By-law made under Section 4 of Ordinance No. 14 of 1913 by the District School Committee, Galle.

Every parent who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate the by-laws made by the District School Committee, Galle, under: Ordinance No. 8 of 1907, and published in the *Gazette* No. 6,310 of May 21,1909, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 2 for each offence, or in default of payment, imprisonment, rigorous or simple, for a period not exceeding five days; and in case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day. Provided that in the case of a third offence the fine may amount to Rs. 5, or in default of payment, imprisonment, rigorous or simple, for a period not exceeding ten days; in the case of a fourth offence the fine may amount to Rs. 10, or in default of payment, imprisonment, rigorous or simple, for a period not exceeding fourteen days.

- 1. Registration of Dairies.—Every person who intends keeping a dairy shall first apply to the Chairman, Local Board, Matara, for the registration of such dairy, and no person shall keep an unregistered dairy. Such application shall be by petition and addressed to the Chairman, Local Board.
- 2. Upon receipt of such application the Chairman shall after inquiry cause to be registered such dairy or refuse such registration.
- 3. The registration shall be entered in a book kept for the purpose in the office of the Local Board, and a copy of such registration shall be issued to the person so permitted to keep a dairy.
- 4. Registration to be Annual.—Such registration shall be made annually, and such registration shall be refused or allowed by the Chairman, Local Board, at his discretion.
- 5. Cancellation of Registration.—The Chairman, Local Board, is empowered for sufficient reason to cancel any registration already made.
- 6. Registration of Dairymen.—The owner of every dairy shall register every dairymen in his employ. Such registration to be made at the office of the Local Board in a book kept for the purpose.
- 7. Sale of Milk from Registered Dairy.—No person shall sell, hawk, or expose for sale within Local Board limits any cow's milk or buffalo's milk, unless the said milk shall be from a registered dairy.
- 8. Sale of Milk.—No person shall hawk or expose for sale milk in open vessels or bottles.
- 9. Adulterated Milk.—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, hawk about, or expose for sale any cow's milk or buffalo's milk which has been adulterated with water or any foreign substance whatever.
- 10. Sale and Inspection of Milk, &c.—No person shall sell or offer for sale any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless he previously informs the person to whom he sells or offers it that the cream has been removed.
- 11. The Medical Officer or the Local Board Inspector may at any time demand and take for the purpose of analysis samples of any milk which is in possession of a registered dairyman or any person who is found selling, hawking, or exposing milk for sale, and any registered dairyman or other person who refuses to permit samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.
- 12. In taking samples of milk the Medical Officer or Local Board Inspector shall take three samples, and shall at once seal them in the presence of the registered dairyman or other person from whom they are taken, and shall deliver one to such registered dairyman or other person, send the second to a qualified analyst, and the third to the Government Analyst.
- 13. Printed and numbered cards, in such form as the Chairman shall from time to time direct, and signed by the Sccretary, shall be issued annually to every registered dairyman on his application. No person shall sell, hawk, or expose milk for sale unless he has in his possession a card issued for the current year to a registered dairyman, and unless such dairyman's name is still on the register at the time of the sale, hawking, or exposing of the milk for sale. Should such person fail to produce on demand by any Local Board or Police Officer such a card for inspection he shall be guilty of an offence.
- 14. Should any samples of milk taken under the provision of the preceding by-laws prove to be adulterated, the person in whose possession they were found shall be guilty of an offence.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 26, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 107 (2 Europeans, 20 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 20 Moors, 8 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 22.9, as against 24.9 in the preceding week, 19.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 113 (7 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.2, as against 27.0 in the previous week, 27.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 113 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year. Of these, 12 were in Maradana (including 6 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in St. Paul's, 1 in Fort, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 5 in St. Paul's, 3 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. One death was registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana of non-residents in hospitals and the other in Kotahena. There were none in the previous week.
- 4. Two deaths from Smallpox were registered (in Maradana), as against 3 in the previous week. Twenty-five cases were reported, as against 21 in the previous week.
- 5. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered (in San Sebastian), as against 1 in the previous week. Eight cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

- 6. Fourteen deaths from Debility were registered, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Enteritis, 3 from Dysentery, 3 from Tetanus, 3 from Worms, and 33 from Other Causes.
- 7. Five cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 12 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 82.3° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.868 in., against 29.832 in. in the preceding week and 29.858 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.59 in., against 0.09 in. in the preceding week and 0.18 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
