PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz.:—

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
 (b) If such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed
- (b) If such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and

(c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the last-mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest as from and after the First day of June, 1903.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Three.

SCHEDULE.

Land called Wilpattu in Wilachchiya korale in Nuwaragampalata of the North-Central Province, and bounded on the—

North.—By the Talawe-ela from the point where it joins the boundary of the North-Western Province to the point where it is joined by the stream from Kuda Wilachchiya.

East.—From the point where the stream from Kuda Wilachchiya falls into the Talaweela, a cut line drawn south to the point where the stream which runs from Mahawewa into Kuda Wilachchiya turns to the east, thence south along the stream through Mahawewa to its source, thence a cut line south-westwards across the watershed to the Andaragollewaela, thence westwards down the Andaragollewaela to its junction with the Panela, thence south-westwards up the Panela to its source, thence a cut line across the watershed to the source of the Telbipu-ela, thence south-westwards down the Telbipu-ela to its junction with the Kala-oya.

South.—By the Kala-oya from the point where it is joined by the Telbipu-ela to the point where it crosses the boundary of the North-Central Province.

West.—By the Province boundary from the point at which it crosses the Kala-oya to the point at which it crosses the Talawe-ela.

OTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on the 1st June, 1903, at the Council Chamber, for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the periods as stated:—

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount, the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rents of the Four Gravets of Galle will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipality of Galle.
