SCHEDULE A.

By-laws under Section 19 (2) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 9 of 1901.

1. No person shall pull or draw a jinrickshaw for hire unless he holds a license from the Chairman, Local Board, Negombo. The license shall be in force from the date of its issue until December 31 next following. It shall contain the licensee's name in full and the licensed number, his nationality, the print of his left thumb, and any other particulars which may ensure his complete identification. Every such licensee shall wear in a conspicuous place on his left arm a metal badge bearing his licensed number to be provided by the Board.

2. The Chairman before granting the license shall make, or cause to be made, such inquiry as he may consider necessary regarding the character of the applicant for license, and his physical fitness for the work of pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw, and examine him, or cause him to be examined, as to his knowledge of the rule of the road. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to refuse to grant a license to any applicant, or to cancel, withdraw, or suspend any license granted by him, for such grounds as to him may seem reasonable.

3. Every person pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw for hire shall at any time when required to do so by an officer of police not under the rank of Inspector, Sub-Inspector, and Station House Officer, or by any officer of the Board, furnish proof of his identity by producing his license, or by allowing the impression of his thumb to be taken in such manner and at such places as the said officer may require.

4. It shall be the duty of every person pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw for hire to produce immediately for inspection his license when required to do so by any person who employs him for hire.

5. The number painted, branded, cut, or stamped, under section 11 of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1901, on any vehicle shall not be defaced or covered or concealed from view in any way whatever, and the driver or person in charge of any such vehicle, the painted, branded, cut, or stamped number of which is covered or concealed from view, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. (1) Any licensee of a licensed jinrickshaw who shall suffer it to be pulled or drawn by any other than a licensed person; or

(2) Any person who shall pull or draw a licensed jinrickshaw without having obtained a license, or after it has been cancelled, withdrawn, or suspended, or its renewal refused;

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

7. The Chairman may from time to time appoint places as public stands for unengaged licensed vehicles and separate public stands for engaged licensed vehicles, and may at any time by notice abolish or alter the situation of any such public stand.

8. The driver of any licensed vehicle that is not actually under engagement for hire shall not ply for hire or accept a fare except at a public stand for unengaged licensed vehicles.

9. The driver of a licensed vehicle shall not at any time suffer the same to stand in any street (except for the purpose of setting down or taking passengers) or to loiter in any street, nor shall he obstruct the drivers of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, or wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other licensed vehicle from taking the fare.

SCHEDULE B.

North.—The northern boundary of Etukal Plague Hospital premises.

East.—Cemetery road to junction with Chilaw road, Chilaw road to junction with Cobler's lane, Colombo road to junction with Taladuwa road.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 19, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 116 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 13 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 24·9, as against 21·2 in the preceding week, 24·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 126 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·0, as against 29·6 in the previous week, 29·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 126 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island. Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Three deaths from *Smallpox* were registered. Of these, 2 were in New Bazaar and the other in Kotahena. There were none in the previous week. Twenty-one cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.

4. One death from *Plagus* was registered in Maradana. There were none in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 4 in the previous week.

5. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 9 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Diarrhœa*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Worms*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

6. No deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered. There were 2 in the previous week.

7. Twelve cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 7 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported. There was 1 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·3°, against 81·9° in the preceding week and 80·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·832 in., against 29·839 in. in the preceding week and 29·867 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·09 in., against 0·83 in. in the preceding week and 0·04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
