REGULATIONS as to Issue, Surrender, Forfeiture, and Restoration of the "Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration" and the "Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal," under Royal Warrants of the 18th May, 1899, and 3rd August, 1902.

COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES OFFICERS' DECORATION.

Persons Eligible.

1. (a) Officers having 20 years' commissioned service, which need not be continuous.
- (b) Honorary Colonels and Acting Chaplains who have the qualifying service of 20 years.
- (c) Officers who have retired and have the qualifying service.

Qualifying Service.

2. (a) Service rendered partly in the Local Forces of one Colony or Protectorate and partly in the Local Forces of another Colony or Protectorate, or partly in the Local Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates and partly in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain, service on the West Coast of Africa counting double.
- (b) Half the time served in the ranks of the Auxiliary Forces of any Colony or Protectorate, Indian Volunteers, or the Volunteer Force of Great Britain.
3. Service on the Permanent Staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for the Decoration.

Applications.

4. Application for the Decoration will be made in writing by the Commanding Officer of each Corps, and will in each case be supported by a statement of the applicant's service on Form A. Commanding Officers will forward their recommendation through the usual channels of correspondence to the Governor, together with the certificate marked B or the certificate marked C.
5. The Decoration being granted as a reward for good and long service, Commanding Officers should in each case state in general terms the reason which in their opinion gives the applicant a claim to receive the Decoration.

Publication.

6. The grant of the Decoration will be published in the *Government Gazette*.
7. The letters V. D. will be inserted in the Army List against the name of the Officer to whom the Decoration is given.

Forfeiture.

8. When the conduct of an Officer after he has been awarded the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration has been such as to disqualify him for wearing it, he may be deprived of it by the Governor.

Restoration.

9. A Decoration forfeited by an Officer under the provisions of paragraph 8 may be restored to him by the Governor.

Loss.

10. When a Decoration has been lost, and it is desired to replace it, a declaration must be made before a Magistrate stating the circumstances under which the loss occurred, and the rank, name, and corps of the Officer to whom the Decoration belonged. This declaration will be forwarded to the Commandant, through the usual channel of correspondence in the case of an Officer who is still serving, and direct in the case of one who has retired. The Decoration will be replaced, on payment if the explanation as to the loss is considered satisfactory.

- Nominal roll or otherwise of any claim to the Medal will be final. Retired Members will apply through the Officer Commanding the Regiment (or Corps) in which they last served.
- Publication. 4. Commanding Officers will forward with Form D a nominal roll arranged alphabetically on Form E. This roll will be prepared in duplicate, one copy being retained by the Officer Commanding and the other forwarded with his recommendation to the Governor.
- Distribution. 5. Names of recipients will be promulgated in the *Government Gazette*, after the publication of which the original applications (Form D) will be returned by the Governor to the Headquarters of the Corps for record and retention. The distribution of the Medals will be made by the Senior Officer of the Corps, or as the Governor shall decide at the earliest time that a good muster of the Corps can be reckoned upon.
- Surrender. 6. Any Officer who is subsequently awarded the "Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration" will not be required to surrender the Medal, but he will not be permitted to wear both.
- Forfeiture. 7. When the conduct of any Member of the Auxiliary Forces after he has been awarded the "Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal" has been such as to disqualify him from wearing it, he may be deprived of it by the Governor.
- Restoration. 8. A Medal forfeited by a Member of the Auxiliary Forces under paragraph 7 may be restored to him by the Governor.
- Loss. 9. When a Long Service Medal has been lost and it is desired to replace it, a declaration must be made before a Magistrate stating the circumstances under which the loss occurred, and the rank, name, and corps of the individual to whom the Medal belonged. The declaration will be forwarded to the Governor through the usual channel of correspondence in the case of an individual who is still serving, and direct to the Governor in the case of one who has retired. The Medal will be replaced if the explanation as to its loss is considered satisfactory.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

CHAPTER IX.

Registration of Dogs.

1. *Occupiers of Houses to furnish Returns when necessary.*—It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to require every occupier of a house to fill up a schedule in the Form A in the Appendix hereto showing the number and description of dogs kept in such house or premises attached thereto, and to whom they respectively belong, and every such occupier shall be bound to accept, duly fill in with correct information, and return such schedule within one week from receipt thereof.

2. *Person acquiring Dog to give Notice.*—Every person who shall acquire, keep, or become possessed of a dog shall give notice thereof and furnish a description of the animal to the Council within one month of his acquiring or becoming possessed of such dog.

3. *Refusal of Registration until Production of Dog.*—It shall be lawful for the Chairman to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.

4. *Refusal of Certificate.*—The Chairman may refuse to issue a certificate of registration to the owner of a dog if, in the opinion of the Sanitary Officer, such dog is by reason of its suffering from some infectious or contagious disease a source of danger to the public.

5. *Registration Fee.*—An annual registration fee of Re. 1 shall be charged for each dog.

6. *Certificate.*—The certificate issued shall be in the Form B in annexed schedule.

7. *Cancellation of Certificate in case of unfitness to live.*—The certificate is liable to cancellation by the Chairman if the dog is so maimed or diseased as to be incurable and to be, in the opinion of the Chairman or the Sanitary Officer, unfit to live.

8. *Dog to be destroyed by Council when Certificate has been refused or cancelled.*—The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being notified to do so, produce the dog at the Council's Office to be destroyed.

9. *Collars for Dogs.*—Every dog kept within the limits of the Municipality shall wear a collar with the Municipal stamp, the registered number, and year of registration stamped on it.

10. *Collars to be paid for, if supplied by Council.*—If the collars are issued by the Municipal Council, authority is hereby given to charge a sum not exceeding Re. 1 per collar.

Oxford and Cambridge School Examinations.

To the Director of Public Instruction, Ceylon.

SIR,—WE are instructed to send you the following Report on the Examination for the English University Scholarship recently held at Colombo, under the authority of the Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Board,

The subjects of examination were:—

- (a) Classics (7 candidates).
Examiner : N. C. Smith, M.A., New College, Oxford.
- (b) English (7 candidates).
Examiner : O. Elton, M.A., Corpus Christi College, Oxford.
- (c) History (7 candidates).
Examiner : H. W. C. Davis, M.A., Balliol College, Oxford.

On the whole examination G. E. R. Arndt is recommended for election to the Scholarship. The following showed special merit in the examination : Soertsz and Weeresuriya in English, and Perera and Keuneman in History.

I.—General Remarks.

(a) *Latin and Greek.*—Seven candidates were examined in Latin and Greek Unseen Translation, Latin Prose, Easy Greek Prose, Latin and Greek Grammar. Of the seven candidates, four reached a very fair standard, two more were rather weak, and one was quite unable to cope with the papers. Most of them seemed to have been well grounded in grammar and the principles of Latin and Greek composition, and in translation used English which, though sometimes inaccurate and tending to mere verbiage, showed on the whole some sense of style. There was a certain weakness, in almost every paper, in grappling with difficulties.

(b) *English*.—Six out of the seven candidates showed on the whole a fair level of diligence and attainment. There was very little "foreign English;" the chief fault in the Essays and elsewhere was discursiveness and want of form.

The answers on English Language were not very good, and were too mechanical—the same instances of compounds, forms, &c., recurred, and the paraphrasing tended, even when accurate in drift, to be prosaic. Some sound work was done in English literature, and the books themselves were often carefully-mastered, but there was too much tendency to quote passages of criticism from memory without comment; no one marked the scansion with even approximate correctness.

(c) *History*.—The candidates reached, with one exception, a satisfactory level in their work. The work as a whole showed industry, and that of Perera and Keuneman considerable promise. The simpler questions produced the best answers. The strength of the candidates taken as a whole lay in knowledge of detail rather than in power of expression or reflection.

II.—A further report (not printed) containing the remarks of the Examiners on the details of the work is being sent with this.

The person whose tender is accepted by Government will be required to bear the expenses of having the security bond prepared for the due performance of the contract, which bond will be subject to the approval of the Attorney-General, but may be drawn by the tenderer's own lawyers, the name or stamp of whom should be affixed to the document.

Every alteration should bear the initials of the tenderer, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected. The stalls should be approved by the General Manager or person delegated by him.
