MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Kall, Kandy, on August 15, 1914, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 11, 1914.

Present : The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman ; Mr. E. Bevan ; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris ; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria ; Mr. C. A. La Brooy ; Dr. Allan de Saram ; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 18, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1913 to July 31, 1914, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for July.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July.

4. Papers *re* the removal of encroachment opposite premises No. 14, Matale road.

Resolved—That action be taken under by-law 11c of this Council.

5. Papers *re* treating certain sections of roads in charge of the Public Works Department with tar composition.

Resolved—That Government be asked to contribute Rs. 4,000, instead of Rs. 3,000 as proposed at the previous Meeting.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the following by-law be passed :—“No male above the age of twelve years shall sit upon or make any use of any seat in any public place or recreation ground which is labelled ‘for women and children only.’ The burden of proving that he is under twelve years shall be on any person charged under this by-law.”

Finance and Assessment.

(2) That the sum of Rs. 12·60 be paid for translations into Sinhalese and Tamil of the by-laws relating to the regulation of traffic.

(3) That a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,500 be passed under the Head “Sanitation.”

Municipal Works.

(4) That the following estimate be passed :—Six watering carts, Rs. 2,534·40.

(5) That a water service be allowed on usual terms to No. 42, Hill street, E. Berenger.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted, with the exception of (4) (estimate for six watering carts), which was to lie over pending reply of Government to request for contribution towards treating the roads with tar.

7. The report of the Colonial Auditor for the year 1913. Resolved—That the report be adopted.

8. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1913.—Tabled.
