Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, September 25, 1914.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 18, 1914.

Present :- Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. C. S. Burns; and Mr. T. L. Villiere.

Mr. Arthur Alvis said that before the work of the Council began he would, with the permission of Council, move the following motion:

That this Council desires to place on record their sense of the loss sustained by the Government of Ceylon by the death of Mr. W. E. Thorpe, C.C.S., at one time Chairman of this Council and Mayor of the City of Colombo, and begs to tender to his widow and family its deep sympathies in their bereavement. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 28, 1914, having been previously printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of August 28, 1914, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman read the following:-

Statement re Plague.

Since the last meeting of this Council, 20 further cases of plague have been reported, making a total of 333 cases since the outbreak. Nineteen of the 20 cases proved fatal. Thirteen were septicæmic and the remaining 7 bubonic in type. One or 2 sporadic cases have occurred in parts of the town beyond the limits of the area hitherto infected, e.g., on August 31, a case occurred in St. James' street, Kotahena; 1 at Fisher's Hill, Mutwal, on the 8th instant; 1 at Ketawellamulla lane on the 8th instant; and 1 at Santiago road on the 9th instant. No infected rat has so far been captured as far north as St. James' street, but 1 was captured at Fisher's Hill as long ago as March 23. There can be little doubt that the disease now exists among the rats in every part of the town. Fortunately, the increase of infection among the rat population is comparatively slight; for instance, last week no plague-infected rats were found at all, although 3,269 were trapped. This will in itself account for the sporadic nature of the disease amongst the human population. Since our last meeting 13,709 rats have been trapped, bringing up the total to 82,387. In addition to this, 281,250 baits were laid in the four weeks, of which 46,951 were removed presumably by rats.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 19, 1914, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 15, 1914.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Peiris; Mr. D. E. Weerasooriya; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 15, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

  2. The following documents were submitted:—
  - (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1913 to August 31, 1914, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.
  - (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
  - (c) Health Officer's report for August.
  - (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August.
  - (e) The Reservoir Readings for August.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August.

4. Correspondence:

(1) Letter No. 12 of August 20, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re admission of vagrants from Kandy into the Colombo House of Detention and House for Vagrants.

Resolved—That the Council agree to the proposals of Government.
(2) Letter No. 267 of September 12, 1914, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, re the nomination of an Unofficial Member of the Municipal Council for the Excise Advisory Committee for the Kandy Municipal area for the next financial year.

Resolved—That Mr. L. H. S. Pieris be re-nominated.

(3) Letter No. 236 of August 15, 1914, fron the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, asking for the remittance of a sum of Rs. 80 awarded as compensation for the land acquired for a public latrine on Peradeniya road. Resolved-That the amount be voted.

(4) Letter of August 25 from Mr. C. B. Nugawela applying for the purchase of the land gifted to the Council by Mr. Beven for opening a park.

Mr. Tomalin proposed that the application be declined.—Mr. LaBrooy seconded. This was carried, Mr. Weerasooria being the only dissentient.

The Superintendent of Works was to be asked to submit an estimate for improvements to the park.

(5) Letter of August 17 from Mr. F. C. Macdonald re the removal of trees in Ward street.

Mr. Pieris moved that the Council adhere to its former resolution.—Mr. Tomalin seconded. This was carried Mr. Beven dissenting.

It was agreed not to remove any more trees until the proposed scheme for improvements to Ward street was adopted. (6) Letter of September 10 from Inspector H. B. Tennekoon renotice given him by Council that his services will

not be required after December 31, 1914. Mr. LaBrooy moved that Mr. Tennekoon be informed that the Council cannot reconsider the matter. Mr. Tomalin seconded.

Mr. Beven moved as an amendment that the motion be adopted with the addition that Mr. Tennekoon be also informed that it is open to him to apply for any other post under the Council. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried by 4 to 3.

Noes. Ayes. The Chairman Mr. LaBrooy. Mr. Beven Mr. Tomalin Mr, Pieris Dr. de Saram Mr. Weerasooria

The original notice was thereupon declared lost.

(7) Petition of September 4 from residents of Trincomalee street praying for the establishment of a meat and vegetable market in Trincomalee street.

Resolved—That inquiries be made as to what sites are available.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved-That the Council do provide two separate cremation grounds for the use of the Buddhist and Hindu communities within the Municipal limits. Mr. Weerasooriya seconded,-

It was further resolved that estimates for both be called for. 6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved—That the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, be asked to provide passenger accommodation for even a few in the goods train leaving Kandy for Matale at 9 A.M., in view of the inconvenient time (5.45 A.M.) fixed for the first passenger train from Kandy to Matale. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

With the consent of the mover the following amended resolution was put to the Meeting and carried unanimously:-

That the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, be asked to attach a carriage with compartments for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd class passengers to the goods train leaving Kandy for Matale at 9 A.M., in view of the inconvenient time (5.45 A.M.) fixed for the first passenger train from Kandy to Matale, and also to provide a passenger service from Kandy to Matale to connect with the 2.15 P.M. train from Colombo to Kandy.

7. Report of Special Committee appointed to inquire and report upon the present state and working of the public

market, and to suggest what steps should be taken for its improvements.

Mr. Beven moved that the report be adopted. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.

8. Papers re permits to roadside sellers.

Resolved-That the papers be referred for report to the Superintendent of Police, Central Province.

9. Papers re the widening of Malabar stree

Resolved—That the resolution passed at the Meeting of July 18 last, be taken to refer to the whole section between Kachcheri road and Lady Longden's road.

10. To sanction the public stands for licensed vehicles in the following places:-

(1) In King street, for buggy carts or hackeries.

(2) In Hill street, for rickshas.

Resolved-That the stands be sanctioned.

11. To restore to office Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene, who has ceased to be a Member through having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings of Council.

Mr. LaBrooy proposed that Mr. Wijegoonewardene be restored to office, Mr. Pieris seconded,—Carried.

12. Recommendations of Standing Committees:

Law and General.

(1) That the following by-law be passed :--Every person driving a rubber-tyred carriage or drawing a ricksha for hire shall have ready and available for immediate use a suitable bell capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of his approach and position, and shall sound the same whenever expedient to prevent danger to any of the public.

Finance and Assessment.

(2) That the cart hire paid by the Council be raised from Re. 1.50 to Re. 1.75 per day in the case of all carts employed by the Works Department. (3) That the ricksha allowance of the Supervisor of Conservancy be increased from Rs. 10 to Rs. 15 a month.

(4) That the post of assistant to the Supervisor of Conservancy on Rs. 30 a month be created and Mr. A. S. Rajah, nuisance watcher, appointed to fill it.

(5) That the fee for a pottery license be Rs. 5 per annum.

Municipal Works.

(6) That the Council contribute Rs. 87.50 (half cost) towards the erection of a standpost on the road leading to the buildings at the back of Pulleyar kovil.

(7) That the following estimates be passed:—Removal of trees in Ward street, Rs. 210.

(8) That water service pipes be allowed on usual terms to: (1) No. 72, Brownrigg street, J. Anghie; (2) No. 10, Halloluwa road, D. T. Karunaratne.

Resolved-That the recommendations be adopted.

Report of the Medical Officer of Health for September, 1914.

I HAVE the honour to submit the Report of the Public Health Department for the month of September, 1914.

F. R. E. NICHOLAS,

Superintendent of Works.

Births.—The total births registered in the town of Galle in September, 1914, were 72 (1 Burgher, 57 Sinhalese, and 14 Moors). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1914 by intercensal increase, viz., 40,916) was 22.87, as against similar figure in the previous month.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 97 (3 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 5 Tamils, and 18 Moors). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1914 by intercensal increase, viz., 40,916) was 30.81, as against 29.23 in the previous month.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the total 97 deaths, 11 were of infants under one year of age, as against 14 in the previous month. Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the month was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Two deaths were registered from Broncho-pneumonia. Of these, I was in Ward II., and the other in the Government hospital; 2 deaths were registered from Bronchial Asthma, I from Ward III. and the other outside the Four Gravets.

- 2. Seven deaths were registered from Phthisis. Of these, 1 was in Ward I., 1 was in Ward II., 2 in Ward IV., 1 in Ward V.
