MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 18, 1914, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 14, 1914.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 20, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
- The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1913 to June 30, 1914, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.

- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
 (c) Health Officer's Report for June.
 (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.
 (e) The Reservoir Readings for June.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 9 of June 22, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the by-laws relating to the regulation of street traffic have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.

Resolved—That the by-laws stand as passed.

(2) Letter No. 10 of July 11 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* rules under the Public Performances Ordinance.

Mr. Beven moved—“That the regulations be adopted, subject to the amendment that the words ‘the Chairman, Municipal Council, or any officer authorized by him’ be substituted for the words ‘Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police,’ in regulations 32 to 35.” Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

(3) Circular No. 45 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary embodying measures for the prevention of the spread of plague.

Resolved—That the circular be referred to the Standing Committee on Sanitation.

(4) Letter No. 6,733 of June 27 from the Senior Sanitary Officer intimating that the Sanitary Inspectors undergoing training will have completed their course on November 26, 1914, when the examination will be held.

Mr. Beven moved—“That Inspectors Morel and Tennakoon be informed that their services will not be required after the end of the year.” Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter of July 16 from the Secretary, Young Men's Christian Association, applying for a site near Wace Park for a building for the Association.

Mr. LaBrooy moved—“That the Young Men's Christian Association be given a lease for 50 years on a nominal rental of Rs. 5 a year of the portion of Municipal land below Wace Park applied for, subject to resumption by the Council on six months notice without compensation if required for Municipal purposes, and subject to the sanction of His Excellency the Governor.” Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved—“That application be made to Government for the establishment of a post office in proximity to the law courts and the business centre of the town.” Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—“That Government be requested to take steps to widen and improve the lower end of Malabar street near its junction with Lady McCarthy's road.” Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.

7. With the leave of the Council, Mr. LaBrooy withdrew the following motion which stood in his name, the Chairman undertaking to inquire into the matter :—

“That a Special Committee be appointed to inquire into the complaints made by Rev. E. E. Taylor, as to the condition of the latrine near the Police Court, and as to the emptying of the contents of dry-earth buckets into the drain near St. Paul's school room.”

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—“In view of the approach of the parahera season and of the large crowd which invariably comes into the town on such occasions, that this Council do take the necessary steps to keep the town latrines and especially the latrine near the Police Court clean, so as to prevent their being a nuisance to the public.” Mr. Weerasooria seconded.—Carried.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—“That in terms of the recommendation of the Sanitary Committee (1) dust bins be supplied to the rate-payers at cost price, (2) dry-earth buckets of the new type be ordered.” Mr. Weerasooria seconded.—It was agreed that the matter lie over, and that in the meantime various firms be asked to tender for bins of approved type.

10. Mr. LaBrooy, with the leave of the Council, withdrew the following motion pending report by the Medical Officer of Health, as to whether the latrine is necessary :—

“That the use of the latrine at the junction of Malabar street and Lady McCarthy's road be discontinued.”

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—“That in view of the present outbreak of sickness in the neighbourhood of Kandy, that the Inspectors be directed to make a house to house visit to all the houses in the crowded localities and in the alleys, and cause the removal of all rubbish of every description from the same.” Mr. Weerasooria seconded.—Carried.

12. Pursuant to notice Mr. Weerasooria moved—“That in view of the urgent need of a house of detention for vagrants in Kandy, the Council do formally decide on the establishment of such a house, and thereafter approach the Government with a request for a suitable building, as suggested by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary in his letter of October 29 last.”

Mr. Pieris suggested that the vagrants here might be sent to the house of detention in Colombo. It was agreed to inquire from the Superintendent of Police, Western Province, whether vagrants would be received from Kandy.

13. Report of the Special Committee appointed at the Meeting of June 20 to consider the question of recovering dues for water consumed in excess of free allowance to the end of the year 1912.

Mr. Beven proposed that the report be adopted. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.

14. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

(1) *Finance and Assessment*.—That the present rate of Re. 1.25 per day paid to the scavenging carts be increased to Re. 1.75 per day.

(2) That the assistant to the assessment clerk be paid Re. 1 a day in addition to his salary for attending to the duties of the Revenue Clerk for days worked.

(3) That the nuisance watcher A. Rajah be paid a bonus of Rs. 15 for attending to the duties of the Supervisor of Conservancy, while the latter was away on sick leave.

(4) That a badge at a cost of Rs. 6 be supplied to the veterinary watcher, Malhamy.

(5) *Municipal Works*.—That the estimate for Rs. 1,524.17 for improvements to road and pavement by the Queen's Hotel in Trincomalee street be passed.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

15. Supplemental Budget No. 1 of 1914.

Resolved—That the Budget be adopted.

16. Mr. R. W. Jonklaas was re-elected a Member of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of July, 1914.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Slaughter-house.—Clean and well kept.

Night Soil Dept.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food Supply.—Good. During the month 483 cattle, 133 buffaloes, 32 sheep, and 528 goats were passed. Ten head of cattle, 4 buffaloes, and 12 goats were rejected. Six livers and 3 lungs of cattle, 11 livers and 1 lung of buffaloes, 1 lung of sheep, and 6 livers and 36 lungs of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. One case of enteric fever and 1 case of chickenpox were reported.
