PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Robert Chalmers, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS on September 21, 1914, We did proclaim and publish in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,663 of the same date a Proclamation of His Majesty the King relating to trading with the enemy, called "The Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2," and did notify the same to be in force in the Colony of Ceylon:

And whereas it was amongst other things declared in the said Proclamation as follows:-

"The expression 'enemy country' in this Proclamation means the territories of the German Empire and of the dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, together with all the colonies and dependencies thereof.

"The expression 'enemy' in this Proclamation means any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident or carrying on business in the enemy country, but does not include persons of enemy nationality who are neither resident nor carrying on business in the enemy country. In the case of incorporated bodies, enemy character attaches only to those incorporated in an enemy country":

And whereas it was further declared by the said Proclamation as follows:-

"Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our license, or by the license given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, whether such licenses be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons":

And whereas by a further Proclamation dated October 17, 1914, and published in the Ceylon (fovernment Gazette No. 6,673 of October 19, 1914, it was further provided as follows:—

"That the power to grant licenses on His Majesty's behalf vested in a Secretary of State may be exercised in any British Possession not included within the limits of Canada, India, Australia, or South Africa by the Governor."

Now, therefore, We, the said Governor, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the power reserved in the said Proclamations and all other powers thereunto Us enabling, do hereby give and grant license to all persons resident and carrying on business or being in the Colony of Ceylon—

To pay any fees necessary for obtaining the grant or for obtaining the renewal of patents, or for obtaining the registration of designs or trade marks or the renewal of such registration in an "enemy country."

And also to pay on behalf of an "enemy" any fees payable in the Island of Ceylon on application for or renewal of the grant of a patent, or on application for the registration of designs or trade marks or the renewal of such registration.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fifteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

In other cases the grant will be paid on the passes obtained in the annual examination and according to the rates given in Schedules F, G, H, H 1, H 2, H 3.

Code Amendment to Clause 116.

In the 5th line of the last paragraph, after the words "Rs. 450," insert: "The total grant from all sources, except the special science grant, shall not exceed Rs. 9,000 in the upper school of a secondary school and Rs. 6,000 in the secondary department of an elementary school, and grant shall not be paid for more than 350 units in the upper school of a secondary school or for more than 200 units in the secondary department of an elementary school."

(3) (a) Before a patient is admitted into a Paying Patient's Ward, he must make a cash deposit equivalent to one week's charges. This deposit will be held to meet the charges incurred for the patient's last week's stay in hospital. Should the patient decline to make the necessary deposit he will be refused admission, or, if too ill to be sent away, he will be admitted as a non-paying patient to the least expensive ward provided for persons of the race to which he belongs.

(b) Where a patient is brought for admission to a Paying Patient's Ward, and is too ill to make the necessary deposit or to attend to business matters, a deposit will be demanded from the friends or relatives who accompany him. Should they decline to make the deposit, the Medical Officer (the Medical Superintendent in the case of Colombo) will use his discretion as to whether or not the patient is too ill to be refused admission to the hospital. In case he is too ill, he will be admitted as a non-paying patient to the least expensive ward provided for persons of the race to which he belongs.

(c) Medical Officers in charge (the Medical Superintendent in the case of Colombo)

(c) Medical Officers in charge (the Medical Superintendent in the case of Colombo) are only to accept guarantee bond in lieu of cash deposits on their own personal responsibility, and such bonds should be made in favour of the Medical Officer or responsibility, and such bonds should be made in favour of the Medical Officer or Medical Superintendent himself, provided that no personal bonds from the patients themselves are to be taken, and only bonds with sureties personally known to the Medical Officer in question may be accepted. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 16, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 137 (4 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 20 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 28.9, as against 26.1 in the preceding week, 27.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 170* (6 Burghers, 82 Sinhalese, 41 Tamils, 32 Moors, 5 Melays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.5, as against 33.9 in the previous week, 32.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 170 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 46 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-five deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in St. Paul's, 7 in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya. Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Two deaths from Smallpox were registered (in Slave Island), as against 8 in the previous week. Eight cases were reported, as against 4 in the previous week.
- 4. Two deaths from Plague were registered, as against 5 in the previous week. Of these, 1 was in San Sebastian and the other in St. Paul's. Six cases were reported, the same number as in the previous week.
- 5. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena and the other in Maradana.
- 6. Fifteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 14 from Infantile Convulsions, 13 from Debility, 8 from Diarrhaa, 5 from Dysentery, 5 from Worms, and 55 from Other Causes.
 - 7. Seven cases of Chickenpox and 1 case of Measles were reported, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $80 \cdot 0^{\circ}$, against $78 \cdot 4^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $80 \cdot 2^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 897$ in., against $29 \cdot 890$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 922$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 03$ in., against $1 \cdot 22$ in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
