VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE .MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1913.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 31 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

The births numbered 1,445 (724 males and 721 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 31.22 per 1,000, against 30.81 in the preceding month, 26.25 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29.33 the monthly average since July, 1907. The rate ranged from 62.53 in Puttalam to 24.46 in Tangalla. 3. In the city of Colombo* the births numbered 503 (248 males and 255 females), and were equal to an annual rate †

of 25.11 per 1,000, against 22.61 in the preceding month, 22.16 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24.98 the monthly average. The rate ranged from 29.88 in Wellawatta to 12.66 in Kollupitiya.

Deaths.

The total deaths amounted to 2,024 (1,124 males and 900 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 38.55 per 1,000, against 31.92 in the preceding month, 32.89 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30.65 the monthly average. The rate ranged from 101.4 in Matale to 11.05 in Mullaittivu.

5. In the city of Colombo* the deaths numbered 714 (394 males and 320 females), and were equal to an annual rate[†] of 36.61 per 1,000, against 31.85 in the preceding month, 29.93 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31.50 the monthly average. The rate rose from 17.56 in Kollupitiya to 48.13 in Wellawatta.

6. Stillbirths numbered 113 (52 males and 61 females), against 99 in the preceding month.

Infantile Mortality.

The infantile mortality was equal to a rate of 377 per 1,000 births registered, against 351 in the preceding 7. month, 314 in the corresponding month of last year, and 262 the monthly average. The rate ranged from 619 in Matale to 59 in Matara.

The infantile mortality in the city of Colombo was 433 per 1,000 births registered, against 473 in the preceding 8. month, 326 in the corresponding month of last year, and 317 the monthly average, and ranged from 641 in St. Paul's to 296 in San Sebastian.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from Infantile Convulsions (9 per cent.), followed by Diarrhaa and Debility (8 per cent. each), Dysentery (7 per cent.), Pneumonia and Phthisis (6 per cent. each), and Bronchitis (3 per cent.).

10. In the city of Colombo the highest mortality was from Phthisis and Infantile Convulsions (11 per cent. each),

In the city of Colombo the ingness mortality was from *Philisis* and *Infantile Convulsions* (11 per cent. each), followed by *Pneumonia* (10 per cent.), *Debility* (7 per cent.), *Enteritis* (6 per cent.), *Bronchitis* and *Dysentery* (5 per cent. each), and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* and *Enteric Fever* (2 per cent. each).
11. Infectious Diseases reported.—The most prevalent infectious disease during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 70 cases were reported (57 in Colombo, 4 in Galle), followed by *Chickenpox* 66 (32 in Colombo, 28 in Kandy), *Enteric Fever* 49 (36 in Colombo, 8 in Jaffna), *Cholera* 34 (24 in Colombo, 10 in Negombo), *Measles* 16 (5 in Matara, 3 in Galle), *Continued Fever* 16 (11 in Colombo, 5 in Kalutara), *Dysentery* 8 (in Moratuwa). *Mumps* 4 (3 in Colombo), *Diarrhæa* 3 (in Colombo), *Diarrhæa* 1 (in Colombo), *Diarrhæa* 3 (in Colombo), *Diarrhæ* Colombo), Diphtheria 2 (in Colombo), and Smallpox 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

12. Rainfall.-Batticaloa recorded the highest rainfall (35.26 inches), followed by Badulla (23.31 inches). The next highest records (23.11 inches and 18.25 inches) were in Nuwara Eliya and Galle, while in the other towns the rainfall ranged from 18.13 inches in Ratnapura to 5.81 inches in Chilaw.

Temperature. — The mean temperature varied from 58.4° in Nuwara Eliya to 79.0° in Mannar and Trincomalee. and was 78.8° in Colombo and 74.3° in Kandy.
