MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, November 28, 1913.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 21, 1913.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. A. J. Martin; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Lieut.-Col. M. L. Hearn, R.A.M.C.; Mr. W. Sutherland Ross; Mr. I. H. Chapman; Mr. G. Lionel Cox; and Mr. J. A. Perera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 24, 1913, having been previously printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 24, 1913, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved that this Council do place on record—(a) Their deep regret at the death of Mr. Ivor David, Inspector-General of Police, and (b) their high appreciation of the services rendered by him to the Council as Inspector-General of Police. That the Chairman do convey to Mr. Ivor David's widow the sympathy of the Council in her bereavement. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved :—

- (1) That the water service laid to Maligawatta be extended further down, so as to serve a larger area of the inhabited portion of Maligawatta.
- (2) That the lighting of Maligawatta be further extended.
- (3) That the area known as Yakbedda be provided with light and water.
- (4) That estimates be called for the above work, and that the same be brought before the proper Committees and Council. Mr. A. J. Martin seconded.—Carried.

4. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, with the leave of Council, withdrew the motion standing in his name and substituted the following motion :—

That a Special Committee consisting of the Members of the Sanitation and Markets Committee, with the addition of Mr. A. J. Martin and himself, be appointed to inquire into—(a) The causes of the abnormal prices of beef, mutton, and firewood now prevailing in this city, (b) to suggest remedies for reducing the said prices, if need be, by submitting draft by-laws to regulate the price of beef, mutton, firewood, &c.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Mr. W. Sutherland Ross moved as an amendment that the appointment of the Special Committee be deferred till the Sanitation and Markets Committee has made its report. Dr. David Rockwood seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the amendment was declared carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved for a return showing the number of civil cases the Council has been involved in during 1912 and 1913, showing the name of plaintiff and defendant, nature of case, result, total cost to the Council in each case, in a form similar to the one annexed; and also for a return showing in detail the total cost to the Council in the acting Municipal Engineers *vs.* the Editor and Manager of "The Ceylonese." Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

6. With regard to the motion standing in the name of Mr. A. J. Martin the Chairman stated that it had not been received in time, but that, with the leave of Council, it might be submitted.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that Mr. Martin be given permission to submit his motion. Dr. David Rockwood seconded.—Carried.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. J. Martin called attention to the constant interruption to traffic owing—(1) To the continual opening of roads; (2) road repairs of a temporary nature; and moved that these matters be considered by the Works Committee and Works Engineer and a report furnished to this Council as to the best means to reduce the unceasing form of annoyance to the public. Mr. T. H. Chapman seconded.—Carried.

7, 8, and 9. The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Sanitation and Markets of November 19, 1913, on Municipal Works of November 21, 1913, and on Finance of November 21, 1913, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council:—

Extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of November 19, 1913.

- (2) To sanction an estimate for a public latrine at St. Michael's road, Rs. 7,200.—Recommended.
 - (3) To sanction an estimate for concreting the main drain from Wall street to Blomendahl road, Rs. 400.—Recommended.
- The Works Engineer to be asked to report what other drains are in the same condition and in need of repair, and in particular with regard to the drain in front of the row of boutiques in Dean's road near Walker and Greig's premises.
- (4) To sanction a supplemental vote on account of work in connection with the sewer in Duke street, Rs. 2,773·31.—Recommended.
 - (5) To consider Dr. E. V. Ratnam's motion at the General Meeting of October 24, 1913, namely, that public drains of the city, particularly those in the congested areas, be regularly scrubbed and flushed twice a day.
- Resolved.—(1) that the time table drawn by the Works Engineer be submitted at the next meeting; (2) that it be mentioned at the General Meeting of the 28th instant that the Chairman had evidently been misled by the three columns in the time table of scavenging—to suppose that the drains were flushed three times a day; whereas, as a matter of fact, they are flushed only once, and in some cases twice.
- (6) To consider the question of the salary of Dr. A. J. Milne, Acting Medical Officer of Health.—Recommended that the salary be paid, and that Dr. Milne draw the available travelling allowance of Rs. 100 a month.
 - (7) To consider the minutes of an inquiry held by the Chairman into the charges preferred against Mr. F. Ginger, late Chief Clerk of the Sanitation Department.—Recommended that the transfer of Mr. Ginger be confirmed, but that he remain on his own salary.
 - (8) To consider a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary requesting the consent of the Council to the proposed alterations in the sewer in Main street.—Recommended that the consent be granted on the condition that the cost be paid by Government.

- (10) To sanction a supplemental vote for extra labour employed during the floods in connection with the conservancy of the town, Rs. 315.—Recommended.
- (11) To sanction a supplemental vote for the acquisition of land for widening Steuart street, Rs. 6,190.—Recommended.
- (12) To sanction an estimate for a public latrine at St. Michael's road, Rs. 7,200.—Referred to the City Sanitation Engineer to report whether another site cannot be obtained further from the market on Municipal land in the vicinity.
- (13) To sanction a supplemental vote on account of extra telephones, Rs. 500.—Recommended, and approved of the Secretary's keeping on the telephone at his house.
- (14) To sanction a vote for the acquisition of lots F, G, and H 40, at Urugodawatta, for the erection of a new bridge, Rs. 193.—Recommended.
- (15) To provide a boat for use at Grandpass for patrolling of police in flooded areas, Rs. 100.—Recommended
- (16) Report from the Waterworks Engineer regarding damage caused by floods to the existing pipe line works and also to the 30-in. pipe line now under construction.—Recommended.
- (17) Question of the arrears due by Messrs. Boustead Brothers on the tram route along Gasworks street.—Recommended that Messrs. Boustead Brothers be called upon to pay the whole amount of arrears.
- (18) Question of the arrears due by the Military authorities for the lighting of the arc lamp in Flagstaff street.—Recommended that the Municipal Council claim the arrears for the whole five years.
- (20) To sanction expenditure on account of telephone communication to the Chairman's residence, "Oakholme," Cambridge place.—Recommended (*vide* item 13).
- (21) Papers in connection with the retirement of Mr. J. H. Nelson, Assistant Recordkeeper, Secretariat.—Recommended that he retire on a pension of Rs. 371 per annum.
- (22) Salaries to Engineering Staff: Question of increment of salaries to Messrs. Blizard and Mair.—Recommended—(1) That Mr. Blizard be informed that he will be paid a salary of Rs. 5,500, pending the settlement of a salary scheme for the higher grade officers, and that in the event of his not accepting the terms under the scheme he will be provided with a passage back to England in terms of his agreement; (2) that Mr. Mair be informed that in the event of satisfactory arrangements not being arrived at he will be given his passage back to England.
- (23) To sanction a supplementary provision of Rs. 15 on Estimate H (a) 14, rent of motor house.—Recommended.
- (24) To sanction the expenditure of Rs. 75 on account of 6 hand-bags for Sub-Inspectors of the Public Health Department.—Recommended.
- (25) To sanction the payment of Rs. 97.50 out of I (h) 50, Miscellaneous to Conservancy Supervisors during the period their bicycles were under repairs.—Recommended.
- (26) To consider the question of the salary of Dr. A. J. Milne, Acting Medical Officer of Health.—Recommended.
- (27) To sanction an expenditure of Rs. 375 for a typewriter for the Works Department.—Recommended.
- (28) Papers in connection with—(a) The retirement of Mr. D. F. Jayatilake, Storekeeper, Waterworks Department, and (b) the appointment of a successor.—(a) Retirement recommended; (b) recommended that the salary be Rs. 960, unless a man can be appointed on a less salary in the Council's service.
- (30) To provide an annual grant towards the cost of upkeep of the bridge over the Kirillapone canal on the Village Committee road from Narahenpitiya through Kirillapone and Nugogoda.
Resolved—That the Government Agent be informed that the Municipal Council are unable to see their way to make a contribution towards the upkeep of the bridge.
- (31) Question of enhanced pension to Mr. E. Nelson, Recordkeeper, Secretariat.—Recommended that a list of Mr. Nelson's services, as shown in the annexures of the papers, be sent to Government for a reconsideration of an enhanced pension.
- (32) Land acquisition case, D.C. No. 2,379, in regard to lot No. 32, property No. 13, Kew road, *re* the payment of Rs. 4,934 as compensation to the three defendants in the case.
Resolved—That the compensation of Rs. 4,934 be paid, and that the Council bear its own costs.
- (33) To sanction the employment of extra clerks and an extra peon for the Vehicles and Animals Branch.—Recommended.
- (34) To sanction a supplementary vote of Rs. 480 on account of police contribution in connection with the extension of Municipal limits eastward; also a re-vote of Rs. 107,634, *i.e.*, the amount provided in 1912-13 Budget, but payment of which was not made during the period covered by the Budget.—Recommended.
- (35) Question of allowing a rebate of Rs. 239.48 to the renter of the draw-bridge canal toll.—Recommended that the rebate be granted.
- (36) To consider an application from P. Ponniah Pillai of 33, Armour street, Colombo, for the lease of the Council's land situated at the junction of Armour street and Grandpass road.—Recommended that the terms be accepted, but the period be limited to 25 years, and that the lessee pay taxes.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 7, 8, and 9 on the agenda.
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

7. With reference to item No. 5 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of November 19, 1913, the Chairman said that it had been brought to his notice that the late Chairman had evidently been misled by the three columns in the time table of scavenging—to suppose that drains were flushed three times a day—whereas, as a matter of fact, they are flushed only once, and in some cases twice.

Resolved—That the remaining items of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of November 19, 1913, be adopted.

8. With reference to item No. 11 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of November 21, 1913, it was resolved that the wording be amended by the deletion of the words "along Gasworks street."

With reference to item No. 13 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of November 21, 1913, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved:—

That this question be referred to the Standing Committee on Law for report as to whether the Council has the power, under Ordinance No. 18 of 1907, to supply water to the police training school at Mount Lavinia and Clerks' quarters at Angulana.—Mr. J. A. Perera seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried, 15 voting for it and 1 against.

Resolved—That the remaining items of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of November 21, 1913, be adopted.

9. With reference to item No. 17 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 21, 1913, it was resolved that the words "along Gasworks street" be deleted.

Resolved—That the remaining items of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 21, 1913, be adopted.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted as amended. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

10. To appoint two Members on the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects, *vice* Mr. H. A. Jayewardene, deceased, and Major A. W. de Wilton, resigned.

Council proceeded to elect two Members for the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects, voting by ballot, and the Chairman declared, on the results of the ballot, that Messrs. J. A. Perera and L. B. Fernando had been duly elected Members of that Standing Committee.

11. Letter from the Messrs. Schofield forwarding Rs. 800 being subscriptions collected by them and the proceeds of a concert held in aid of flood relief.

The Chairman read the letter from the Messrs. Schofield, and Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that it be acknowledged with thanks. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

12. The application from Major Muspratt Williams for the erection of a head stone to the grave of Gunner Rippie. The Chairman moved that the application be granted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

13. Consideration of the Chairman's Administration Report for 1912.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the consideration of the Chairman's Administration Report for 1912 be postponed to the December Meeting. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

14. The recommendations of the Special Committee consisting of the four Standing Committees appointed on June 27, 1913, to inquire into:—

(a) The organization and prospects of the various branches of the Municipal service, to revise salaries and allowances, and to submit a proper incremental scheme and rules and regulations relating to the appointments, salaries, and promotions of Municipal Officers.

(b) Salaries of the higher grade officers.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the matter be referred back to the Special Committee in order that a complete scheme be submitted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried, 16 voting for it and 1 against.

15—20. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the remaining items on the agenda, *viz.*, 15 to 20, be adopted. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

"An improved spout and cupholder for collecting rubber latex."

Abstract :—The nature and purpose of the invention is described in the claims as follows :—

(1) In collecting rubber latex a metallic spout of semicircular section characterized by cutting the ends of it obliquely and parallel at an angle of about forty-five degrees with a plane passing through the edges of the spout for the purpose of attaching the spout to the tree by driving the angular points thus obtained at one end of the spout into the bark of the tree and for securing a central dripping point for the latex at the other end of the spout, substantially as described and illustrated.

(2) In collecting rubber latex a spout as claimed in claim 1 provided with a hole on each side of it near the upper edges and near the angular points at one end or with a projection on each side placed similarly to the holes just described formed by cutting the edges and bending outwards at right angles a sufficient portion of the material of which the spout is made for the purpose of attaching the cupholder, substantially as described and illustrated.

(3) In collecting rubber latex a cupholder attached to the spout claimed in claims 1 and 2 formed of wire of any convenient material bent into a loop and attached to the holes or the projections of the spout, substantially as described and illustrated.

(4) In collecting rubber latex a spout and-cupholder as claimed in the preceding claims in combination substantially as described and illustrated and for the purposes described.

"Improvements in and relating to concrete piles."

Abstract :—This invention relates to the well known method of forming concrete piles by driving a tube provided with a shoe at its lower end into the ground and after the shoe and tube have reached a satisfactory depth withdrawing the tube after it has been filled with concrete either in a liquid state or in the form of a previously cast concrete column or a combination of both.

According to this invention the upper surface of the shoe has a double flange, the annular recess formed by these two flanges being slightly wider than the thickness of the tube and the lower end of the tube is inserted into this recess the joint being made tight by means of clay, hemp, Tuck's packing, or/and other material. By this means when the shoe is driven into the ground through running sand, water or such like material, the joint prevents the water or sand, &c., percolating between the tube and the shoe, and thus entering into the hollow column. When the tube has reached the desired depth the tube is filled in the ordinary way with liquid concrete, reinforced if desired, or with a previously cast or moulded concrete column, also reinforced if desired, or a combination of these two, and the tube is then withdrawn. The inner flange or part of the shoe may either be above or below or level with the outer flange. If the shoe or the upper part of it is made of concrete it should be hollowed out or otherwise formed to make a bond with the subsequent addition.

In some cases when a solid column is employed it is made of less diameter than the tube and the space is filled with liquid concrete.

The claims are :—

(1) The combination of a pile head having an annular groove in its upper surface, a tube the lower end of which enters the groove and a filling or packing in the groove making a watertight joint around the lower end of the tube substantially as described.

(2) The combination of a pile head having an annular groove in its upper surface, a tube the lower end of which enters the groove and a filling or packing around both the inside and outside of the lower end of the tube substantially as described.

Abstract :—In a loom provided with longitudinal pile wires secured to the reduced tops of pins each dent of the pile comb or switch reed is provided with a sheet-metal or wire projection to prevent the pile warps from passing back to the wrong sides of the wire. The comb is supported between flanged pulleys and is reciprocated by a connexion from a cam-operated lever and by a weight.

The claims are :—

1. In a loom for weaving pile fabrics, the combination with pile forming wires and their supporting uprights or pins, of a pile comb or switch reed having teeth or dents provided with projections or guides for preventing the pile warp threads from passing back to the wrong sides of said uprights or pins and wires, substantially as herein shown and described.

2. In a loom for weaving pile fabrics, the improved tooth or dent of a pile comb or switch reed comprising in combination with an ordinary tooth or dent of a winged appendage or guide, as herein described and illustrated in figures 5 and 6 of the accompanying drawings.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE TRADERS UNION COMPANY OF COTTA, LIMITED.

It is agreed that the regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to the "Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," subject to the hereinafter mentioned modifications, shall be deemed to be the regulations of the Company.

The modifications are as follows:—

Issuing and Transferring of Shares.—Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the office of the Company for approval by the Directors, accompanied by such evidence, as may be required by the Directors to prove the title of the transferor.
