*East and North-east.*—Dutch Bay, Fort Frederick, up to a line taken from the junction of the Love lane with the Coast road to the sea.

*North and North-west.*—Line taken from the junction of the Love lane with the Coast road along the Love lane as far as Tattakkaikulam, and thence to the northern edge of the tank and along it, and thence in a straight line to the Anuradhapura road, and thence along the Anuradhapura road to the Kandy road, and along the Kandy road to the junction with Orr's Hill road.

#### "THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ORDINANCE, 1909."

#### REGULATION REFERRED TO.

Whenever any person applies to have any cattle or other animals carried by rail from any infected area or protective zone, it shall be lawful for the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railway or for any officer authorized by him in writing to call upon the applicant to satisfy him by the production of a certificate from a Veterinary Surgeon or otherwise that the said cattle or said animals are free from disease, and in the event of the said General Manager or said officer not being so satisfied, he may refuse to permit the said cattle or said animals being placed in any truck or being carried by rail.

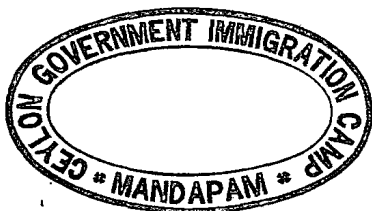

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 27, 1914.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 97 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 52 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 13 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1914, viz., 239,528) was 21.1, as against 22.4 in the preceding week, 23.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 116 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.2, as against 26.6 in the previous week, 25.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 116 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year and 31 the average of last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 9 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals) and 1 in St. Paul's.

2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Nine deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in New Bazaar, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Wellawatta.

4. Eleven deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 9 from *Debility*, 6 from *Congestion of Lungs* (probably *Plague*), 4 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms*, 4 from *Senility*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 from *Diarrhoea*, and 33 from *Other Causes*.

5. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week. Of these, 3 were in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Wellawatta. There were 13 cases reported, the same number as in the previous week.

6. Two cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 1 in the previous week. No cases of measles were reported.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.9°, against 80.2° in the preceding week and 81.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.820 in., against 29.828 in. in the preceding week and 29.845 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.22 in., against 3.90 in. in the preceding week and 0.32 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
