## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, May 31, 1892, at 3 o'clock p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated May 24, 1892.

*Present*.—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuik, Acting Mayor and Chairman; Mr. E. Walker; Mr. R. K. MacBride, C.M.G.; Hon. Col. F. C. H. Clarke, R.A., C.M.G.; Major R. E. Firminger; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. D. F. Browne; and Mr. R. H. Morgan.

The Minutes of April 22 and 29 and May 3, 1892, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of April 22 and 29 and May 3, 1892, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that His Excellency the Governor be respectfully asked to amend the existing laws with reference to road tax defaulters within the Municipality of Colombo, so that no defaulter be sentenced to imprisonment if he pay the penalty of ten rupees prescribed in section 18 of Ordinance 31 of 1884.

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy asked "whether papers relating to tramways have been received from Messrs. Hutchinson & Co. of London," and moved "that they be considered."

The Chairman stated that the papers referred to had been received.

Resolved,—That the papers in question, together with any other proposals relating to tramways received within the next six weeks, be circulated among Members.

3. The Administration Report of the Chairman for 1891 was laid on the table.

Resolved,—That the report be printed and circulated among Members.

4. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to April 30, 1892, and a Progress Report of Work done during the same period, were laid on the table.

5. A memorandum dated May 29, 1892, from the Chairman, with reference to the petition presented at the meeting of March 11, 1892, from Mrs. Prins, of 14, St. Lucia's street, was submitted, together with a notice of action from Mr. J. N. Keith, Proctor, claiming on behalf of Mr. L. N. Prins the sum of Rs. 603.27 for damage done to his property No. 43, St. Lucia's lane.

Resolved,—That the matter be disposed of by the Chairman.

6. A letter dated March 31, 1892, from Mr. J. Ohlmus, Proctor, stating, on behalf of his client I. L. M. H. M. Mohideen Hadjar, that he has made no encroachment on the street at No. 45, Keyzer street, was submitted.

Resolved,—That the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman.

7. A letter No. 65 of March 12, 1891, from the Auditor-General with reference to the accounts for December 1891, and the Auditor-General's report for the year 1891 (letter No. 91 of May 14, 1892), were submitted.

Resolved,—That the annual report be printed and circulated.

8. The Auditor-General's remarks on the Council's accounts for November and December, 1891 (letter No. 62 of March 9 and letter No. 76 of April 22, 1892), were laid on the table.

9. The reports of the Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for April and May, 1892, were laid on the table.

10. A petition dated December, 1891, from certain residents of Maliban street and Mitcho's lane (P. H. David, &c.), with reference to a claim made by the Chief Engineer, Colombo Waterworks, for water supplied for trade purposes, was submitted.

Resolved,—That payment of the charge made by the Chief Engineer be enforced.

11. A letter dated February 9, 1892, from Mr. E. J. Koelman was submitted, claiming compensation for certain land alleged to have been taken up for the improvement of the road at Regent street, and a minute dated March 19, 1892, by the Chairman on the subject.

Resolved,—That Mr. Koelman be referred to his legal remedy.

12. Offers for the lease of the Edinburgh fruit and vegetable market and the Dean's road fruit and vegetable market were submitted.

Resolved,—That the offer of Rs. 105 per mensem made by W. A. Fernando for the lease of the Edinburgh market be accepted, and that the existing arrangements in Dean's road market be allowed to continue.

13. The City Analyst's reports dated March 8, April 5, and May 6, on the town water for February, March, and April, 1892, respectively, were submitted.

14. A letter dated February 5, 1892, from the Secretary, Bristol Hotels Company, was submitted regarding the erection of a portico across the road in front of the entrance to the hotel.

Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that the present application be rejected, and that any future application which may be made be considered on its own merits."

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.—Carried.

15. A memorandum dated May 14, 1892, from the Chairman was submitted, reporting for the information of the Council that the Hon. J. J. Grinlinton having been absent from three consecutive General Meetings, has vacated his seat as a Member of Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved that Hon. J. J. Grinlinton be restored to his office under the provisions of section 32 of the Ordinance 7 of 1887.

Mr. Walker seconded.—Carried.

16. A letter No. 56/03433, dated April 14, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was read, stating, with reference to the Special Committee's Report on Dr. Kynsey's memorandum relating to smallpox, that no amendment of section 3 of Ordinance 8 of 1886 is considered necessary, and that the Attorney-General has been desired to draft amending regulations under section 10.

17. A letter No. 68 of May 9, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was read, intimating that the Governor has approved the site proposed by the Director of Public Works for the new bridge over the Kelani at Grandpass, but that His Excellency is unable to accede to the proposal to allow the Municipality to appropriate the tolls.

Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that His Excellency the Governor be respectfully informed that this Council must decline to make any contribution towards the construction of the new bridge over the Kelani river, unless Government give the Council permanently the toll derived therefrom as heretofore, or some other equivalent source of revenue."

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.

Whereupon the motion was carried.

18. A letter No. 59, dated April 23, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was read, stating that if the Municipal Council have not the funds necessary to adapt the land at Welikada for use as a recreation ground, it should be restored to Government, and that the proposal to sell a portion of the land cannot be entertained.

Resolved,—That the letter be referred to the Standing Committee to suggest what steps should be taken to adapt the land for use as a recreation ground.

19. A letter No. 70, dated May 10, 1892, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was submitted, inquiring if the Municipal Council has any objection to the diversion of certain roads (shown upon a plan) in Slave Island, in connection with a grant of land for the erection of a Roman Catholic Church.

Mr. D. F. Browne "moved that the papers be circulated among Members."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

20. A letter dated May 10, 1892, from R. D. S. Wijeratne, was read, offering to undertake the scavenging of the Municipality for Rs. 45,500 per annum, and also a letter dated May 10, 1892, from Mr. T. L. Fernando consenting to the acceptance by the Council of Mr. Wijeratne's proposal.

Resolved,—That Mr. Wijeratne's offer to execute the scavenging of the Municipality at the rate of Rs. 45,500 per annum be accepted.

21. The Sanitary Officer's report for the first quarter of 1892 was submitted.

Resolved,—That the consideration of the report be deferred.

22. A petition dated April 21, 1892, from certain residents of New Bazaar (B. Hassen, &c.) was submitted, requesting that a special license be granted for the sale of meat at 9A, Ferry street.

Resolved,—That the application be disposed of by the Chairman.

23. An application dated April 30, 1892, for an extension of leave was submitted from Mr. Laurence Alvis, the Registering Clerk, who had been absent in consequence of illness from March 24.

Resolved,—That Mr. Alvis be allowed full-pay leave from March 24 to May 31, 1892.

24. A letter dated May 10, 1892, from the Assessment Clerk, was submitted, suggesting that the authority of the Council be obtained to sell a piece of waste land at No. 31, Mutwal, under section 158 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, with the Chairman's endorsement thereon.

Resolved,—That the sale of the land be sanctioned in terms of section 158.

25. A letter No. 345, dated May 15, 1892, from the Superintendent of Works, was submitted, stating that no estimate for watering streets, &c., with other than Labugama water can be prepared except after a trial upon an extended scale, and that lake water would be injurious to health.

Resolved,—That the matter be disposed of by the Chairman.

26. A letter No. 279, dated May 6, 1892, from the Sanitary Officer with reference to the resolution passed on May 3, 1892, stopping his experiments in connection with incineration of night soil, was submitted.

Resolved,—That the consideration of the letter do stand over.

27. Letters dated May 21 and 26, 1892, from the Gas Inspector, were submitted, applying for nine months leave of absence on the ground of ill-health.

Resolved,—That Mr. Cochran be allowed full pay leave for three months from the date of commencement of his leave, viz., May 7, 1892, and six months on half pay—the remaining half being divided between the substitutes proposed to act for him, viz., Rev. J. Burnet and Mr. C. E. H. Symons, in such proportions as may be arranged by the Chairman.
