An Order for the purpose of giving validity to certain Registrations of Births and Deaths made in the Southern Province under Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the above-named Ordinance it is enacted that "where, whether before or after the the passing of this Ordinance—

(a) Any registration of a birth, death, marriage, or document, or any other matter which is by law required or authorized to be registered; or

(b) Any proceeding taken or purporting to be taken by or before a Registrar by virtue of his office—

is invalidated by reason of any informality, mistake, or accidental omission, whether relating to the appointment of the Registrar, or the limits of his jurisdiction, or the manner in which the registration or proceeding was made or taken, or any other incidental circumstance, and no other means are by law provided by which the registration or proceeding may be validated, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, by order in Council notified in the Government Gazette, to give directions for the correction of the mistake, informality, or omission, and to make any other order that may be necessary for the purpose of giving validity to the registration or proceeding":

And whereas the division of Weligama town, more fully described in the schedule hereto annexed, was brought under the operation of sections 31 to 36 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895," with effect from July 1, 1908, by Proclamation dated June 16, 1908, published in the Government Gazette No. 6,248 of June 26, 1908, but was not duly notified as a registration division under section 6 of the said Ordinance by inadvertence:

And whereas the registrations of the births and deaths in the aforesaid division are invalidated by reason of such omission, and no other means are by law provided for the validation of the said acts:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. Paths and roads.—The Village Committee shall decide what village paths and roads are to be constructed and maintained within its jurisdiction, and shall fix the breadth to which each path or road is to be cut and the course it is to take.
- 2. Encroachments on roads.—No person shall block up, obstruct, or interfere with or encroach upon, any village path or road, whether constructed or in course of construction.
- 3. Paths through paddy fields.—The proprietors of paddy land shall see that all Gansabhawa paths passing through their paddy lands are not less than three feet in breadth. Any person who shall cut such road with intent to reduce its width or to deface it shall be guilty of an offence.
- 4. Defacing or blocking up private paths.—Any person who shall deface or block up a private village path that has been in existence for ten or more years, or in any other way cause damage to such path, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 5. Public paths through paddy fields may be fenced when fields are under cultivation to prevent cattle trespass.—When a range of paddy fields through which any public path passes is under cultivation. the cultivators of such range shall have power to place sticks across the path (an idikada), when necessary, to prevent cattle from trespassing in the paddy fields and cattle being taken along such paths.
- 6. Injury to village property.—No person shall destroy, damage, or deface in any way any village path, bridge, edanda, ambalama, or any village property whatsoever.
- 7. Wells for drinking water.—The Village Committee may, after giving due notice thereof, set apart certain wells and spouts to be used for obtaining water for drinking purposes only, and no one shall bathe or wash clothes at wells so set apart.
- 8. Protection of wells and artificial pits.—The owners or occupiers of land in which wells and artificial pits are situated shall surround such wells and artificial pits with a fence or wall to such height as may be ordered by the Chief Headman of the district.
- 9. Felling or destroying timber or underwood on ground reserved for forest springs conservancy.—Any person felling or destroying any timber or underwood on grounds within the subdivision reserved for the conservancy of forest, springs, and watercourses shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine on conviction.
- 10. Ferries.—Ferries may be constructed by, or by the consent of, the Committee at such places as may be approved by the Government Agent.

The construction of any such ferry shall be notified in the Government Gazette.

The Committee, by Notification in the Government Gazette, may exempt any ferry established under the Ordinance from tolls at such times or seasons as may be specified in the Notification. Upon the construction of a ferry being so notified, it shall be added to the list referred to in the next succeeding paragraph.

The Village Committee shall prepare a list of village ferries constructed, regulated, or protected under this Ordinance, and may lease out the right to work such ferries. The hire for the conveyance of passengers, animals, and goods shall be in accordance with the following rates at such ferries:—

11. Places for slaughter of cattle, goats, &c.—No licensed butcher or other person shall slaughter cattle, goats, sheep, or swine except in places assigned or approved by the Village Committee.

Sub-section (3) (Fisheries).

12. Fishing near vihares.—No person shall fish in pools or waters near vihares, pansalas, or other places in which it has hitherto not been the custom to fish.

Sub-section (6) (Cattle).

- 13. Slaughter of cattle Every person intending to have a head of cattle slaughtered within the subdivision shall give due notice thereof to the registrar of cattle for the subdivision, and shall produce before him his cattle voucher which he holds as the purchaser or donee of the animal, or, if the animal be one born in his own pinfold, a certified extract from the register of cattle of the village in which it was born, and, if there is a place for slaughter within the subdivision, the registrar of cattle shall cause the head of cattle to be brought to such place within the subdivision, where it shall be duly exposed before it is slaughtered, and shall inform the registrar in whose register the animal is entered.
- 14. Stray cattle.—It shall be the duty of all persons owning or tending cattle to prevent them straying in public paths or places. It shall also be lawful for any village headman to seize any cattle found so straying and to bring them before the Village Committee or Village Tribunal.
- 15. Tying cattle in thoroughfares.—No person shall tie his cattle so as to obstruct a public thoroughfare.
- 16. Tying cattle at night.—All cattle shall be penned or kept tethered over night by the owners or caretakers.

Sub-section (6) (Cattle Disease).

- 17. Segregation of diseased cattle.—The owner or person in charge of any animal attacked with any contagious or infectious disease shall segregate it, and give immediate notice to the headmen of the village in which the animal may then be.
- 18. Removal of affected animals to hospital sheds.—The owner or person in charge of cattle, if directed so to do by the village headman, shall at once have an animal affected with any contagious disease removed to a well ventilated hospital shed and leave it in charge of a person appointed by the headman to tend, feed, and treat it.
- 19. Disinfectants.—The headman shall forthwith apply to the Chairman of the Committee for a supply of disinfectants and medicines.
- 20. Cattle in infected areas to be kept tethered.—In every village in which cattle disease exists or has within ten days previous existed, and in every village within a radius of three miles, all cattle owners and persons in charge of cattle shall keep their animals tethered or securely penned so that they cannot stray. No one shall, however, tether any animal near a road or near any public place.
- 21. Removal of animals from infected areas.—No animal shall be brought into or removed from any villages mentioned in rule 20.
- 22. Burial of carcases.—It shall be the duty of every owner or person in charge of deceased cattle to burn or bury at a depth of six feet the carcase, dung, litter, &c., of any deceased animal, and also to disinfect the spot with disinfectants provided by the headman, and to disinfect himself thoroughly before he approaches healthy cattle.
- 23. Disposal of carcases found unburied.—Every person who, within an infected area, finds the carcases of any cattle lying dead and unburied shall report the same to the nearest headman, who shall forthwith cause them to be buried in the manner aforesaid.
- 24. Disinterring carcases.—No person shall disinter the carcase of any animal which died from an infectious or contagious disease, or remove the flesh or hide or other parts of the carcase of such animal.
- 25. Inoculation.—Owners of cattle in an infected herd or village shall, subject to the advice of the Government Veterinary Surgeon, or on the orders of the Chairman of the Village Committee, have their cattle inoculated or subjected to approved treatment at any spot selected by the Government Veterinary Surgeon or his subordinate.
- 26. Segregation after recovery:—Sattle which have recovered from an infectious or contagious disease shall not be allowed to mix with other heal by cattle until fourteen days have elapsed after complete recovery.

Sub-section (7) (Boundaries).

- 27. Boundaries of private lands.—The boundaries of private lands shall be marked by fences, ditches, stones, or posts.
- 28. Destruction of boundary marks.—No person shall wilfully destroy or injure any boundary mark.

Sub-section (8) (Nuisances).

- 29. Scavenging.—The occupier of every house or land, or if a house or land be cannoccupied, the owner thereof, shall keep such premises clean.
- 30. Disposat of realistic.—No person shall put filth, refuse, rubbish, manure timber, mats, garden produce, or there obstructive matters on the road or into the road drains, nor keep carts thereon, except the so long a time as shall be reasonably necessary to load or unload them.
- 31. Obscene drawings and writings.—No person shall any obscene writing or make any obscene drawing likely to cause annoyance toblish any obscene writing No person shall sing or recite in or near any public place any obscers or to the public.
- 32. Throwing stones or filth.—No person shall throw stones or file song or balled. house or into another's compound.
- 33. Committing nuisance.—No person shall go for any call of nature in any place other than a public latrine, or by the side of any road or in any place voublic to the public.
- 34. Removal of overhanging trees.—The owners of any trees overhanging any public road or path or field shall cause such trees or the branches of such trees to be cut off when directed to do so by the Chairman of the Village Committee. In default the Arachchi or the Vel-Vidane shall cause the work to be done, and the cost thereof shall be recovered from the owner.
- 35. Burial of dead animals.—No owner or tenant shall fail to bury the carcase of any dead animals which may be found on his premises.
- 36. Unwholesome food stuffs.—No person shall expose for sale any articles of food which are unfit for human consumption.
- 37. Prohibition of burial near dwelling houses.—No dead body shall be buried within 50 fathoms of a dwelling house, or in any place where annoyance may be caused to persons living in the neighbourhood.
- 38. Duty of burial by nearest relative.—In the case of death of any person the occupier of the premises where the death took place or, in his absence, the nearest adult male relative of the deceased shall be responsible for the proper burial of the corpse.
- 39. Or by the village headman.—In the absence or default of such occupier or nearest relative the village headman shall cause such body to be buried.
- 40. Defilement of wells, &c.—No person shall defile a well, ela, or any public bathing place, or obstruct the supply of water from a well, spout, or any other water-course.
- 41. Diseased persons prohibited from using public bathing places.—No person infected with any contagious disease shall wash himself or his clothes in any public place.
- 42. Boutiques and market places shall be kept clean.—Boutiques and market places, as well as the roads opposite to them, shall at all times be kept clean by the boutique-keepers. Any person infringing this rule shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine on conviction.
- 43. Disorderly behaviour.—No person shall be drunk and behave in a disorderly manner in or near any tavern or any road or public place.
- 44. Disturbing the public repose.—No person shall disturb the public repose at night after 9 r.m. by making a noise, singing songs, tom-toming, or otherwise making a disturbance. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the existing rights of the people in the matter of religious ceremonies and other orderly gatherings.

Sub-section (9) (Obscene Language).

45. Obscene language.—No person shall use obscene or abusive language celucity to provoke a breach of the peace.

Sub-section (10) (Toddy Drawing).

46. Tappers shall place new scaling bamboos at intervals of six months tapper of kitul flower shall replace by a new one at intervals of six number that bamboo tied to the kitul tree. If any person use a bamboo without renew for required, he shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine on containing the

Sub-section (11) (Spring Guns).

47. Spring guns.—No person shall set spring guns or massive permission of the village headman.

Sub-section (12) (Gambling and Cock)

- 48. Cockfighting.—No person shall train cocks for fighting in any place whatsoever.
- 49. Gambling.—No lotteries, gambling with diegpermitted within the subdivision. Every person persons to gamble in his house or premises shall be
