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PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain, and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, September 30, 1914, in the Fifth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fifth, it was appointed that the said Letters Patent should be proclaimed at such place or places within the said Island of Ceylon as the Governor shall think fit:

Now therefore We, the Governor of the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, do hereby proclaim the afore-said Letters Patent at Colombo, this Eleventh day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen.

LETTERS PATENT passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, in regard to the dismissal and suspension of Public Officers in the Island of Ceylon.

Dated 30th September, 1914.

Recites Clause XV. of Letters Patent of 24th November, 1910.

Substitutes fresh clause for Clause XV. of Letters Patent of 24th November, 1910.

Dismissal of public officers.

Suspension of public officers.

Power reserved to His Majesty to revoke, alter, or amend the present Letters Patent.

Publication of Letters Patent.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting.

WHEREAS by the Fifteenth clause of certain Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the Twenty-fourth day of November, 1910, constituting the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Island of Ceylon, with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, provision was made in regard to the dismissal and suspension of public officers in Our said Island:

And whereas We are minded to make fresh provision in lieu thereof:

I.—Now, therefore, We do hereby revoke the aforesaid Fifteenth clause of the aforesaid Letters Patent of the Twenty-fourth day of November, 1910, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder. And We do declare Our will and pleasure and direct and enjoin that the aforesaid Letters Patent shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if, instead of the said Fifteenth clause, the following clause had been inserted therein:—

“XV.—The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss any public officer not appointed by virtue of a Warrant from Us, whose pensionable emoluments do not exceed three thousand rupees or two hundred pounds sterling a year, according as the said emoluments are fixed with reference to rupees or pounds sterling, as the case may be, provided that in all such cases, except those in which the officer has been convicted on a criminal charge, the grounds of intended dismissal are definitely stated in writing and communicated to the officer in order that he may have full opportunity of exculpating himself, and that the matter is investigated by the Governor with the aid of the head for the time being of the department in which the officer is serving.

“The Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, dismiss, without taking proceedings for suspension, any public officer not appointed by virtue of a Warrant from Us in receipt of pensionable emoluments exceeding the sums hereinbefore mentioned, who may have been convicted on a criminal charge.

“The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, likewise suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office in the Island, whether appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from Us, or in Our name, or by any other mode of appointment. Such suspension shall continue and have effect only until Our pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor. If the suspension is confirmed by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, the Governor shall forthwith cause the officer to be so informed, and thereupon his office shall become vacant. In proceeding to any such suspension, the Governor is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by Our Instructions as aforesaid.”

II.—And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power and authority, from time to time, to revoke, alter, or amend these Our Letters Patent as to Us or them shall seem meet.

III.—And We do further direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be read and proclaimed at such place or places within Our said Island as the Governor shall think fit.

Guatemala Extradition Order in Council, 1914. (Amendment of Article 10 of Treaty of July 4, 1885.)

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of September, 1914.

Present :

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 4th day of July, 1885, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the Republic of Guatemala, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the 26th November, 1886:

And whereas a Protocol was concluded on the 30th day of May, 1914, between the British and Guatemalan Governments amending the provisions of Article 10 of the said Treaty, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

Additional Protocol to the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala.

The Government of His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the Republic of Guatemala, being desirous of rendering more efficacious the provisions of Article 10 of the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala of the 4th July, 1885, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.—The text of Article 10 of the Extradition Treaty of the 4th July, 1885, is amended by the substitution of the words “sixty days” for the words “thirty days” in the last sentence of paragraph 1.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Protocol, and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done, in duplicate, at Guatemala City, the 30th day of May, 1914.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 14th day of September, 1914, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Guatemala under and in accordance with the said Treaty as amended by the said Protocol above set forth.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I. of Chapter 155 of “The Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906,” and entitled “An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals,” shall continue in force there, and no longer.

4. Tenders should be marked (1) "Tender for the Nuwara Eliya Depot Supply," (2) "Tender for improving an existing Road, Nuwara Eliya Division," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, December 1, 1914.

5. TENDERS are hereby invited for the conveyance of mails by motor coach from July 1, 1915 (or such earlier date as may be agreed upon between the successful tenderer and the Postmaster-General) between—

Service (A): Bandarawela Post Office and Batticaloa Post Office once daily each way.

Service (B): Bandarawela Post Office and Badulla Post Office once daily each way.

2. For service (A) tenders are invited for (a) 5 years or (b) 10 years, and should show separately the amounts tendered for the sections—

- (1) Bandarawela to Badulla;
- (2) Badulla and Batticaloa;

it being understood that on the opening for traffic of the Bandarawela-Badulla section of the railway the contract, so far as affecting the service (A) (1) between Bandarawela and Badulla, will be liable to termination after one month's notice to the contractor. Tenders for service (B) should be for 5 years on a similar condition.

3. The hours of arrival and departure of the motor coaches will be fixed from time to time by the Postmaster-General. For service (A) the time table will at first be approximately that of the existing Government motor service. For service (B) the hours will be those suitable for handling the mails transported by the trains at present due to arrive at and leave Bandarawela at 6.40 P.M. and 6.30 A.M., respectively.

4. The successful tenderer for service (A) will be allowed, should he desire it, the free use of the Government motor garage buildings at Bibile, on condition that he will maintain the same in good repair, and Government may re-enter without notice if the contractor terminates his contract by default or otherwise.

5. Tenderers should state whether they are prepared to take over the existing Government motor rolling stock used on this route, and if so, at what valuation. Details can be obtained from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway.

6. The contractor will be required to provide such number of motor coaches as will, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, be necessary for the services, and every such motor coach before being employed in the service will be subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General.

7. The cars provided shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) When fully equipped and loaded with a weight of one ton, in addition to equipment, no car shall have a weight of more than *two tons* on any one axle, nor shall any car when loaded and equipped weigh more than three tons.

(b) The extreme width of the cars shall be 6 ft. 6 in., the minimum diameter of wheels over tyres shall be 32 in. The

cars must be able to turn in a circle of 36 feet diameter. The wheels must be rubber-tyred.

(c) Each car running on service (A) between Bandarawela and Lunugala shall be capable of carrying 7 passengers, and each car between Lunugala and Batticaloa 5 passengers, with baggage, at the rate of a half hundredweight to each passenger, in addition to the driver and conductor. On service (B) accommodation shall be provided for at least 4 passengers, with baggage at the rate of half a hundredweight to each passenger, in addition to the driver and conductor.

(d) Each car shall have a special locked receptacle for the mails of suitable size. The lockers on the present Government cars contain 54 cubic feet on the hill section cars and 44 cubic feet on the flat section cars, and lockers of cars provided for service (A) must be of at least these capacities respectively, and of cars for service (B) of at least 36 cubic feet.

(e) The cars when loaded must be able to work easily at a speed of 12 miles an hour on the flat, and be capable of ascending and descending gradients at a speed of 8 miles an hour. The speed must not exceed 15 miles per hour at any part of the journey, and must be reduced to 4 miles per hour over timber platform bridges.

(f) The cars must be so covered as to give sufficient protection against sun or rain.

8. Security to the amount of Rs. 10,000 will be required in cash for service (A) and Rs. 1,000 for service (B).

9. Tenders for above services must be accompanied by a scale of the rates which it is intended to charge the public during the period of the service for the conveyance of passengers, luggage, and parcels, and the quantity of luggage per passenger allowed to be conveyed free. The successful tenderer shall not during the period of his contract, without the express permission of Government, increase the rates charged for the conveyance of passengers, luggage, and parcels above the amount shown in the scale, or reduce the allowance of free luggage below the amount therein stated.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 7, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 104 (12 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 18 Moors, and 2 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 22.3, as against 18.0 in the preceding week, 21.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 184* (1 European, 9 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 44 Tamils, 22 Moors, 7 Malays, and Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.0, as against 27.2 in the previous week, 30.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 184 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-four deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Kollupitiya, 6 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 in St. Paul's, 3 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island.

* This includes 44 deaths in the Lunatic Asylum in 1913, which escaped registration at the time. The death-rate is calculated exclusive of these events.

2. Six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week. Of these, 3 were in Maradana and 1 in San Sebastian. Three cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.

4. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital) and 2 in Kotahena.

5. Two deaths from *Smallpox* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week. Of these, 1 was in Slave Island and the other of a non-resident of the city in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta. Fifteen cases were reported, as against 4 in the previous week.

6. Twenty-six deaths from *Debility* were registered, 13 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Dysentery*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Worms*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Tetanus*, and 69 from *Other Causes*.

7. Eight cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 30 in the previous week. One case of *Measles* was reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·0°, against 79·4° in the preceding week and 79·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·823 in., against 29·857 in. in the preceding week and 29·868 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·53 in., against 2·85 in. in the preceding week and 2·22 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
