WHEREAS by section 39 of the Ceylon Railways Ordinance, No. 9 of 1902, it is enacted that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the Police Magistrates of Colombo, Kandy, Matale, Campola, Nuwara Eliya-Hatton, Badulla-Haldummulla, Panadure, Kalutara, Balapitiya, Galle, Matara, and also any other Police Magistrate who may thereafter be specially authorized thereto by Proclamation issued by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall each have jurisdiction over all offences, acts, matters, and things cognizable by Police Courts, although such Magistrates may otherwise have no jurisdiction in the place where the offence was committed or where the act, matter, or thing took place:

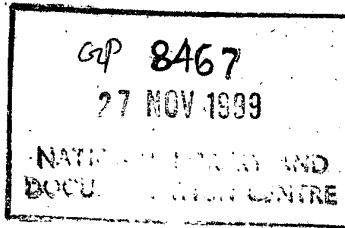

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby specially authorize the Police Magistrates of Kegalla, Kurunegala, and Avisawella each to have jurisdiction over all offences, acts, matters, and things cognizable by Police Courts, although such Magistrates may otherwise have no jurisdiction in the place where the offence was committed or where the act, matter, or thing took place.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on the 4th May, 1903, at the Council Chamber, for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the periods as stated:—

(1) *Western Province.*—The Arrack Rent of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted), Lansiyawatta (including Wattala, Peliyagoda, and Ambatalenpahala), and Salpiti korale. For a period of two years from January 1, 1904.

(2) The Arrack Rent of the Negombo District, viz., Dunugaha, Ragama, and Dasiya pattus of Alutkuru korale north and Hapitigam korale. For a period of one or two years from January 1, 1904.

(3) The District of Kalutara For a period of one or two years from the 1st January, 1904.

(4) *Southern Province.*—The Four Gravets of Galle and Akmimana; Talpe pattu, Wellaboda, Gangaboda, and Hinidum pattus; Bentota-Walallawiti korale. For a period of one or two years from 1st January, 1904.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the period or periods in respect of which he tenders, and the price or prices that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above, both the name and number of the rent being inserted in the tender.

Tenders, properly sealed, may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Mr. E. im Thurn, C.B., C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rents of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted) and of Galle will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipalities of Colombo and Galle.

3 **B**E it enacted by the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly thereof, as follows:—

1. So much of any law as is repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed.

2. In the construction of this Act the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, bear the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Ship” shall include any ship, vessel, or boat, or description thereof used in navigation.

“Master” shall include any person, other than a pilot, in charge or command of any ship.

“Prohibited immigrant” shall mean and include the following persons:—

(a) Any person who, when asked to do so by any duly authorized officer, shall be unable through deficient education to himself write out and sign in the characters of any European language an application to the satisfaction of the Minister.

(b) Any person who is not in possession of visible means of support, or is likely to become a public charge.

(c) Any person who has been convicted of any of the following offences, that is to say, murder, rape, theft, fraud, perjury, or forgery, and who, by reason of the circumstances connected with such offence, is deemed by the Minister to be an undesirable.

(d) Any person who is a lunatic within the meaning of the second section of “The Lunacy Act, 1897.”

(e) Any person, male or female, who lives on, or knowingly receives any part of, the proceeds of prostitution.

(f) Any person who from information officially received by the Minister from any Secretary of State or from any Colonial Minister, or through diplomatic channels from any Minister of any foreign country, is deemed by the Minister to be an undesirable.

3. This Act shall not apply to—

(a) Members of His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces.

(b) The officers and crew of any public ship of any foreign State.

(c) Any person, together with his wife, family, and servants, who is duly accredited to the Colony by or under the authority of His Majesty or of the Government of any foreign State.

(d) Persons who have served in any of His Majesty's Volunteer Forces in South Africa and have received good discharges.

(e) The wife and minor child of any person who is permitted to immigrate into the Colony under the provisions of this Act.

(f) Persons domiciled in South Africa.

(g) European persons who are agricultural or domestic servants, skilled artisans, mechanics, workmen, or miners, and are able to produce a certificate signed by the Agent-General of the Colony in England or officer appointed by the Governor in England or elsewhere to grant certificates for the purposes of the Act, certifying that the person named therein has been engaged to serve, immediately on arrival in the Colony, an employer therein of repute at an adequate remuneration and for a reasonable period of time.

PART II.

PROHIBITED IMMIGRATION.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Act, it shall be unlawful for any “prohibited immigrant” to immigrate, either by land or by sea, into this Colony.

5. It shall be unlawful to aid or assist any person to immigrate into this Colony in contravention of the provisions of this Act.

Any person immigrating into this Colony and contravening any of the provisions of this Act shall be liable to be removed at any time from within the Colony and to be kept in custody as may by regulation be prescribed pending such removal.

9. Any person who aids or assists any person in the contravention of any provisions of this Act shall be liable for each offence to a penalty of £50, or in the alternative to three months' imprisonment with or without hard labour.

10. Any master of any ship who lands, or allows to land, directly or indirectly, any immigrant from his ship, whereby such immigrant contravenes any provisions of the Act, and the owners of any such ship from which any such immigrant so lands shall be jointly and severally liable to a penalty of £100, and to a further penalty of £20 for each such immigrant landed in excess of the number of five, such ship may be refused a clearance till such penalty has been paid, and may in default of payment by or on behalf of the master or owners and by order of the Supreme Court be attached and declared executable in satisfaction of any writ issued for the recovery of such penalty; provided that in lieu of granting such order it shall be lawful for the Court to accept such security for the payment of such penalty as may appear to be adequate.

11. Any person wilfully making any false statement in order to obtain any certificate or recommendation for the purposes of the Act shall on conviction be liable to a fine of not exceeding £50, or to imprisonment without the option of a fine and with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months in addition to removal from the Colony.

12. Any person entering into any contract in the capacity of employer with any persons at the time being beyond the limits of the Colony for service or employment within the Colony for the purpose of any evasion of the provisions of the Act, or being at the time unable to fulfil his part of the contract, or who became unable to fulfil his contract which, at the time it was entered into, he had no reasonable expectation of being able to fulfil, shall be liable on conviction for each offence to be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to a fine of not exceeding £100, and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

13. It shall be lawful for the Governor to prescribe penalties for the contravention of any regulation made by him under this Act, provided that no penalty in respect of any one contravention shall exceed a fine of £100, or in default of payment thereof imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period exceeding twelve months, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour and without the option of a fine for a period exceeding twelve months.

14. This Act may be cited as "The Immigration Act, 1902."
