annually as soon as may be after the first day of January into the irrigation fund a sum of two hundred thousand rupees, and such irrigation fund shall continue to be vested in the central irrigation board for the time being.

A sufficient number not being present to form a quorum, as required by section 95 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, no meeting was held.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, May 14, 1892, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

*Present*:—Hon. P. A. Templer, Chairman ; F. Vine, Esq. ; J. B. Siebel, Esq. ; J. H. Sproule, Esq. ; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq. ; B. de Alwis, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 26 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were submitted :—General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from the end of 1891 to March 31 and April 30; separate Statements of Receipts and Disbursements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts for the same periods ; Progress Reports of Work done brought up to the same dates ; Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the months of March and April ; also reports of the Health Officer for the same months.

Resolved,—That the General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements and Progress Reports of Work done, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to Government, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, together with the Health Officer's reports.

3. Read copy of letter dated March 29, from Mr. J. Guthrie, the Auditor, to the Colonial Secretary, reporting that he had audited the accounts for 1891 and found the several statements correct.

4. Read letter No. 30/20915, dated April 11, from the Government Agent, stating, in reply to the Secretary's letter No. 34 of April 7 forwarding copy of a resolution adopted at the meeting on March 26, that "the whole piece of land, including that occupied by the tennis court," was not offered to the Council, but only the unoccupied portion.

It was resolved, on motion by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Siebel, that the Municipal Council agree to take over the unoccupied portion of the land at the head of the lake.

On being put to the vote four Members, were in favour of the motion and one against. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

5. Read letter dated March 24 from Mr. R. W. D. Moir, thanking the Municipal Council for their resolution in respect of himself as conveyed in the Secretary's letter of January 28.

6. Read correspondence with Messrs. Walker Sons & Co. with regard to a charge made for repairing the lifting rod of the sluice at the reservoir, a reduction of Rs. 25 being now made.

Resolved,—That the amount as amended (Rs. 275) be paid.

7. Read the following recommendation by the Standing Committee with regard to the Gonawatta ferry approach :—

"That an expenditure of Rs. 300 be authorised, being the estimated cost of rebuilding a portion of the retaining wall damaged by the flood waters."

On motion of the Chairman it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

8. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to letter No. 14, dated April 14, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the claim made by the Council for water used at certain Government buildings in excess of the allowance :—

"That the letter and connected papers be submitted to the General Meeting with a recommendation that a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to consider the correspondence and to submit draft reply."

On the motion of the Chairman it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted, and that the following Councillors be appointed a Special Committee for the purpose :—Messrs. J. B. Siebel, J. N. d'Esterre, and E. Beven.

9. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee with reference to letter No. 15 of April 21 from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to an application by the Council for further assistance in the matter of keeping the lake free from silt :—

"That the letter be submitted to the General Meeting with a recommendation that the required pledges be given to Government so far as it is in the power of the present Council to give such pledges."

Resolved,—That the recommendation be adopted, and a reply be sent to Government in accordance therewith.

Report on the Sanitary Condition of the Town of Kandy for the Month of March, 1892.

*Weather and General Health.*—The weather during the month was dry and hot. The health of the town was satisfactory.

*Contagious Diseases.*—In all five cases of chickenpox were reported. On the 10th and 19th instant two cases were reported from town. The third was a woman in Colombo street. The fourth case was the beggar Govinda, who was found affected with the disease in Victoria drive. The fifth was a woman in Torrington road. All the cases were isolated in their houses, except Govinda, who was removed to hospital.

*Slaughter House.*—298 black cattle and 86 buffaloes were slaughtered during the month, giving an average daily number of 9 $\frac{2}{7}$  of the latter. The cattle examined were in good condition.

*Market.*—Daily visits were paid to the market and cleanliness enforced. Considering that the keeper has an assistant and a staff of coolies under him, the premises, I think, might be kept in a better state of cleanliness than they were found to be on my surprise visits to the place.

*Latrines and Drains.*—The smell from the public bath and Malabar street latrines was very offensive on a recent inspection of them. They were, however, cleaned out and disinfected on my inviting attention by special letter to their want of cleanliness.

#### Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1892.

*Public Health* was on the whole good. Only two cases of smallpox were reported in Magalla: the first one was a young Tamil cooly who worked in the wharf. He boarded a native craft in January last, and a few days after developed the disease, proving conclusively of the introduction of the disease by the shipping. This boy, along with four others, lived in house No. 366 in Magalla, and he was concealed for ten days after development of the eruption before his condition was reported. The chief tenant was prosecuted for neglecting to report early the case; the patient was removed to the Smallpox Hospital; the other inmates were placed under observation for several days, and the house was thoroughly disinfected. Ten days after another boy of the same house took ill of the same disease. He was at once removed to hospital, and similar precautionary measures were adopted in this instance too, and no further cases occurred in the neighbourhood.

A severe epidemic of influenza prevailed to a considerable extent in the early part of the quarter. Several deaths occurred from neglect and exposure, and children and the old and feeble suffered most in this respect. No cases were specially reported.

Two cases of chickenpox and two of measles occurred during the quarter. During the latter part of February and during March several cases of fever occurred in the Fort. Whether these were solely due to the increased atmospheric temperature, or whether this atmospheric condition induced a greater elimination of noxious gases from the several cesspit latrines in the Fort, I will not venture to discuss now. But the fact remains, that with the advent of the hot season an outbreak of fever invariably occurs, in the Fort especially.

A case of death occurred from consuming the entrails of the fish known as "karambura."

*Wards.*—Their condition calls for no special comment.

*Public Latrines.*—Their condition was satisfactory: they were regularly attended to and cleanly kept.

*Street Sweeping and Scavenging.*—The former was unsatisfactorily done till within a few weeks of the quarter's end, and the same may be said of the scavenging that left much to be desired in its manner of execution. The scattering of house rubbish by the roadside and in front of houses, instead of being deposited in boxes for easy and rapid removal, still continues in several places in Wards 2 and 3.

*Markets.*—Their condition was good. The narrow boundary surface drain of the fish market requires widening as stated in my last report.

*Drainage.*—Most of the drains remain as before in Ward 1 and in China Garden. A new connected cement drain is being built around the vegetable and beef markets, and is a step in the right direction.

*Cattle Slaughter.*—During the quarter three bulls that were rejected as unfit were slaughtered, and on its discovery by the Police the matter was reported, and formed the subject of an inquiry by the Council.

*Suggestions.*—Before closing my report I wish to invite the attention of the Council to the following points in the matter of its sanitary legislation. These are matters that demand early consideration, and are of grave importance in the preservation of the public health. It is not enough that minor sanitary matters should receive treatment, as sanitary salvation is not obtainable by merely flushing drains and scavenging streets. Unless the root of all sanitary defects was primarily attacked, existing insanitary evils will continue to flourish in spite of operative measures directed towards their external aspect. First and foremost is the question of *overcrowding*. This exists to an alarming extent in the Fort, China Garden, Kaluwella, Magolla, Pettigolawatta, Welliwatta, Minuwangoda, and I have no doubt in several other parts of the Municipality. I know of houses that are rented to individuals who in turn sublet each room (and even screen large halls into rooms) to families consisting of from two to six members; and in a crowded place like the Fort, I need not state how undesirable and dangerous such a proceeding is. Again, in Kaluwella, there are a row of houses known as the "kitangies," of which each house contains from 50 to 100 individuals, excluding several cows and goats. The smells arising from these overcrowded localities infect the surrounding neighbourhood to an extent as to cause disease to others. Under these circumstances, I think that measures should be adopted early to render inoperative the attempt of landlords to deal with human lives from a commercial point of view.

2. The dry-earth system is urgently needed within the Fort. Most of the houses contain cesspit latrines, whose conditions are far from satisfactory, and are mainly instrumental in causing periodical outbreaks of fever. Wherever practical the dry-earth system, with the daily removal of night soil, to be buried or incinerated, as the case may be, should be introduced, and a reduction thus made in the large number of cesspit latrines at present existing in the Fort.

3. Opening of the covered side drains in the Fort, and rendering them unabsorbent by cementing their interiors. This is a matter I have frequently written about, and the urgency of this necessity is in no way diminished.

4. Closing of the present burial grounds, which are getting crowded, to those possessing no vested rights of burial in them, and establishing a large general cemetery, removed some distance from the town.

5. Preventing the dhobies from washing clothes in side drains and ditches in Hirimbure, Elliott road, and Norris road, by granting them the exclusive use of a well or two for the purpose of washing clothes (*vide* letter of March 5).

6. Enforcing the periodical limewashing of the bazaar, markets, and Moorish houses, also the whitewashing of large drains.
