BY-LAW REFERRED TO. Chapter XV.

Rubber-tyred carriages and rickshaws to have bells.

240 A. Every person driving a rubber-tyred carriage or drawing a rickshaw shall have ready and available for immediate use a suitable bell, capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of his approach and position, and shall sound the same whenever expedient to prevent danger to any of the public.

SCHEDULE.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

"THE AERIAL NAVIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 24 of 1914."


T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power in him vested by sections 3 and 8 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make order prohibiting the navigation of all aircraft absolutely and at all times—

- (a) Over the area consisting of the Colombo harbour and that portion of the town of Colombo within the Municipal limits situated north-west and west of a straight line drawn from Kollupitiya Railway Station to the Victoria bridge, including that portion of the town of Colombo, which is bounded by the Kelani river from Victoria bridge to its mouth, as shown in plan A, and signed by R. S. Templeton, Esq., Surveyor-General, dated March 13, 1913, and annexed to this Notification; and
- (b) Aircraft arriving in the Colony are permitted to land at any place in the Colony outside the areas specified in (α) above.
- 2. The signal prescribed for warning aircraft shall be a shot fired from a rifle or gun across the bows of the craft.
- 3. The "officer designated" shall be (so far as the Military Authorities are concerned) any officer, warrant officer, or non-commissioned officer, or private soldier on duty as sentry.

:" THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, 1889."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 50 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following amended rule in substitution for rule 28 of the rules dated August 3, 1906, with respect to the procedure in civil cases to be observed by Village Tribunals.

AMENDED RULE.

Civil Procedure.

28. The successful party may apply to the President for a writ of execution (Form F) to issue to the Fiscal at any time within one year and a day from the date of the final decision or order of the Village Tribunal, or, if an appeal has been taken, within one year and a day from the date when the decision or order in appeal was communicated to him.

appeal was communicated to him.

When such application shall be made and granted, no subsequent application to execute the same decree shall be granted, unless the court is satisfied that on the last preceding application due diligence was used to procure complete satisfaction of the decree, or that execution was stayed by the decree-holder at the request of the judgment-debtor. Also no such subsequent application shall be granted after the expiration of ten years from any of the following dates, namely:—

(a) The date of the decree sought to be enforced, or of the decree, if any, on appeal affirming the same; or

(b) Where the decree or any subsequent order directs the payment of money or the delivery of property to be made at a specified date, the date of the default in making the payment or delivering the property in respect of which the applicant seeks to enforce the decree.

Nothing in this section shall prevent the court from granting an application for execution of a decree after the expiration of the said term of ten years, where the judgment-debtor has by fraud or force prevented the execution of the decree at some time within ten years immediately before the date of the application.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 23, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 125 (13 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 12 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 26.4, as against 28.9 in the preceding week, 26.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 158 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 26 Moors, 5 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.3, as against 33.5 in the previous week, 28.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 158 total deaths, 44 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-one deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 25 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 3 in New Bazaar, 3 in Kollupitiya, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in San Sebastian, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in Slave Island.

- 2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Kotahena, 4 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Wellawatta. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Five deaths from Smallpox were registered, as against 2 in the previous week. Of these, 2 were in Wellawatta (including I death of a European removed from a steamer to the Infectious Diseases Hospital), 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya. Three cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.
- 4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 2 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kotahena.
- 5. One death from Plague was registered in St. Paul's, as against 2 in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 6 in the previous week.
- 6. Twenty deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 13 from Debility, 12 from Enteritis, 6 from Dysentery, 4 from Diarrhoa, 2 from Worms, 2 from Tetanus, and 52 from Other Causes.
- 7. Eighteen cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 7 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported. There was I in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·4°, against 80·0° in the preceding week and 80·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·914 in., against 29·897 in. in the preceding week and 29·873 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·18 in., against 0·03 in. in the preceding week and 0·17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
