By-laws referred to.

General Purposes of Conservancy.

All owners, tenants, or occupiers of lands within the limits of the Local Board shall keep the same clean and free from all refuse and rubbish, and shall remove or bury all discarded tins, barrels, coconut shells, or other receptacles which are likely to hold water and form breeding places for mosquitoes.

It shall not be lawful for any one without the written permission of the Chairman to dig hollows or borrowpits, or to excavate earth from any land within the limits of the Local Board in such a manner as to allow the accumulation of stagnant water.

It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of land within the limits of the Local Board to fill up or drain all hollows, holes, or other places where water can collect and stagnate on the receipt of a written notice from the Chairman within fourteen days of the receipt of such notice.

4. The owner or tenant of every livery stable, cattle stall, cattle halting place, or gala shall have the same covered with a tiled or iron roof and paved with brick, stone, concrete, cement, or asphalt, and provided with suitable paved or cemented drains for conveying the urine and washings into a covered receptacle, constructed in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, the contents of which shall be daily removed at the expense of such owner or tenant and disposed of so that no nuisance is caused thereby. Every such stable, cattle stall, halting place, or gala shall be daily washed and always kept clean, and whitewashed at least once in three months. All dung and dry refuse shall be disposed of as in the manner provided by sections 5 and 6.

5. It shall be the duty of all persons who have cattle or other manure, refuse, or sweepings in or upon their premises daily to deposit such cattle or other manure, refuse, or sweepings in trenches at least 18 inches broad by at least 18 inches deep made for the purpose, and to cover it or them over with earth to a depth of not less than 4 inches.

Whenever it shall appear to the Board to be necessary or expedient for the benefit of the health of the town that cattle or other manure, refuse, or sweepings should not be allowed to remain in or upon any premises as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Board by notice in writing to require the owner or occupant of such premises to remove such cattle or other manure, refuse, or sweepings from such premises within such time and for such period and to such place as shall be specified in such notice, and dispose of the same by burial in trenches or such other manner as may be prescribed in such notice; and it shall be the duty of such owner or occupier of such premises to dispose of such cattle or other manure, refuse, or sweepings as directed in such notice.

7. Any person blocking up or damming any stream, drain, channel, or ela shall be guilty of an offence.

8. Where the Local Board has made, constructed, or has commenced to make or construct any public drain intended to improve the sanitation of the town, it shall be the duty of all owners or occupants of any compounds or lands through which such drain passes or shall pass, if so required by the Board, to regulate (reduce or raise) the levels of such compounds or lands in such manner as may be directed by the Board in order to insure the proper drainage of such lands.

9. If any owner or occupant refuses or neglects to carry out such work when so required by written notice within the time prescribed by the Board, it shall be lawful for the Board to execute such work, and to take steps under the Ordinance to recover the cost thereof, or such part of the cost as the Board may by resolution decide to recover.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. Dairymen supplying milk within Local Board limits shall register their names and the situation of their dairies at the office of the Local Board.
- 2. No dairy shall be allowed in a compound where there is a cesspit or latrine, or in a position where bad odours from such cesspit or latrine will reach it.
- 3. Every dairy compound shall be sufficiently provided with proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be kept flushed. No foul water shall be allowed in a dairy compound.
- 4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a dairy shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily from the dairy compound.
- 5. There must be a pure water supply at a convenient distance. No bathing or washing of clothes at a well in the dairy compound shall be allowed, nor shall water for use in the dairy be drawn from any well outside the compound at which bathing or washing of clothes is allowed.
- 6. No building used as dairy premises shall be used as a dwelling place or for any other purpose whatsoever; such building shall be kept clean at all times.
- 7. The milch cows must be free from any disease, and all dairymen must be free from cutaneous, contagious or infectious disease. No water or other foreign liquid or substance shall be added to the milk.
- 8. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.
- 9. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be properly covered, stoppered, or corked, and shall not be carried under the armpit, nor shall the mouth of bottles be fingered.

Amended Regulations for the Registration of Medical Practitioners.

The following diplomas and certificates will be entertained by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College in applications by persons to obtain certificates under section 13 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1905:-

(a) License in Medicine and Surgery (Ceylon).

- (b) Any medical qualification which is capable of being registered, under the Medical Acts of Great Britain and Ireland, provided that this qualification has been obtained from one of the examining bodies of Great Britain or Ireland.
- (c) The Medical Degrees and the License in Medicine and Surgery of-
 - (1) Madras University.*
 - (2) Calcutta University.
 - (3) Bombay University.
 - (4) Allahabad University.
 - (5) Punjab University.

(d) The Medical Degrees of the Universities of the British Colonies.

- (e) In the case of persons who do not hold a Diploma or License to practise

 Medicine and Surgery, applications must be supported (1) by certificates
 from two practitioners already registered under the Ordinance and
 qualified for registration by possession of a Degree or Diploma which is accepted as a qualification for registration to the effect that the applicant possesses the requisite knowledge and skill for efficient practise as a Medical Practitioner; (2) by an affidavit that the applicant has practised Medicine and Surgery in Ceylon for not less than ten years. Applications by such persons will only be entertained if made on or before December 31, 1907, and certificates under section 13 of the Medical Registration Ordinance will only be granted in cases where the Council is satisfied that it is desirable in the interests of the public the same should be given.
- * The L. M. & S. Degree of the University of Madras is not recognized as qualifying for registration under "The Medical Registration Ordinance, 1905," unless in the case of an inhabitant of Ceylon, or person domiciled in Ceylon, a full or part course of study necessary for the degree was taken up before the issue of these amended regulations. For the purposes of this amendment a "part course of study necessary for the degree" shall be considered to mean that a person claiming registration shall have been registered as a medical student of the Madras University prior to the issue of these amended regulations.

"THE INSECT PEST AND QUARANTINE ORDINANCE, No. 5 of 1901."

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be the duty of the person in charge of a tea estate or tea gardon infested, or suspected to be infested, by Xyleborus fornicatus, E.ch. (Shot-hole Borer of Tea) to notify in writing to the Director of Agriculture the presence or supposed presence of this insect on his or her tea estate or tea garden.

2. The Director of Agriculture, or person authorized by him, shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to all tea estates or tea gardens to determine

whether X. fornicatus, Eich., is present.

3. A register of infested estates and gardens shall be kept by the Department of Agriculture.

4. When the Director of Agriculture shall have determined that Xyleborus fornicatus, Eich., is present on any tea estate or tea garden, he shall by a notification published in the Government Gazette declare such estate or garden to be in quarantine.

5. No person, firm, or corporation shall remove tea plants or parts of tea plants (other than leaf for manufacture or tea seed) from an estate or garden which has been declared to be in quarantine, nor receive tea plants or parts of tea plants from such estate or garden, unless and until a permit has been issued therefor by the Director

of Agriculture. 6. No person, firm, or corporation shall ship by, or offer for shipment to, any common carrier, nor shall any person, firm, corporation, or common carrier transport or receive for transportation any tea plants or parts of tea plants (other than leaf and seed), unless the case, box, package, crate, bale, or bundle thereof shall be plainly and correctly marked to show the nature of the contents, the estate or garden where the same was grown, the name and address of the shipper, owner, or person shipping or forwarding the same, and the name and address of the consignee. T is hereby notified that a license to import fuse and other explosives into Ceylon during the current year has been issued to Messra. Clark, Young & Co., of Colombo.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 17, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (3 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 5 Tamils, 8 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 22·1, as against 20·8 in the preceding week, 22·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 106 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22·7, as against 24·9 in the previous week, 25·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 106 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, against 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eight deaths from Philisis were registered, as against 20 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kotahena, I in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana of a non-resident in hospital.

2. Seven deaths from Smallpox were registered, as against 8 in the previous week. Of these, 5 were in Maradana, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta. Nine cases were reported, as against 18 in the previous week.

3. Six deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Slave Island. Four deaths from Pneumonia were registered.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week. Of these, 2 were in Maradana and 1 in New Bazaar. Four cases were reported, as in the previous week.

5. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in New Bazaar and the other in Maradana of a non-resident in hospital.

6. Eleven deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 5 from Enteritis, 4 from Worms, 1 from Diarrhea, 1 from Dysentery, 1 from Tetanus, and 43 from Other Causes.

7. Twenty-two cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 26 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80 2°, against 79 7° in the preceding week and 80 6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.863 in., as in the preceding week against 29.874 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.88 in, against 3.22 in. in the preceding week and 0.94 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
