NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

No. 1,376 of October 22, 1913.

Harry Creasy.

"Process for converting unsaturated fatty acids and their esters into saturated compounds."

Abstract:

The nature of the invention is described in the claims as follows:—

(1) A process for converting unsaturated fatty acids or their esters into saturated compounds, which consists in combining hydrogen therewith in the presence of basic compounds of the heavy metals derived from fatty acids having high molecular weights and being soluble in the substances to be treated, for the purpose of producing hydrogenation at a temperature between 100 and 180 degrees Centigrade.

(2) A process for converting unsaturated fatty acids or their esters into saturated compounds, which consists in combining hydrogen therewith in the presence of basic compounds of heavy metals derived from bleic acid or from fixed fatty acids having high molecular weights and being soluble in the oils and fats to be treated, for the purpose of producing hydrogenation at a temperature between 100 and 180 degrees Centigrade.

(3) A process for converting unsaturated fatty acids or their esters into saturated compounds, which consists in mixing raw soya-bean oil with basic oleate of nickel, and exposing the mixture to the action of hydrogen at a temperature of about 158 degrees Centigrade.

(4) Saturated compounds obtained by mixing unsaturated fatty acids or their esters with basic compounds of heavy metals derived from fatty acids and exposing the mixture to a temperature of 100 to 180 degrees Centigrade.

"Improved process of and apparatus for applying coatings or deposits to surfaces."

Abstract:

The nature of the invention is described in the claims as follows:—

(1) A process for applying coatings or deposits to surfaces consisting in feeding the substance of which the coating or deposit is to be formed towards the melting point by an automatic or mechanical feeder or conveying device in such a manner that the feed or forward travel, the melting, the atomising or spraying and the flinging-on or projection of the aforesaid fusible substance are all effected at a like rate and are arranged to bear a direct relation to each other.

(2) Apparatus for applying coatings or deposits to surfaces comprising a feeding means for the substance that is to be applied, a melting device, and means for atomising or spraying, and for flinging-on or projecting the substance, all adapted to operate at a like rate and arranged to bear a direct relation to each other.

(3) In or for an apparatus of the kind set forth in Claim 2, a feeder or conveying device adapted to be actuated or driven by the same means whereby the atomising or spraying is effected, for the purposes hereinbefore set forth.

(4) An apparatus as set forth in Claim 2 in which the melting or atomising or spraying device and the feed mechanism or its motor are arranged on separate and distinct portions of the apparatus for the purpose hereinbefore set forth.

"Apparatus for destroying weeds."

Abstract :

The apparatus consists of a tank, to hold liquid fuel, supported on a pole which is driven into the ground. From the bottom of the tank a flexible pipe is led to the burner. A valve for controlling the supply of liquid fuel is inserted in the pipe near the burner. The burner is described in the claim given below.

The method of using the apparatus is as follows :—

The cooly holds the pipe near the burner just below or above the valve above mentioned, and passes the burner over the weed on the ground and thereby destroys them by burning them.

The claims are :—

(1) In apparatus for destroying weeds, a burner consisting of two concentric perforated pipes with asbestos or other cord or wick between same, with a grating and a cover substantially as described and illustrated.

(2) In apparatus for destroying weeds, a valve for regulating the flow of liquid fuel to the burner substantially as described and illustrated.
