# Part I.—Minutes, Proclamations, Appointments, &c.

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IS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR has received with deep regret the sad news of the death, on the 18th instant, of Mr. Edward Russell Ayrton, Archeological Commissioner, and Mr. George McKerrow Clark, Irrigation Engineer, by drowning, as the result of an accident on Tissawewa.

The Government has sustained a great loss in the death of these officers.

Mr. Ayrton, after studying in England, Germany, and India, was appointed Archæological Commissioner in December, 1912. He had already obtained a wide reputation as an Archæologist, and his early death is a loss not only to Government, but also to scholarship.

Mr. Clark was appointed an Irrigation Engineer in May, 1909, and was placed on the Permanent Staff in June, 1912. The Director of Irrigation had formed a high opinion of his work, and had reported especially favourably upon it to Government.

His Excellency feels that he is expressing both the regret felt by the whole Colony at the death of these promising officers, and the sympathy of all with their relations in their sudden bereavement.

"THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ORDINANCE, 1909," AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE No. 16 of 1912.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 9 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to revoke the regulation dated October 7, 1911, framed under that Ordinance in substitution for regulation 1 of the regulations dated February 2, 1911, and to make the following regulation in substitution thereof.

#### Amended Regulation.

1. (a) Every person importing horses, asses, or mules into the Island from oversea ports shall whenever possible give at least twenty-four hours' notice of the arrival of such animals to the principal officer of Customs of the port of importation, and shall produce a certificate of inspection by a qualified veterinary surgeon describing such animals and certifying that they were free from disease immediately before shipment.

(b) Upon receipt of the said notice the principal officer of Customs shall take the necessary steps to cause such animals to be inspected by a duly authorized

veterinary inspector.

(c) The veterinary inspector shall report the result of his inspection in writing to the principal officer of Customs, and if the certificate referred to in (a) above has been produced, may at the same time in his discretion, by a writing under his hand, authorize the discharge of the said animals from the ship.

(d) The principal officer of Customs may after perusal of the inspector's report authorize the removal from the Customs premises of any such animals.

(e) Provided that in the case of any such animals brought to the port of Talaimannar, the certificate of inspection provided for in (a) above shall be produced to the Customs officer at Talaimannar, who may at the same time in his discretion, by a writing under his hand, anthorize the discharge of the said animals from the ship. Provided further that such animals on being landed at Talaimannar shall be removed forthwith by train to Colombo for inspection by a duly authorized veterinary inspector.

(f) Any person discharging or causing the discharge of any such animals from the ship without the authority of the inspector as provided in (c) or of the Customs officer at Talaimannar as provided in (e), or removing or causing the removal of such animals from the Customs premises or from the Railway premises without the permission of the principal officer of Customs, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 16, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 114 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 8 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1914, viz., 239,528) was 24.8, as against 19.6 in the preceding week, 25.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 121 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 12 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26·3, as against 21·1 in the previous week, 26·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 121 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths fom Phthisis were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in San Sebastian.

- 2. Seven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in San Sebastian. Five deaths from Bronchitis were registered.
- 3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, the same as the average for the last year; of these, 2 were in Maradana of non-residents in hospitals and the other in Fort and Galle Face. There were no deaths from Enteric Fever in the previous week.
- Ten deaths from Debility were registered, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Congestion of Lungs (probably) Plague), 5 from Enteritis, 5 from Accidents, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Senility, 3 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, and 43 from Other Causes.
- 5. Two deaths from Plague were registered, as against 3 in the previous week; of these, 1 was in San Sebastian and the other in St. Paul's. There were 13 cases reported, as against 5 in the previous week.
- 6. There were 8 cases of Chickenpox reported, as against 5 in the previous week ; there were 3 cases of Measles, as against 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 85 0°, against 81 6° in the preceding week and 82 9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.778 in., against 29.836 in. in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.26 in., against 4.12 in. in the preceding week and 0.80 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
