MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, January 10, 1914.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 5, 1914.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. H. M. Makan Markar; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; and Mr. A. H. F. Clarke.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of the Council and of the Special General Meeting of Council held on December 13, 1913, copies of which were sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council and of the Special Meeting of Council held on

December 13, 1913, be confirmed.

- •2. The Standing Committees for 1914 were ballotted for and resulted as follows:—
- (1) Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment: Mr. D. G. Goonewardena, Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. G. E. Abeywardena.

(2) Standing Committee on Municipal Works: Mr. D. G. Goonewardena, Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. A. H. F. Clarke.

- (3) Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects: Mr. D. W. Subesingha, Mr. G. E. Abeywardena, Mr. A. C. Hayley
- (4) Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation: Mr. D. W. Subesingha, Dr. C. B. Lourensz, Mr. A. C. Hayley.

Mr. F. Perera came in at this stage of the proceedings.

3. The following Special Committees were re-appointed for 1914:--

(1) Special Committee appointed on November 11, 1911, to ascertain and report as to the ways and means to be adopted to provide the town with improved lighting.

(2) Special Committee appointed on July 13, 1912, to report as to what steps should be taken to improve the

drainage of the town.

(3) Special Committee appointed on September 20, 1913, to draw up the necessary rules for the regulation of the transport of goods by motor lorries within Municipal limits.

4. Papers re appointment of a Medical Officer of Health.—Deferred for next Meeting.

5. Resolved—That the excess of leave of three days over thirty days in 1913, granted to Mr. D. M. Moreira, Secretary, be sanctioned.

6. The Chairman, with the permission of Council, submitted letter No. 15 dated January 10, 1914, from the Superintendent of Works, with regard to reducing the water level of the Hiyare reservoir to 6 feet below spill to enable the work of removal of mud and weeds to be continued.

Resolved—That the Superintendent of Works be requested to make a careful calculation of the quantity of water that would be used, and what would remain at the end of four months' draught if height of water in reservoir is reduced

by 6 feet now.

Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the Month of January, 1914.

General Health.—The general health of the town was far from satisfactory. Besides the infectious diseases mentioned below, dengue, influenza, and dysentery have been prevailing to some extent.

Infectious Diseases.—There were 9 cases of chickenpox, 5 measles, 7 enteric, 12 phthisis, 13 cholera.

On January 26 some cases of cholera were reported at Gintota. On inspection a man named Lenty was found to have been the first attacked. He arrived from Paluwatta Mills, Grandpass, and took ill at Gintota, probably on Thursday or Friday preceding. He was treated by no less than nine vedaralas, and a large number of friends and relations visited him. No report of his illness was made to the authorities by those in attendance. On Monday morning several others were attacked, and three succumbed to the disease, and others were in a serious condition. It was only then that one of the vedaralas, at the request of the Postmaster and other residents, sent two telegrams, one to the Superintendent of Police and one to the Medical Officer of Health.

I proceeded to the spot at once and found the Provincial Surgeon and Dr. Nugera there. We immediately took the necessary precautions, took down the names of all contacts, and had the Police watching the infected houses.

Next morning we found seven dead from the disease, four in Gintota, within Municipal limits, and three just outside the limits. Six of the bodies were cremated and one was buried.

The other patients, two in number, were removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital, and the contacts were all despatched to the Segregation Camp.

A Police guard was placed in charge of the infected houses, and subsequently all the infected houses were white-washed, fumigated, and washed with cyllin. All suspected articles were burnt. The floors of all the houses were burnt with straw and cadjans. The premises in and about Gintota were cleaned up and all the accumulation burnt.

The total number of cases that occurred during the epedimic was 18, of which 13 were within Municipal limits;

The total number of cases that occurred during the epedimic was 18, of which 13 were within Municipal limits; of the total number of 18 cases, 9 were admitted into hospital, of which 4 died and 5 were discharged cured; of the 9 cases treated outside the hospital, all died.

The total number of contacts were:—In the Camp, 66, at Cornelis Police Officer's, Magalla, 10; at Don Davith's, Gintota, 10; total 86; of the contacts, 4 contracted the disease while under observation.

I wish to point out the difficulty there was in engaging coolies to do burying, disinfecting, removing patients, and latrine work.

I would suggest that a staff of Tamil coolies (about 10 to 15 in number) be got down from India or Colombo at a monthly salary of Rs. 15 to Rs. 18, to be engaged particularly for infectious disease work, and when there is no epedemic they could be easily placed to work at the park, Pettigallawatta drains, Segregation Camp, and Health Department.

The Segregation Camp should be cleaned of all jungle and necessary buildings put up, so that it will always be in readiness to receive contacts or patients on the occurrence of any epedemic.

Drainage.—The drainage of the whole town is defective, except perhaps the Fort. Many of the street drains are broken and require to be replaced. These drains unless in good repairs cannot be flushed thoroughly and cleaned, as water and dirt remain in broken places and undergo decomposition. Culverts require to be uncovered periodically and cleaned up.

Unbuilt drains should be frequently cut and kept free of sand and rubbish, and kept in such a state that no water can stagnate in them. The drain on the sea side of Kaluwella road should be built at once, and the built portion should be repaired. There are places in which water from private premises flow on to the road side and remain stagnant there for want of a drain to carry it off.

The drainage of Talapitiya, China Garden, a portion of Minuwangoda, and Pettigallawatta is very unsatisfactory. It is a question for a Sanitary Engineer. The lands hereabouts are low-lying and below sea level, and an expert Engineer is required to suggest a means for the outlet of sewage and water.

The following require immediate attention:-

- (1) The standpipe between China Garden and Wackwella road, and the drain in China Garden into which the water flows.
- (2) The culvert opposite No. 20, Main street.
- (3) The culvert over the turn to Pettigalla lane.

(4) The culvert at the end of Ward street, opposite the headman's ambalam.

(6) Drain leading from gala No. 16 to Main street.

Foul street drain.

(8) Ward street drain.

(9) Drain round the Green market.(10) Kaluwella opposite No. 81, the drain requires attention. (11) Rampart street, Fort, big drain flowing towards Lighthouse.

(12) Drains in Pedlar street.

(13) Drain round fish market.

Scavenging and Sweeping.—On the whole this has been satisfactory. During the early part of the month the whole town was full of the debris caused by the cyclone, but this has been satisfactorily cleared away.

Water Supply.—The water has been discoloured intermittently.

Alleys are clean and well kept.

Bakeries-Clean and in a sanitary state.

Markets.-Clean and in a sanitary state.

Cattle and Goats.—240 head of cattle were presented for slaughter, out of which 6 were rejected, 171 were slaughtered at the slaughter-house in town, and 71 goats at Kaluwella.

The Public Latrines are fairly well kept.
