"THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908."

T is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, No. 35 of 1908, and section 5 of "The Ceylon Telegraph (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1914," has been pleased to make the following rules to regulate the use of wireless telegraphs.

#### RULES REFERRED TO

- 1. Any person desirous of obtaining a license for the establishment of a wireless telegraph station, or the installation or working of any apparatus for wireless telegraphy, in any place in the Colony, or on board any British ship registered in the Colony, must apply in writing to the Colonial Secretary. Such application must contain full particulars
  - (a) Of the place or ship in respect of which a license is sought;
  - (b) Of the nature of the apparatus which it is desired and proposed to instal and work; and
  - (c) Of the purposes for which the installation is intended to be utilized.
  - The following shall be the fees payable on the grant of licenses:-

(a) For a license under section 4 (2) for a land station	 5
(b) For a license under section 4 (2) for a ship station	 5
(c) For an experimental license under section 4 (3)	 $\mathbf{Free}$

- All apparatus for wireless telegraphy on board a merchant ship, whether British or foreign, in the waters of the Colony, shall be worked in such a way as not
  - (a) Naval signalling; or
  - (b) The working of any wireless telegraph station lawfully established, installed, or worked in the Colony or in waters thereof, and in particular the said apparatus shall be so worked as not to interrupt or interfere with the transmission of any messages between wireless telegraph stations established as aforesaid on land and wireless telegraph stations established on ships at sea.
- 4. In these regulations "naval signalling" means signalling by means of any system of wireless telegraphy between two or more ships of His Majesty's Navy, between ships of His Majesty's Navy and Naval Stations, or between a ship of His Majesty's Navy or a Naval Station and any other wireless telegraph station, whether on shore or on any ship.

5. No apparatus for wireless telegraphy on board a merchant ship shall be worked or used while such ship is in any harbour, port, or bay of the Colony, except with the special or general permission of the Postmaster-General.

6. (i.) If at any time in the opinion of the Governor an emergency has arisen in which it is expedient for the public service that His Majesty's Government should have control over the transmission of messages by wireless telegraphy on board merchant ships, and notice to that effect is published by the Postmaster-General, after the publication of such notice and until further notice the use of wireless telegraphy on board merchant ships, whether British or foreign, whilst in the waters of the Colony, shall be subject to such rules as may be made by the Governor, and such rules may prohibit or regulate such use in all cases, or in such cases as may be deemed desirable.

(ii.) Such notice as aforesaid shall be published in the Ceylon Government Gazette, and in such other manner, if any, as to the Postmaster-General may seem fit.

- 7. For the purpose of any proceedings under these regulations the master or person being or appearing to be in command or charge of any ship shall be deemed to have authorized and to be responsible for the use or working of any apparatus on board such ship.
- Any summons or other document in any proceedings under these regulations shall be deemed to have been duly served on the person to whom the same is addressed by being left on board the ship on which the offence is charged to have been committed with the person being or appearing to be in command or charge of
- These regulations shall not apply to the use of wireless telegraphy for the purpose of making or answering signals of distress.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 28, 1914.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 110 (7 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1914, viz., 243,089) was 23.6, as against 23.2 in the preceding week, 24.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.4 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 145 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31 1, as against 25.5 in the previous week, 30.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.0 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths. - Of the 145 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, against 43 in the corresponding week of the previous year and 31 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Ten deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospital), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in San Sebastian.

- 2. Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Wellawatta. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Five deaths from Plague were registered, as against 2 in the previous week. Of these, 3 were in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Maradana. Seven cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.
- Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2
- were in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. No deaths were registered in the previous week.

  5. Three deaths from Smallpox were registered. Of these, 1 was in Maradana, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta, of a non-resident of the city. Fifteen cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week. No deaths were registered in the previous week.
- Fifteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 12 from Enteritis, 11 from Debility, 5 from Worms, 4 from Tetanus, 2 from Dysentery, 1 from Diarrhæa, and 63 from Other Causes.
- 7. Five cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 13 in the previous week. One case of Measles was reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.3°, against 79.9° in the preceding week and 80.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.843 in., against 29.792 in. in the preceding week and 29.826 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.33 in., against 3.71 in. in the preceding week and 7.50 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
