PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish a Police Force in any place other than large towns, though such force be not maintained in the manner prescribed by the said Ordinance, and to declare that certain provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation at such place, specifying the limits thereof, and such Proclamation from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 1st day of March, 1872, a Police Force was, under the provisions of the said Ordinance, established in the town of Balangoda, now within the Province of Sabaragamuwa, comprised within the limits in the said Proclamation specified :

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation of the 1st day of March, 1872, aforesaid and to re-establish a Police Force in the town of Balangoda aforesaid under the provisions of the said 8th section of the Ordinance aforesaid, and to declare that certain of the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation therein, within the limits hereinafter specified :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation of the 1st day of March, 1872, aforesaid, as from and after the 30th day of June, 1892, and do from and after such date, under the provisions of section 8 of the Ordinance aforesaid, re-establish a Police Force in the town of Balangoda aforesaid, the limits of which town shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be those specified in the schedule hereto :

And We do further declare that the following sections of the said Ordinance, save where they or any of them shall have been by any subsequent Ordinance in any wise amended or in part repealed, shall from and after the 30th day of June, 1892, aforesaid, come into operation in the said town, viz., 51, 53, 54, 55, 57, 58, 59, 61, 62, 63, 65, 67, 69, 70, 72, 73, 74, 78, 79, 80, 85, 87, 90, 91, 94, 95, and 98.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-two.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Police Town of Balangoda.

A straight line drawn from the 82½ milepost on the Government cart road to the land known as Kotugodella, from thence a straight line to the old path to Petigala, along this road to the Gama-ela, along the Gama-ela to its junction with the Dorawel-oya, from the Dorawel-oya along the Ranawinna Amare-ela to the road to Agar's Land, along the road to Agar's Land to its junction with the village path to Weliharanawa, and along this path to its junction with the Government cart road near the Roman Catholic church at the 83½ milepost, thence a line 30 yards from the centre of the cart road and along the road to the iron bridge over the Dorawel-oya, and thence the Dorawel-oya as far as the bathing-place known as Kekunagabayatawala, and from thence a straight line to join the afore-mentioned 82½ milepost on the Government cart road.

Notification establishing New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 1 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal, anything in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary contained notwithstanding:

It is hereby notified that by a resolution passed by the said Legislative Council at a public session thereof, held on the First day of June, 1892, and under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf by the said 1st section of the said Ordinance on the said Council conferred, it was resolved that from and after the First day of August, 1892, tolls shall be established on the road from Kaḍugannāwa to Gampola at the places set forth in the schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything in the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding, and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall so by any such resolution be established the provisions of the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said first in part recited Ordinance, apply to such tolls:

And whereas by a resolution of the said Legislative Council duly passed at a public session thereof on the First day of June, 1892, tolls have been duly established (1) at Kaḍugannāwa in Yaḥinuwara, within quarter of a mile of the junction of the Paranapattiya road with the Colombo road, the place of collection being at Dandudeniyaḡedarawatta; and (2) at Gampola in Udapalāta, about ten chains west of the junction of Malabar street with the Kaḍugannāwa-Paranapattiya road, the place of collection being at Ganēṭennēwatta, bearing assessment No. 19, on the road from Kaḍugannāwa to Gampola, from the First day of August, 1892, and it is expedient to specify the rates at which such tolls shall be levied in respect of the said road:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor do hereby by this Our Proclamation and under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf by the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," on Us conferred, appoint that tolls shall be levied in respect of the said road at the rates in the schedule hereto specified.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-two.

Resolution as to collection of New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof:

And whereas by a resolution of the Legislative Council duly passed on the First day of June, 1892, tolls have from and after the First day of August, 1892, been duly established on the road from Kaḍugannāwa to Gampola, and it is expedient to determine at what places the tolls in respect of the said road shall be collected:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the said Executive Council, do by this Our resolution notify that the places respectively set forth in the schedule hereto are the places at which the said tolls so established in respect of the said road as aforesaid shall be collected.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

M I N U T E .

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to empower the Ceylon Government to raise Four Million Rupees for the construction of Railways and other Public Works.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient for the Ceylon Government to borrow, upon the security of the general revenue of the Colony, a sum not exceeding four million rupees for the construction of railways and other public works, and the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for and in connection with such railways and other public works: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Commencement.

1 This Ordinance shall come into operation on such day as the Governor shall by Proclamation appoint.

Power to borrow money not exceeding Rs. 4,000,000.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor, in addition to the money already borrowed under any other Ordinance, to borrow upon debentures or stock notes, or partly by debentures and partly by stock notes to be issued by the Government, any sum or sums of money not exceeding four million rupees for the purposes specified in this Ordinance. Provided that the amount to be borrowed on Government stock notes shall in no case exceed two million rupees.

Principal moneys and interest charged on the revenue of Ceylon.

3 All debentures, Government stock notes, and coupons issued under this Ordinance, and the principal moneys and interest respectively secured thereby, shall be charged on, and be payable out of, the general revenue and assets of the Island.

Application of money borrowed.

4 The money borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be applied exclusively in and about the construction of railways and other public works, and in and about the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for and in connection with such railways and other public works.

Borrowing on debentures.

5 When the borrowing shall be upon debentures, such debentures shall be signed on behalf of the Government of Ceylon by the treasurer of the Island for the time being, or by such other public officer or officers as may be appointed by the Governor for the purpose; and public notice in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of such appointment shall be held sufficient evidence thereof.

Debentures.

6 Each debenture issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be for a sum of not less than one thousand rupees, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum, payable half-yearly in manner hereinafter provided.

Interest coupons.

7 The interest upon the principal secured by each debenture shall run from the day named in that behalf in the debenture and shall be paid half-yearly, and there shall be attached to each debenture coupons for the payment of the interest to become due in each half-year. The coupons shall be sufficient in number to provide for the payment of the interest, either during the whole period for which the debenture has to run or for such limited period as the Governor may determine.

Form of debentures and coupons.

8 The debentures and the coupons thereto may be in such form as the Governor may direct or approve.

Debentures and coupons transferable by delivery.

9 Each debenture and all right to and in respect of the principal money secured thereby, and each coupon and all right of interest payable in respect thereof, shall be transferable by delivery, and the principal moneys secured by such debenture and the interest payable in respect of such coupon shall be payable in Colombo at the treasury.

Registration of debentures.

10 Each debenture shall, before being issued, be registered with the date thereof in a register book to be kept by the treasurer for that purpose, and upon being so registered shall be endorsed by him as registered.

Government may contract.

11 It shall be lawful for the Governor, for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, to appoint any agent to sell the debentures or any number thereof, or to contract with any person or any body politic or corporate (for a commission or a reward, but free of all other costs and charges to the Colony), for the issue of the debentures or any number thereof, or if to the said Governor it shall appear expedient to sell the whole or any number of such debentures to any person or any body politic or corporate for a price not below par.

Mode of providing for payment of interest and principal of debentures.

12 So long as any of the debentures remain outstanding, the Governor shall in each half-year appropriate out of the general revenue and assets of the Island a sum equal to one half-year's interest on the whole of the debentures previously issued, including any which may have been redeemed, and shall authorise the treasurer to hold that sum so as to enable him to pay thereout the then current half-year's interest on the day when it falls due. After the expiration of two years from the day on which the first of the debentures is issued, and so long thereafter as any of the debentures remain outstanding, the Governor shall, in each half-year ending as aforesaid, appropriate out of the revenue and assets of the Colony an additional sum equal to one-half per cent. on the total nominal amount of all debentures issued on or before the first day of that half-year, including any which may have been redeemed, and authorise the treasurer to hold that sum for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

Application of moneys paid to treasurer.

13 The treasurer shall, subject to the approval of the Governor, place and keep the moneys so entrusted to him, or so much thereof as may not be required for immediate payments in any Imperial, Indian, or Colonial Government security or securities, and shall hold all such moneys and the accumulations thereon in trust, to apply them, in the first place, in payment of the interest for the current half-year upon the debentures for the time being outstanding, and in the next place in the formation of a sinking fund.

Application of sinking fund.

14 The sinking fund shall be applied, in the first place, to payment of all expenses of, or incidental to, the redemption of debentures, including the charges of the notary public attending at any drawing thereof, and the costs and expenses of all notices required by this Ordinance to be given; and in the next place, and subject to the aforesaid payments, in repayment of the principal moneys for the time being secured by the debentures.

Debentures to be redeemed by purchase or by annual drawings.

15 The debentures shall, at the option of the treasurer, subject to the approval of the Governor for the time being, be redeemed either by purchase in the open market or by annual drawings, and subject to the aforesaid payments the sum to be applied annually to such redemption shall correspond as nearly as may be to, but not exceed, the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the sinking fund.

Appointment of day for drawing of debentures.

16 After the expiration of two years from the day on which the first of the debentures is issued, and so long thereafter as any of the debentures remain outstanding and unsatisfied, the treasurer shall in every year, unless the whole amount of the money applicable in that year to the redemption of debentures has been applied in the purchase thereof, appoint a day in that year for the drawing by lot of the debentures to be redeemed.

<p>Notice of time and place appointed for drawing.</p>	<p>17 If a day is appointed for drawing, the treasurer shall give, by advertisement in three at least of the local newspapers, not less than fifteen days' previous notice, specifying the day on which and the time and place at which the drawing will take place, and the nominal amount of the debentures to be redeemed at that drawing.</p>
<p>Mode of drawing.</p>	<p>18 On the day and at the time and place so specified the treasurer shall hold a meeting at which the holder of any debenture may, if he thinks fit, be present, and shall then in the presence of such debenture holders (if any) as may attend, and of a notary public, draw by lot out of the whole number of debentures for the time being outstanding debentures of the specified nominal amount.</p>
<p>Notice of debentures drawn for redemption.</p>	<p>19 The treasurer shall thereupon declare the distinguishing numbers of the debentures drawn for redemption, and shall as soon as may be, by advertisement in at least three of the local newspapers, specify the numbers and appoint a day (not being later as to each debenture than the day on which the current half-year's interest thereon is payable) in which the principal moneys secured by the debentures so distinguished will be repaid.</p>
<p>Payment of drawn debentures.</p>	<p>20 On the day so appointed the treasurer shall, at his office in Colombo, on demand pay to the holders of the debentures drawn for repayment the principal moneys secured by those debentures, with all interest payable thereon up to that date. Provided that it shall be lawful for the treasurer, in the event of any coupon or coupons not being delivered up to him, together with the debenture in manner provided by section 22, to deduct from any payment the value of the coupon or coupons not so delivered up to him. Provided also that where it shall appear to the treasurer upon oath or otherwise to his satisfaction that any such coupon or coupons has or have been destroyed by reason of accident, mistake, or misfortune, and without any wilful design or intention to defraud the Government, then and in every such case it shall be lawful for the treasurer, with the previous sanction and authority of the Government, to pay the holder of the debenture the whole of the principal moneys secured by such debenture, with all interest due and payable thereon, on receiving from the holder of such debenture security of such nature and amount as the Governor may determine.</p>
<p>Cessation of interest from day appointed for payment of principal.</p>	<p>21 From and after the day appointed for the repayment of any debenture all interest on the principal moneys secured thereby shall cease and determine, whether payment of the principal has or has not been demanded.</p>
<p>Redeemed debentures to be cancelled.</p>	<p>22 Upon the repayments of the principal moneys secured by any debenture, such debenture, with all the coupons thereunto belonging, shall be delivered up to the treasurer, to be by him cancelled and forwarded to the auditor-general of the Island. Any debenture redeemed by purchase shall be likewise so cancelled and forwarded.</p>
<p>Money repaid not to be re-borrowed.</p>	<p>23 No moneys applied in redemption of a debenture shall be re-borrowed, and no debenture shall be issued in respect of, or in substitution for, any cancelled debenture.</p>
<p>Borrowing upon Government stock notes.</p>	<p>24 When the borrowing shall be upon Government stock notes, such Government stock notes shall be issued by the treasurer at par, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum.</p>
<p>Government stock notes when redeemable.</p>	<p>25 All the Government stock notes which may be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be redeemable at par on a date to be expressed on the face of the note, such date not being later than twenty years from the date of issue. From and after which date all interest on the principal moneys secured thereby shall cease and determine, whether payment of the principal shall have been demanded or not.</p>
<p>Amount of stock note.</p>	<p>26 Each Government stock note issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be for a sum of not more than five hundred and not less than twenty-five rupees, and shall run for a period of four years, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum payable yearly.</p>

Payment of interest on presentation at kachchéri.

27 The interest upon the principal secured by each Government stock note shall run from the day named in the note, and shall be paid yearly on the presentation of the note at any kachchéri, and there shall be attached to each note coupons for the payment of the interest to become due each year. The coupons shall be four in number, and on the first presentation the government agent or assistant government agent shall himself cut off and retain as a voucher for the debit in his accounts the coupon or portion of the note relating to the first payment of interest, and on subsequent presentation he shall similarly cut off and retain each succeeding coupon. On presentation of the final or principal portion of the note he shall retain it and issue to the holder a new note, which shall similarly run for a fresh series of four years, and shall be dealt with in a similar manner as the original note, unless the period named by the Governor for repayment shall have elapsed.

Form of Government stock notes and coupons.

28 The Government stock notes and the coupons attached thereto shall be in such form as the Governor by notification in the *Government Gazette* may direct or appoint.

Government stock notes transferable by delivery.

29 Each Government stock note and all right to, or in respect of, the principal money or interest secured thereby shall be transferable by delivery without any endorsement, and the principal moneys secured by such note and the interest payable in respect thereof shall be payable at any kachchéri.

Mode of providing for payment of interest and principal of Government stock notes.

30 So long as any of the Government stock notes shall remain unredeemed, the Governor shall in each year appropriate out of the general revenue and assets of the Island a sum equal to one year's interest on the whole of such Government stock notes, and shall authorise the treasurer to hold that sum so as to enable him to pay thereout the interest on the day when it falls due. The Governor shall further appropriate out of the said revenue and assets in each year an additional sum for the formation of a sinking fund equal to one and a half per centum on the total amount of such Government stock notes.

Sinking fund to be invested.

31 The amount so appropriated for the formation of a sinking fund shall be invested in the names of the auditor-general and of the treasurer, who shall from time to time invest the dividends or produce arising from such investments, so that the same may accumulate by way of compound interest and be applied towards the final extinction of the debt.

Securities in which sinking fund is to be invested.

32 All sums paid to the account of such sinking fund and the interest thereof shall be invested in Imperial Indian or Colonial Government security or securities at the discretion of the Governor.

Any deficiency in sinking fund to be made good out of general revenue and assets.

33 In case the said sinking fund shall be insufficient to provide the necessary funds for the redemption of the Government stock notes when it shall become due, the deficiency shall be made good out of the general revenue and assets of the Island.

Expenses to be paid out of sinking fund.

34 All expenses of or incidental to the management of the sinking fund, or to the repayments of the principal moneys borrowed on the Government stock notes, shall be paid out of the sinking fund.

Governor to fix rate of interest from time to time.

35 It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, before the issue of any debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them under the provisions of this Ordinance, to determine the rate of interest to be paid in respect of such issue of debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them, provided that the rate of interest to be paid in respect of such debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them, shall in no case exceed four per centum per annum.

REVENUE.
