PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Robert Chalmers, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

HEREAS certain regulations relating to the branding of cattle were made under the provisions of section 4 of "The Cattle Ordinance, 1898," and duly published in the Government Gazette by Proclamation dated July 26, 1912:

And whereas regulations relating to the sale or transfer of cattle were framed under sections 4 and 5 of the said Ordinance, and published in the Government Gazette by Proclamation dated June 28, 1905:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke and vary regulation No. 19 of the regulations published by Proclamation dated July 26, 1912, and also regulation No. 9 of the regulations published by Proclamation dated June 28, 1905:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 4 of "The Cattle Ordinance, 1898," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the regulations Nos. 19 and 9 aforesaid, and make in lieu thereof the regulations set forth in the schedule hereto, with effect as from and after September 1, 1914.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-seventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

9. It shall be the duty of all headmen to seize all stray cattle, those with altered or defaced brandmarks, and cattle (other than those born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) that may be reasonably supposed to have been acquired without a proper certificate, and to produce them before the President of the Gansabhawa, if there is one having jurisdiction over the district, or before the Chief Headman, if there is no Gansabhawa. Such President or Chief Headman shall inquire into the title of any one who claims the animal, and shall issue a certificate to such claimants as have substantiated their claim; and if not so satisfied shall direct that the animal be sold, and the proceeds dealt with as laid down in regulation 8. Provided that before issuing such certificate such President or Chief Headman may direct the claimant to pay such sum as to such President or Chief Headman seems reasonable as expenses for the seizure, detention, and branding of such arimal, and for the issue of such certificate; and if such sum is not paid within such period as may be directed by him may order that the animal be sold, and the proceeds dealt with as laid down in regulation 8. Provided further, that any order made under this regulation shall be subject to an appeal by any person aggrieved by such order to the Government Agent or, in a district administered by an Assistant Government Agent, to the Assistant Government Agent, whose decision shall be final. Provided further, that such appeal shall be made by a written petition within fourteen days, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, from the date on which the order complained of shall have been made.

19. Cattle not bearing a communal brand if apparently over the age of eighteen months, stray cattle, and cattle bearing altered or defaced or illegible or counterfeit brands, or cattle for which false or suspicious certificates are produced, and acquired cattle for which the possessor has no certificate, may be seized, wherever found or kept, by any headman or police or municipal officer, and shall as soon as possible after the seizure be produced by him before the President of the Village Tribunal or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police Magistrate, who shall inquire into claims that may be made to such cattle, and issue certificates to such claimants as have substantiated their claim; and if no claim is made within eight days, or if no claim so made is substantiated, may order the sale of them, and credit the proceeds, less reasonable expenses, including expenses of branding with the broad arrow, to the Communal or, within Colombo Municipal Council limits, to the Municipal Fund, or where there is none to General Revenue, and shall issue a certificate as provided in rule 8 to the purchaser after causing the cattle to be branded in the manner provided by rule 8. Half the proceeds, less the reasonable expenses above mentioned, may be paid to the headman seizing or informer, if so ordered by the President, Chairman, or Police Magistrate. Provided that if any claimant substantiates his claim, such President, Chairman, or Police Magistrate before issuing such certificate may direct the said claimant to pay such sum as to such President, Chairman, or Police Magistrate seems reasonable as expenses for the seizure, detention, and branding of such cattle, and for the issue of such certificate; and if such sum is not paid within such period as may be directed by him, such cattle may be dealt with as provided in this rule as if the claim made had not been substantiated. Provided further, that any order made under this regulation by a President of a Village Tribunal or a Chairman of a Village Committee shall be subject to an appeal by any person aggrieved by such order to the Government Agent, in a district administered by an Assistant Government Agent, to the Assistant Government Agent, whose decision shall be final. Provided further, that such appeal shall be made by a written petition within fourteen days, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, from the date on which the order complained of shall have been made. Provided further, that if any person shall, within six months of the sale, prove his title to the satisfaction of the President or Chairman or Police Magistrate, it shall be competent to the President or Chairman or Police Magistrate and any sum already paid to the officer seizing or informer.

By-LAWS re DAIRIES.

1. Dairymen supplying milk within Local Board limits shall register their names and the situation of their dairies at the office of the Local Board.

2. No dairy shall be allowed in a compound where there is a cesspit or latrine,

or in a position where bad odours wafted from such will reach it.

3. Every dairy compound shall be sufficiently provided with proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be kept flushed; no foul water shall be allowed in a dairy compound.

4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a dairy shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily from the dairy compound.

5. There must be a pure water supply at a convenient distance. No bathing or washing of clothes at a well in the dairy compound shall be allowed, nor shall water for use in the dairy be drawn from any well outside the compound at which bathing or washing of clothes is allowed.

6. No building used as dairy premises shall be used as a dwelling place or for any other purpose whatsoever; such building shall be kept clean at all times.

7. The milk cows must be free from any disease, and all dairymen must be free from cutaneous, contagious, or infectious diseases. No water or other foreign liquid or substance shall be added to the milk.

8. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.

9. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be properly covered, stoppered, or corked, and shall not be carried under the armpit, nor shall the mouth of the bottles be fingered.

10. No person other than employés of licensed dairies shall vend or expose for sale milk within the town, unless they have themselves been licensed by the Board, and every such hawker or itinerant vendor shall bear a distinguishing badge to be

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 29, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 96 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 9 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 20.6, as against 18.9 in the preceding week, 24.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 127 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.2, as against 24.0 in the previous week, 25.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 127 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 15 in the preceding

week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death. - Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Pettah, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as in the previous week, against 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in New Bazaar, 4 in Maradana, 3 in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Slave Island.

Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

3. Four deaths from Smallpox were registered, as against 3 in the previous week. Of these, 3 were in Kotahena and the other in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta, of a non-resident of the city. Thirteen cases were reported, as against 9 in the previous week.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, as in the previous week. Of these, 2 were in San Sebastian and the other in Maradana. Four cases were reported, as against 7 in the previous week. 5. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as in the previous week, against 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, I was in Kotahena and the other (of a non-resident) in the Maradana Hospital.

6. Twelve deaths from Debility were registered, 10 from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Enteritis, 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Worns, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Diarrhæa, and 49 from Other Causes.

There were 2 cases of Chickenpox reported, as against 35 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.0°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.861 in., against 29.828 in. in the preceding week and 29.893 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil., against 0.20 in. in the preceding week and 0.03 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
