“THE VOLUNTEER ORDINANCE, 1910.”

IN connection with the organization of the proposed Volunteer Contingent for service out of Ceylon, it is hereby notified that the following amendment to the Rules and Regulations relating to the Ceylon Volunteer Force has been made by the General Officer Commanding the Troops, under the provisions of sections 9 and 12 of “The Volunteer Ordinance, 1910,” and approved by His Excellency the Governor:—

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

K NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in the exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 13 of the Volunteer Ordinance, No. 8 of 1910, do hereby call out for active service, with effect from September 3, 1914, the following portion of a corps of the Ceylon Volunteer Force, namely, that company of the Ceylon Planters' Rifle Corps known as the "Contingent" Company.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen.
