Order under Section 4, Sub-section (1), of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1908," declaring Lands to be Grown Property.


# Order under Section 4, Sub-section (1), of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1908."

In the matter of the lands commonly called or known as Helakumburewetiyehena, Kodaligahamullehena, Makullegahamullehena, &c., situate in the village of Alanmulla, in the Medagam pattu korale of the Wellassa division, in the Province of Uva, and of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903."

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 1 of the said Ordinances it was duly declared and notified on December 6, 1907, that if no claim to the lands commonly called or known as Helakumburewetiyehena, Kodaligahamullehena, Makullegahamullehena, &c., situate in the village of Alanmulla, in the Medagam pattu korale of the Wellassa division, in the Province of Uva, containing in extent 50 acres 3 roods and 12 perches, and shown as lots 46AB, 46AD, 46AE, 46AF, 71B, 71D, and 71E in preliminary plan 166 and in the annexed diagram, was made to John George Fraser, Special Officer appointed under section 28 of the said Ordinances, within the period of three months from the date specified in the said notice, such lands would be declared the property of the Crown, and dealt with on account of the Crown (vide Notice No. 2,907):

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
