# MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 28, 1914.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 21, 1914.

Present:—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. W. Sutherland Ross; the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Major E. P. Sewell; and Mr. C. S. Burns.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 31, 1914, and of the Special Meeting of August 14, 1914, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved-That the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 31, 1914, and of the Special Meeting of August 14, 1914,

(The Chairman read a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary conveying the high appreciation of His Excellency the Governor of the Council's loyal assurances and readiness to co-operate with the Government in the present crisis of the European War, as embodied in the resolution of the Special Meeting of August 14, 1914, which was transmitted by the Chairman for the information of His Excellency the Governor.)

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman read the following:

#### Statement re Plague.

Since our last meeting there have been 36 further cases of plague, making in all a total of 313 cases, after allowing a correction of two in the total announced last month. Seventeen of the 36 cases were set ticæmic in type, and the remaining 19 bubonic. The chief centres have been Forbes road, Wolfendahl, 2nd Division Maradana, and Kochchikadde. At Forbes road 6 cases were found on the 14th instant, at one and the same time 3 in one room and 3 in another room, the rooms being in close proximity, being situated on opposite sides of a narrow passage. The curious thing about it was that no fleas could be traced in the rooms. Two guinea pigs were allowed to run loose in each of the rooms, but not a single flea was found on either the next morning. Vigorous measures were adopted, and no new cases have occurred there. single flea was found on either the next morning. A case has occurred at Wellawatta road, a Tamil ricksha cooly, who slept among 20 others in an open shed being attacked. He may have contracted the disease elsewhere, or it is quite possible that he received the infection where he slept, as the rats trapped in Wellawatta have been found to be infected; the first one found to be infected in that district having E 1

been caught on June 4. As I have stated in my previous statements the disease is gradually spreading among the rats. Cases of infected rats have been found in every part of the town, with the exception of Modera. The campaign of rat destruction has continued unabated, and 3,035 rats were trapped last week, bringing up the total to 68,678. Some 250,000 baits were laid, of which 52,000 were removed. I trust that every Member of this Council will continue, as I hope they have all been doing, to impress upon every householder the necessity of making every effort to destroy rats.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader presented a petition from the dry goods stallholders of the Kachcheri road market, and moved that the same be considered and disposed of. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman said he would place the petition before the Sanitation and Finance Committees, who would submit their recommendations to Council.

(3) Papers re sewers between Kollupitiya lane and Flower road. (T. District.) Recommended that the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, be informed that the Council is not prepared to sanction the laying of these sewers which are in the main on private undeveloped land.

(5) To consider the question of providing Venturi Recording Meters for the Harbour Pumping Station and other minor pumping stations.

Recommended that the Hon. the Colonial Secretary be informed that the Council is of opinion that the installation of the meters is essential.

Extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 20, 1914.

Recommended that no increase in the contribution be made, and that it be brought to the attention of the Government that it is doubtful whether the Council can legally make any contribution, and request that the matter may be submitted to the Attorney-General for an expression of his opinion.

(8) To consider the question of the Council's liability with regard to the motor car accident in Buller's road. Circulate for an expression of opinion before the Meeting of Council. To be submitted to the Council.

(23) To sanction the sale by public auction of premises No. 404-22, Vauxhall street, Slave Island, for valuable consideration.—Recommended.

(24) To consider the question of permitting the erection of a tombstone in memory of the late Dr. M. de L. Robinson ree of any charge.—Recommended that the Council waive the charge for the erection of a tombstone.

(25) To consider the question whether the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon is entitled to take private practice and draw fees.—Recommended that the Veterinary Surgeon be allowed to treat for remuneration such cases as the Chairman may approve.

(26) To provide for the payment of the female attendant at the Segregation Camp at Rs. 15 per mensem,-Recommended.

(27) To consider the question of leasing premises No. 2, Hulftsdorp street, for three years to Mr. J. Crosby Rodrigo. Recommended that the property be let for three years at Rs. 50 per month, with a condition that the Council reserve the right to terminate the lease at three months' notice in the event of it being decided to sell the

(28) To reconsider the question of the permanent employment of Mr. R. N. Watkins, Assistant Accountant. Recommended that Mr. Watkins be informed that the Council is prepared to give him permanent employment,

but that the question of his emoluments must await the decision of the Salaries Committee,

(30) To sanction the sale of premises Nos. 2,761 to 2,765-103, Korteboam street, by public auction, for valuable consideration.—Recommended.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items 4 to 10 on the agenda. The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.—Carried.

#### (Council in Committee.)

Special Committee on Drainage Works.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of August 21, 1914, be adopted.

Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

5. With reference to item No. 4 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects

of August 20, 1914, Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the recommendation be adopted. Mr. C. S. Burns seconded.
Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, Mr. W. Sutherland Ross, and Mr. H.
L. de Mel spoke in favour of the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees (appearing under item No. 8 of the extracts from the Minutes of those Committees) of August 21, 1914.

Mr. J. A. Perera's motion was put to the meeting and declared lost, 5 voting for it, 9 against.

Before considering item No. 8 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 20, 1914, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the public withdraw from the meeting. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—

d. The public withdrew.

Mr. C. S. Burns moved that the opinion of Counsel be adopted, and that the Council do offer, without prejudice, Rs. 2,000 in full settlement of the claim. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.

Mr. J. A. Perera moved as an amendment that the matter be referred back to the Law Committee for disposal, Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

Mr. Burns withdrew his motion.

Mr. J. A. Perera's amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried.

Resolved that the remaining item of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 20, 1914, be adopted.

Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets. With reference to item No. 2 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of August 20, 1914, Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the matter be referred back to the Sanitation and Finance Committees for further consideration. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

With reference to item No. 14 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 21, 1914, the Chairman read from the notes of the inquiry held by him, the charges framed against Head Overseer Kitchellan, and his finding thereon.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that this Council ask Head Overseer Kitchellan to retire for inefficiency. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

Mr. W. Sutherland Ross moved as an amendment that in the opinion of this Council, Head Overseer Kitchellan has proved himself inefficient and that he be compulsorily retired. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Dr. Rodrigo withdrew his motion in favour of the amendment, which was put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

With reference to item No. 16 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 21, 1914, it was resolved that the resolution of Council in regard to item No. 8 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 20, 1914, be adopted.

On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried, 10 voting for it and 3 against.

# Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 8, 1914.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 3, 1914.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. D. W. Subesingha; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; Mr. A. C. Hayley; and Mr. P. M. Bingham.

1. The minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 11, 1914, a copy of which was sent to each Member, taken as read.

Resolved-That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 11, 1914, be confirmed.

- Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subesingha asked—
  - (1) What supervision, if any, is exercised by the Council over the proper and regular lighting of the street lamps by the contractor?
  - (2) Has any officer been appointed by the Council to supervise the work of the contractor and report to Council the defects in lighting?
    (3) Is the supervision of the lighting one of the duties of the Inspectors?

(4) If not, is there any objection to their appointment as supervisors of the lighting in their respective wards?

The Chairman replied as follows:-

(1) The Council employes a special overseer to supervise the work of the contractor. The Inspector of Police and the Municipal Inspectors are supplied with copies of the time table of street lighting for the purpose of reporting any neglects that they may observe.

The Council has appointed a special overseer to supervise the work of the contractor.

(3) The Inspectors have been directed to report neglects of the contractor whenever observed by them, but the supervision of the lighting has not been made part of their regular duties.

(4) It is not advisable to add this duty of supervision of lighting of street lamps to the already numerous duties performed by the Inspectors, whose work is primarily that of sanitation.

- 3. Mr. D. W. Subesingha, with the permission of Council, deferred the motion of which he had given due notice for the next Meeting of Council.

The Chairman moved that the matter be referred to the Special Committee appointed on June 13, 1914, to investigate the effect on the water of the timber in the bed of the Hiyare reservoir and to report on the proposal to remove the same, and further to advice the Council generally as to the steps to be taken in that connection for inquiry and report. Mr. A. C. Hayley seconded.—Carried.
- 5. Application from the Honorary Secretary, Galle Tennis Club, for permission to cut two trees by the side of the Tennis Court Pavilion.

Resolved—That the permission asked for be granted.

Resolved.—That no repairs to the sheds be affected, but that at the end of the current year half of each of the sheds be demolished and the materials used in thoroughly repairing the other half. The capacity of the sheds will thereby be reduced. The rent to be sold accordingly for 1915.

(7) Applications for private water service to No. 72, Main street, and No. 371, Dangedera, where water will be used for trading purposes.

Resolved—That in terms of rule 32, sub-section (5), of the Waterworks Regulations of January 22, 1912, a charge of

#### Report of the Medical Officer of Health for August, 1914.

I HAVE the honour to submit my monthly report for August, 1914, on the condition of the public health of Galle and its administration.

Births.—The total births registered in the town of Galle in August, 1914, were 72 (2 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, and 13 Moors). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1914 by intercensal increase, viz., 40,916) was 22.87, as against 27.32 in the previous month.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 92 (4 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 9 Tamils, and 22 Moors). The death-rate per 1,000

per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1914 by intercensal increase, viz., 40,916) was 29.23, as against 30.59 in the previous month.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the total 92 deaths, 14 were of infants under one year of age, as against 13 in the previous month.

Infantic Deaths.—Of the total 92 deaths, 14 were of infants under one year of age, as against 13 in the previous month.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the month was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nine deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 4 in the previous month; of these, 1 was in Fort Ward, 1 in Galupiadda, 3 in Hirimbure, 4 in Kumbalwella (including 1 death in the hospital).

2. Three deaths from Pneumonia were registered, against 4 in the previous month; of these, 2 were in Galupiadda and 1 in Kumbalwella; two deaths were registered from Bronchitis, 1 in Kaluwella and the other in Hirimbure.

3. One death was registered from Toxemia consequent on Enteric Fever (in the hospital); and 1 from Puerperal Fever

(Kumbalwella).

4. Eight deaths were registered from Debility; 9 from Convulsions; 4 from Marasmus; 2 from Infantile Tetanus; 6 from Dysentery; 3 from Old Age; 1 from Meningitis; 12 from Worms; 8 from Anchylostomiasis; 2 from Infantile Debility; 1 from Cardiae Failure from Diabetes; 1 from Difficult Labour (Partus); 1 from Rickets; 1 from Hernia; 2 from Hemiplegia; 2 from Diabetes; 5 from Diarrhœa; 2 from Cerebral Hemorrhage; 2 from Accidents; 1 from Puerperal Eclampsia; 1 from Collapse of the Heart due to Diarrhœa; 1 from Morbus Cordis; 1 from Paralysis.

Infectious Diseases.—Eleven cases of Phthisis were reported, as against 9 in the previous month; 3 cases of Continued Fever, as against 1 last month; 1 case of Measles, as against nil last month; 1 case of Chickenpox, as against nil last month; 4 cases of

Enteric, as against similar number last month.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of the air was 80°·1, as against 80°·8 in July, 1914. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.884, against 29.851 the same month. The total rainfall in the month was 3.55 in., against 6.82 in. in July.

General Health of the Town was by no means satisfactory, Diarrhosa, Dysentery, Anchylostomiasis, Convulsions, Worms and Phthisis claiming the largest number of victims as usual. It is a regrettable fact that in cases of Dysentery and Diarrhosa, the poor class of people instead of resorting to hospital treatment from the commencement entrust themselves to the care of ignorant vederalss who have the reputation (even among the better class of lay people) of performing nothing short of miracles in cases of Dysentery and other disorders of the intestinal tract. So long there is poverty and ignorance in this country, and so long the Government encourages the trade of the vederalss by registering them as medical practitioners, it is more or less a hopeless task for the Public Health Department to bring about an appreciable reduction in the annual death-rate.

Drainage.—Drains are being regularly flushed since of late and are kept in a fairly satisfactory condition.

Scavenging and Sweeping .- Fairly satisfactory.

Alleys in the Fort are swept regularly and kept in a clean state.

Bakeries.—A new bakery is started in the Lighthouse street, opposite the Albion Press. This is the first bakery of the kind in Galle where attempts have been made to render the kneading room flyproof.

The Coronation Bakery in Pedler street is worked under most insanitary conditions, and it will be my painful duty to stop it working from the commencement of the next year.

Laundries and Dairies.—Attempts are being made to improve our laundries and dairies.

Dwelling-houses.—Majority of the dwelling-houses in China Gardens are very badly ventilated, and there is good deal of over-crowding to be seen, especially among the poorest class of residents. No wonder we hear of so many cases of Phthisis every month in Galle.

Markets are kept in a fairly satisfactory condition.

Latrines .- Public latrines; each latrine in charge of a separate cooly is well looked after.

Gardens .- The Municipal Inspectors are doing their best to get rid of the rank vegetation from the various parts of the town.

Municipal Inspectors:—Ward Inspector No. 2 has been ordered on volunteer duty since the first week of August, and that has interfered with the smooth working of the Public Health Department to a tremendous extent. Ward Inspector No. 1 is looking after his work in addition to his own duties.

Cattle Disease.—There were no fresh cases of hoof-and-mouth disease reported during August.
