PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim that His Majesty the King, by Royal Proclamation dated September 21, 1914, has declared that during the continuance of war or until further notice the following articles will, notwithstanding anything contained in Article 28 of "The Declaration of London," be treated as Conditional Contraband:—

- (1) Unwrought copper.
- (2) Pig, sheet, or pipe lead.
- (3) Glycerine.
- (4) Ferrochrome.
- (5) Hæmatite iron ore.

- (6) Magnetic iron ore.
- (7) Rubber.
- (8) Raw or rough-tanned hides and skins, not including dressed leather.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of September, in the year off our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen.
