The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," it was enacted that in any case in which any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon had been, or should be thereafter erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British possession by or with the consent of the Legislative authority of such possession, Her Majesty might by Order in Council fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the owner, or master of every ship which passes the same, or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty might deem reasonable, and might in like manner from time to time increase, diminish, or repeal such dues, and that from the time specified in such Order for the commencement of the dues thereby fixed, increased, or diminished, the same should be leviable throughout Her Majesty's dominions in manner thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 22nd day of May, 1883, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the dues to be paid in respect of ships passing and deriving benefit from the lights exhibited from the Great Basses Rock, the Little Basses Rock, and Minicoy Island should be those specified in the schedules attached to such Order in Council:

And whereas by the Basses Lights Acts, 1869 and 1872, and the Public Works Loan Act, 1881, it is provided that so long as any money is due to the Public Works Loan Commissioners on account of any loan under those Acts the dues payable in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, or the Minicoy Lighthouse, shall be altered only with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that all advances made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners for the purposes mentioned in the said Acts have been repaid, and that it is expedient that the amount of the dues hereinbefore referred to should be varied in manner hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the first day of July, 1892, or from the time of the receipt of notice of this Order, if that be later, by the officers authorised to collect light dues, the dues heretofore levied in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and Minicoy Lighthouse under the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of May, 1883, shall be subject to an abatement or discount of 50 per centum.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to empower the Ceylon Government to raise Four Million Rupees for the construction of Railways and other Public Works.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient for the Ceylon Government to borrow, upon the security of the general revenue of the Colony, a sum not exceeding four million rupees for the construction of railways and other public works, and the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for and in connection with such railways and other public works: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Commencement.

1 This Ordinance shall come into operation on such day as the Governor shall by Proclamation appoint.

Power to borrow money not exceeding Rs. 4,000,000.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor, in addition to the money already borrowed under any other Ordinance, to borrow upon debentures or stock notes, or partly by debentures and partly by stock notes to be issued by the Government, any sum or sums of money not exceeding four million rupees for the purposes specified in this Ordinance. Provided that the amount to be borrowed on Government stock notes shall in no case exceed two million rupees.

Principal moneys and interest charged on the revenue of Ceylon.

3 All debentures, Government stock notes, and coupons issued under this Ordinance, and the principal moneys and interest respectively secured thereby, shall be charged on, and be payable out of, the general revenue and assets of the Island.

Application of money borrowed.

4 The money borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be applied exclusively in and about the construction of railways and other public works, and in and about the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for and in connection with such railways and other public works.

Borrowing on debentures.

5 When the borrowing shall be upon debentures, such debentures shall be signed on behalf of the Government of Ceylon by the treasurer of the Island for the time being, or by such other public officer or officers as may be appointed by the Governor for the purpose; and public notice in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of such appointment shall be held sufficient evidence thereof.

Debentures.

6 Each debenture issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be for a sum of not less than one thousand rupees, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum, payable half-yearly in manner hereinafter provided.

Interest coupons.

7 The interest upon the principal secured by each debenture shall run from the day named in that behalf in the debenture and shall be paid half-yearly, and there shall be attached to each debenture coupons for the payment of the interest to become due in each half-year. The coupons shall be sufficient in number to provide for the payment of the interest, either during the whole period for which the debenture has to run or for such limited period as the Governor may determine.

Form of debentures and coupons.

8 The debentures and the coupons thereto may be in such form as the Governor may direct or approve.

Debentures and coupons transferable by delivery.

9 Each debenture and all right to and in respect of the principal money secured thereby, and each coupon and all right of interest payable in respect thereof, shall be transferable by delivery, and the principal moneys secured by such debenture and the interest payable in respect of such coupon shall be payable in Colombo at the treasury.

Registration of debentures.

10 Each debenture shall, before being issued, be registered with the date thereof in a register book to be kept by the treasurer for that purpose, and upon being so registered shall be endorsed by him as registered.

Government may contract.

11 It shall be lawful for the Governor, for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, to appoint any agent to sell the debentures or any number thereof, or to contract with any person or any body politic or corporate (for a commission or a reward, but free of all other costs and charges to the Colony), for the issue of the debentures or any number thereof, or if to the said Governor it shall appear expedient to sell the whole or any number of such debentures to any person or any body politic or corporate for a price not below par.

Mode of providing for payment of interest and principal of debentures.

12 So long as any of the debentures remain outstanding, the Governor shall in each half-year appropriate out of the general revenue and assets of the Island a sum equal to one half-year's interest on the whole of the debentures previously issued, including any which may have been redeemed, and shall authorise the treasurer to hold that sum so as to enable him to pay thereout the then current half-year's interest on the day when it falls due. After the expiration of two years from the day on which the first of the debentures is issued, and so long thereafter as any of the debentures remain outstanding, the Governor shall, in each half-year ending as aforesaid, appropriate out of the revenue and assets of the Colony an additional sum equal to one-half per cent. on the total nominal amount of all debentures issued on or before the first day of that half-year, including any which may have been redeemed, and authorise the treasurer to hold that sum for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

Application of moneys paid to treasurer.

13 The treasurer shall, subject to the approval of the Governor, place and keep the moneys so entrusted to him, or so much thereof as may not be required for immediate payments in any Imperial, Indian, or Colonial Government security or securities, and shall hold all such moneys and the accumulations thereon in trust, to apply them, in the first place, in payment of the interest for the current half-year upon the debentures for the time being outstanding, and in the next place in the formation of a sinking fund.

Application of sinking fund.

14 The sinking fund shall be applied, in the first place, to payment of all expenses of, or incidental to, the redemption of debentures, including the charges of the notary public attending at any drawing thereof, and the costs and expenses of all notices required by this Ordinance to be given; and in the next place, and subject to the aforesaid payments, in repayment of the principal moneys for the time being secured by the debentures.

Debentures to be redeemed by purchase or by annual drawings.

15 The debentures shall, at the option of the treasurer, subject to the approval of the Governor for the time being, be redeemed either by purchase in the open market or by annual drawings, and subject to the aforesaid payments the sum to be applied annually to such redemption shall correspond as nearly as may be to, but not exceed, the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the sinking fund.

Appointment of day for drawing of debentures.

16 After the expiration of two years from the day on which the first of the debentures is issued, and so long thereafter as any of the debentures remain outstanding and unsatisfied, the treasurer shall in every year, unless the whole amount of the money applicable in that year to the redemption of debentures has been applied in the purchase thereof, appoint a day in that year for the drawing by lot of the debentures to be redeemed.

17 If a day is appointed for drawing, the treasurer shall give, by advertisement in three at least of the local newspapers, not less than fifteen days' previous notice, specifying the day on which and the time and place at which the drawing will take place, and the nominal amount of the debentures to be redeemed at that drawing.

18 On the day and at the time and place so specified the treasurer shall hold a meeting at which the holder of any debenture may, if he thinks fit, be present, and shall then in the presence of such debenture holders (if any) as may attend, and of a notary public, draw by lot out of the whole number of debentures for the time being outstanding debentures of the specified nominal amount.

19 The treasurer shall thereupon declare the distinguishing numbers of the debentures drawn for redemption, and shall as soon as may be, by advertisement in at least three of the local newspapers, specify the numbers and appoint a day (not being later as to each debenture than the day on which the current half-year's interest thereon is payable) in which the principal moneys secured by the debentures so distinguished will be repaid.

20 On the day so appointed the treasurer shall, at his office in Colombo, on demand pay to the holders of the debentures drawn for repayment the principal moneys secured by those debentures, with all interest payable thereon up to that date. Provided that it shall be lawful for the treasurer, in the event of any coupon or coupons not being delivered up to him, together with the debenture in manner provided by section 22, to deduct from any payment the value of the coupon or coupons not so delivered up to him. Provided also that where it shall appear to the treasurer upon oath or otherwise to his satisfaction that any such coupon or coupons has or have been destroyed by reason of accident, mistake, or misfortune, and without any wilful design or intention to defraud the Government, then and in every such case it shall be lawful for the treasurer, with the previous sanction and authority of the Government, to pay the holder of the debenture the whole of the principal moneys secured by such debenture, with all interest due and payable thereon, on receiving from the holder of such debenture security of such nature and amount as the Governor may determine.

21 From and after the day appointed for the repayment of any debenture all interest on the principal moneys secured thereby shall cease and determine, whether payment of the principal has or has not been demanded.

22 Upon the repayments of the principal moneys secured by any debenture, such debenture, with all the coupons thereunto belonging, shall be delivered up to the treasurer, to be by him cancelled and forwarded to the auditor-general of the Island. Any debenture redeemed by purchase shall be likewise so cancelled and forwarded.

23 No moneys applied in redemption of a debenture shall be re-borrowed, and no debenture shall be issued in respect of, or in substitution for, any cancelled debenture.

24 When the borrowing shall be upon Government stock notes, such Government stock notes shall be issued by the treasurer at par, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum.

25 All the Government stock notes which may be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be redeemable at par on a date to be expressed on the face of the note, such date not being later than twenty years from the date of issue. From and after which date all interest on the principal moneys secured thereby shall cease and determine, whether payment of the principal shall have been demanded or not.

26 Each Government stock note issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be for a sum of not more than five hundred and not less than twenty-five rupees, and shall run for a period of four years, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum payable yearly.

Payment of interest on presentation at kachchéri.

27 The interest upon the principal secured by each Government stock note shall run from the day named in the note, and shall be paid yearly on the presentation of the note at any kachchéri, and there shall be attached to each note coupons for the payment of the interest to become due each year. The coupons shall be four in number, and on the first presentation the government agent or assistant government agent shall himself cut off and retain as a voucher for the debit in his accounts the coupon or portion of the note relating to the first payment of interest, and on subsequent presentation he shall similarly cut off and retain each succeeding coupon. On presentation of the final or principal portion of the note he shall retain it and issue to the holder a new note, which shall similarly run for a fresh series of four years, and shall be dealt with in a similar manner as the original note, unless the period named by the Governor for repayment shall have elapsed.

Form of Government stock notes and coupons.

28 The Government stock notes and the coupons attached thereto shall be in such form as the Governor by notification in the *Government Gazette* may direct or appoint.

Government stock notes transferable by delivery.

29 Each Government stock note and all right to, or in respect of, the principal money or interest secured thereby shall be transferable by delivery without any endorsement, and the principal moneys secured by such note and the interest payable in respect thereof shall be payable at any kachchéri.

Mode of providing for payment of interest and principal of Government stock notes.

30 So long as any of the Government stock notes shall remain unredeemed, the Governor shall in each year appropriate out of the general revenue and assets of the Island a sum equal to one year's interest on the whole of such Government stock notes, and shall authorise the treasurer to hold that sum so as to enable him to pay thereout the interest on the day when it falls due. The Governor shall further appropriate out of the said revenue and assets in each year an additional sum for the formation of a sinking fund equal to one and a half per centum on the total amount of such Government stock notes.

Sinking fund to be invested.

31 The amount so appropriated for the formation of a sinking fund shall be invested in the names of the auditor-general and of the treasurer, who shall from time to time invest the dividends or produce arising from such investments, so that the same may accumulate by way of compound interest and be applied towards the final extinction of the debt.

Securities in which sinking fund is to be invested.

32 All sums paid to the account of such sinking fund and the interest thereof shall be invested in Imperial Indian or Colonial Government security or securities at the discretion of the Governor.

Any deficiency in sinking fund to be made good out of general revenue and assets.

33 In case the said sinking fund shall be insufficient to provide the necessary funds for the redemption of the Government stock notes when it shall become due, the deficiency shall be made good out of the general revenue and assets of the Island.

Expenses to be paid out of sinking fund.

34 All expenses of or incidental to the management of the sinking fund, or to the repayments of the principal moneys borrowed on the Government stock notes, shall be paid out of the sinking fund.

Governor to fix rate of interest from time to time.

35 It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, before the issue of any debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them under the provisions of this Ordinance, to determine the rate of interest to be paid in respect of such issue of debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them, provided that the rate of interest to be paid in respect of such debentures and Government stock notes, or either of them, shall in no case exceed four per centum per annum.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend "The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Ordinance, 1876."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Tésawalamai, or Customs of the Malabar Inhabitants of the old Province of Jaffna, and to enact that "The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Ordinance, 1876," shall apply to Tamils of the Northern Province who are or may be subject to the Tésawalamai: It is hereby enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Amendment Ordinance, 1892."

Repeal of Regulation No. 18 of 1806.

2 The Regulation No. 18 of 1806, intituled "A Regulation for the Security of Property and the establishment of a due Police in the District of Jaffnapatam and its Dependencies," shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Ordinance No. 15 of 1876 extended to Jaffna.

3 "The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Ordinance, 1876," shall extend and apply to Tamils of the Northern Province who are or may be subject to the Tésawalamai; and in section 2 of "The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Ordinance, 1876," the words "or to Tamils of the Northern Province who are or may become subject to the Tésawalamai" shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

The Ordinance not to affect right acquired under marriages solemnised before the proclamation of this Ordinance.

4 The respective right of any husband and wife with regard to property or status arising under or by virtue of any marriage solemnised before the proclamation of this Ordinance, and all rights which any other person may have acquired or become entitled to under or by virtue of any such marriage, shall be governed by such law as would have become applicable thereto if this Ordinance had not been proclaimed.

Operation.

5 This Ordinance shall come into operation at such time as the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint.

Japan—Nipon—South Coast.—Goza Harbour and Approaches—Uncharted dangers.

The following Notice to Mariners (No. 164 of 1892) issued by the British Admiralty is republished:—

(1) A recent small scale plan of Goza harbour having been received from the Japanese Government, which shows several dangers not charted on Admiralty plan No. 994, mariners are cautioned not to use Goza harbour without a pilot until a new large scale plan is published.

The following caution has been placed on Admiralty plan No. 994: "Many uncharted dangers in Goza harbour."

(2) A rock with 15 ft. water on it has been discovered outside outer reef, southward of Goza harbour, from which Kami Sima bears E.N.E., distant 3 cables, and several other dangers have been found between outer reef and the shore.

Vessels are consequently warned that they should give these outer dangers even a wider berth than usual.

Approximate position of Kami Sima: lat. 34° 11' 50" N., long. 136° 48' 30" E.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 167 of 1892) that the Commander of the Japanese steam vessel *Tsukushi maru* reports having touched in October, 1891, on a sunken rock lying off the south-east coast of Nemoro peninsula, with the south-west extreme of Isomoshiri jima, bearing approximately N.E. by E. ¼ E., distant 1¼ mile.

The vessel was drawing 17 ft. when she touched, and the lead gave 4½ fathoms on her starboard side, so that probably it is a pinnacle rock. During subsequent examination under unfavourable circumstances, 3 fathoms was the least depth obtained, but there is probably shoaler water in the vicinity.

Australia—North-west Coast.—King Sound Entrance.—Shoals in and near the Fairway, Sunday Strait.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 168 of 1892) concerning certain shoals lying in and near the fairway of Sunday Strait, King Sound entrance:—

1. A shoal, with 2 fathoms water on it, and 12 to 20 fathoms close northward, lies with the west extreme of East Roe island, bearing south, distant about 1¼ mile.

Approximate position: lat. 16° 20¼' S., long. 123° 13' E.

2. A shoal of small extent, with dangerously shallow water reported on it, lies in the fairway of the strait with Tree islet bearing about E. ¼ S., distant 2½ miles.

Position (to be considered doubtful): lat. 16° 22¼' S., long. 123° 16¼' E.

3. Amur reef, lying north-west of Long island, and which dries 15 ft. at low water, extends nearly 3 miles in a N. by E. and S. by W. direction, with a breadth of about 1¼ mile. Approximate position of northern end: lat. 16° 29¼' S., long. 123° 18' E.

Australia—South.—Special warning to Mariners—Compasses—Heeling error.

The Secretary, Marine Board, Port Adelaide, has given notice that the attention of mariners has been directed by the Board of Trade "to the necessity of exercising a constant watchfulness in regard to the error of their navigating compasses, more particularly to the heeling error, the neglect of which is doubtless a common, though often unsuspected, cause of the stranding of many vessels.

"Serious changes frequently take place in the character and amount of the heeling error as the ship changes her magnetic latitude from (1) the vertical force arising from the permanent magnetism of the ship, the error from which is greatest in high latitudes, diminishes until the equator is reached, where it is least, and increases again in the opposite hemisphere, but still retaining the same name; (2) from verticle induction in vertical and transverse soft iron, generally (such as beams, &c.), the error from which is greatest in high latitudes, diminishes until the equator is reached, where it becomes *nil*, and increases again (but of an opposite name), as the vessel recedes from the equator in the opposite hemisphere. It is difficult, therefore, to predict with any great accuracy the change that will take place, observations at every possible opportunity being the only reliable safeguard.

"In the northern hemisphere in ships built with their heads from about S.E. through N. to S.W. (the usual effect of the permanent magnetism of the ship then conspiring with that of her vertical and transverse soft iron) the N. pt. of the compass needle, assuming the compass to be on the upper deck and on the after portion of the ship as usual will, as a general rule, be drawn to windward or to the high side of the ship; the nearer the ship's head was to N. whilst building the greater the error that may be expected, the effect being to throw the ship to windward of her supposed position when steering northerly courses, and to leeward on southernly, courses, the error decreasing as the equator is approached, and small, perhaps of a contrary name, in the southern hemisphere.

"In ships built with their heads from about S.E. through S. to S.W. (the usual effect of the permanent

magnetism and that of the transverse, &c., iron being then contrary to each other) the N. end of the compass needle may be drawn to leeward, depending upon whether the vertical force of the permanent magnetism or that of the induced magnetism of transverse iron predominates, but the error would then, as a general rule, be small in these latitudes and large in the southern hemisphere.

"It has been est. as a rule, however, that in the northern hemisphere (in compasses above the upper deck) in the majority of iron ships, the N. pt. of the compass needle is drawn to windward, the consequence being that if this is not allowed for, a ship will go to windward of her supposed position on northerly courses and to leeward on southernly courses.

"The heeling error is always greatest with the ship's head at or near N. or S. by the disturbed compass, and least, or *nil*, with the ship's head E. or W. It is particularly important, therefore, should the vessel heel over either from the effect of the wind or the cargo, when steering in a northerly or southernly direction, that the mariner should use every precaution, and never lose an opportunity of ascertaining the errors of his compass.

"The heeling error may be small or large, depending greatly upon the position of the compass—it has been known to exceed 2° for every degree heel of the ship—and is directly proportional to the amount of heel, consequently if the error at N. or S. for 1° of heel is known, the error for any other direction of the ship's head and amount of heel can be found by the usual method.

"Mariners are further warned that the adjustment of compasses by magnets, soft iron, &c., is for bringing the error within manageable limits and for equalising the directive force of the needle, and must only be considered approximate for the latitude in which the adjustment was made, and that they should lose no opportunity of verifying the error both in port and at sea, as it is constantly changing from numerous causes, the chief amongst which are heeling, change of latitude, change of cargo, collision after repairs, and from the ship remaining with her head in one direction for a length of time, &c."

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on May 21, 1892, at 2.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; T. S. Clark, Esq.; W. E. de Vos, Esq.; N. Dias Abeyasingha, Esq.; and E. R. Anthonisz, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.
2. In terms of section 115 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance the Chairman submitted his Administration Report for 1891.
Resolved,—That the Council approve the report, and have no suggestions to make.
3. Submitted Circular letter No. 27 of April 8, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inviting attention to the prevalence of hydrophobia throughout Ceylon, and asking the opinion of the Council as to the means which should be adopted to check, and if possible to stamp out, the disease.
Resolved,—That in the opinion of the Council the existing by-laws are sufficient to check the disease if they are more rigidly enforced by the Police. The Municipal Councils Ordinance gives the Council no power to make further by-laws beyond those in force. The repressive measures recommended by the Principal Civil Medical Officer, except (3) and (4), which are already provided by the by-laws, should be by special legislation; (5) the Council considers impracticable.
Resolved,—That the Superintendent of Police be asked, in terms of by-law, chapter XXVII. 5, to make the seizure of stray dogs without collars bearing the Municipal stamp a continuous instead of a periodic work.
4. Read letter No. 11 of April 13, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Rs. 1,500 will, under section 7 of the Ordinance No. 2 of 1890, become due on June 30 next as interest and sinking fund on loan to the Galle Waterworks.
Resolved,—That the matter do lie over until the Council can determine when water can be supplied.
5. Read letter No. 129 of April 11, 1892, from the Provincial Engineer adhering to the opinion already expressed by him as to the amount due Mr. J. Samerekoon for extra work in connection with the laying of the water pipes.
Resolved,—That the consideration of the matter do lie over until the return of the Provincial Engineer to Galle.

THE following regulations under section 15 of the Cattle Disease Ordinance, 1891, have been approved by the Governor in Executive Council, and are published for general information.

Regulations relating to Cattle Disease.

1. (a) It shall be the duty of all persons in charge of cattle which may die of disease in an infected area to burn or bury, or cause to be buried, within six hours after death, the carcasses of the cattle so dying in a grave at least six feet deep from the surface, and such carcasses shall be covered with quicklime, when procurable, before the grave is filled in.
(b) Every person who within an infected area finds the carcass of any cattle lying dead and unburied shall report the same to the nearest Headman or Police Officer, who shall cause such carcass to be forthwith buried in manner aforesaid.
(c) The possessor or occupier of land within an infected area shall cause the fresh dung of all diseased cattle being upon such land, together with the litter (if any), to be burned, tar, when available, being sprinkled over them before the burning.
(d) It shall not be lawful for any person to preserve the hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of the carcass of any cattle dying within an infected area without a permit in writing from the Government Agent of the Province or of the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which such area is situated, or from some person duly authorised by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, aforesaid to issue, such permit. Every such permit shall contain the conditions under which such hides, horns, and hoofs may be preserved.
2. It shall be the duty of every person who buries or assists to bury the carcass of any cattle within an infected area, or is employed in tending diseased or suspected cattle, either within or without an infected area, before he approaches healthy cattle, to thoroughly bathe his body, and cause his clothes to be boiled in water containing a wineglass full of "kregaline," or "phenol," or "Jeyes' disinfectant," or some similar preparation, or to be otherwise disinfected.
3. No person shall expose diseased or suspected cattle in any market, gála, garden, or other public or private place.
4. No person shall carry or cause to be carried along any line of railway, canal, or river, or in any truck, vessel, or boat, or otherwise, any diseased or suspected cattle, or the dung of such cattle.
5. No person shall carry, drive, or lead, or cause to be carried, driven, or led along any thoroughfare, road, or highway, any diseased or suspected cattle.
6. (a) It shall not be lawful for any person to keep any diseased or suspected cattle in any chena or unenclosed land or field, or in any land or field immediately adjoining a thoroughfare or highway, without a permit from the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the District in which such person resides, or from some person duly authorised by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent aforesaid to issue such permit.
(b) It shall not be lawful for any person in charge of diseased or suspected cattle to allow such cattle to drink at any running stream or at any pond or reservoir.
7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent within his Province, the Assistant Government Agent within his district, any officer appointed under the Ordinance, the Police Magistrate within his division, the President of the Village Tribunal within the limits of his jurisdiction, and any Headman or Police Officer, to seize diseased or suspected cattle being carried, kept, or otherwise dealt with in contravention of the Ordinance or of any regulations made thereunder: and the Government Agent of the Province or Assistant Government Agent of the district in which such cattle are seized may order such cattle to be forthwith destroyed and their carcasses burned or buried as he may direct; or he may direct such cattle to be detained and segregated in any place to be appointed by him; and the owner of such cattle shall be liable to pay to the Government Agent such expenses as may be incurred in the seizure, detention, destruction, or disposal of such cattle. Provided, however, that for every head of black cattle destroyed under this regulation the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall pay to the owner the value thereof as estimated by him not exceeding Rs. 30, and for every buffalo or head of Mysore or Coast cattle destroyed under this regulation the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall pay to the owner the value thereof as estimated by him not exceeding Rs. 60.
8. (a) Applications for permits under any of the foregoing regulations or under the Ordinance must be made to the Government Agent of the Province or Assistant Government Agent of the district in which the applicant resides, in writing, and signed by the applicant, and must set out clearly the number, age, sex and brandmarks (if any) of the cattle to be included in the permit, the object for which such permit is required,

and the line of road (if any) along which such cattle are to be moved or transported, and must contain an undertaking by the applicant to pay for the cost of disinfecting any cart, wagon, boat, vessel, truck, or other conveyance used for the transport of such cattle.

(b) Permits when issued must be retained in the custody of the applicant, who shall produce the same to the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district, the Police Magistrate of the division, or the President of the Village Tribunal within whose jurisdiction the applicant resides, or to any officer appointed by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent for the purpose of issuing permits, or to any village headman within the limits of his local jurisdiction whenever called upon so to do.

9. Cattle detained under the authority of the provisions of the Ordinance or of the regulations framed thereunder shall be supplied with food and water by their owners or by the persons in charge of such cattle at the time of seizure. The officer appointed under the provisions of the Ordinance to enforce the detention of cattle shall, if the owners or persons in charge of the cattle neglected or decline to supply food and water in sufficient quantities, provide such cattle with such food and water as he may consider necessary, and the cost of food and water so provided shall be borne by the owner of such cattle, who shall pay the same to the officer before such cattle are released from detention; and if such cost be not paid within three days after demand made for the same, the officer may sell such cattle, or so many of them as may be necessary to cover the cost aforesaid and the detention of the cattle up to the day of sale.

10. The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may, subject to the approval of the Governor, appoint officers from time to time to carry out the provisions of the Ordinance and of regulations framed thereunder, and shall pay them such remuneration for their services as the Governor may be pleased to appoint.

11. (a) All regulations and general and special orders made under the Ordinance shall be published in the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages.

(b) Service or delivery of a notice or other document required by the provisions of the Ordinance, or of regulations made thereunder to be served or delivered, shall be served or delivered personally on the person to be affected by such notice or documents, or by posting the same to such person by registered letter.

UNDER the powers conferred by the 43rd clause of the Ordinance No. 2 of 1878, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed that the following rates be levied in Ceylon from 1st July, 1892.
