VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 21, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 13 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 23·2, as against 19·9 in the preceding week, 22·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·5, as against 28·5 in the previous week, 30·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana of non-residents in hospitals, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered in Maradana, as against 5 in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 9 in the previous week.

4. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered. There were 5 in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 7 in the previous week.

5. No deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered. There were 3 in the previous week.

6. Fourteen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 13 from *Debility*, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Dysentery*, and 53 from *Other Causes*.

7. Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 19 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·9°, against 80·3° in the preceding week and 79·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·792 in., against 29·829 in. in the preceding week and 29·905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·71 in., against 3 in. in the preceding week and 0·28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
