WHEREAS by Proclamation dated March 11, 1887, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated March 18, 1887, the town of Ratnapura, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, was brought under the operation of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1876, and the limits of the said town were defined therein for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas by the operation of the provisions of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898," the said town came under the operation of the said Local Boards Ordinance, 1898:

And whereas it is expedient to re-define the limits of the said town for the purposes of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898":

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, for the purposes of the said Local Boards Ordinance, 1898, define the limits of the said town of Ratnapura to be those set out in the schedule hereto as from and after the date hereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

SCHEDULE.

*New Local Board Limits.*

*On the West.*—A line from the north-western boundary of land appearing in title plan No. 99,563, following the eastern boundary of Galkadumukalana as far as the northern boundary of the land appearing in title plan No. 100,362, and thence a straight line to the river.

*On the North and North-east.*—A line 200 feet to the north and east along the Weralupe minor road from its junction with the Colombo road between the 54th and 55th mileposts to a point where it meets the railway line, thence a line 200 feet to the north along the Outer Circular road to the point where it meets the Malwala road, then following the Malwala road as far as Magurankanagina-dola, and along this dola to its junction with Kalu-ganga.

All this land within the said limits, exclusive of the paddy fields on the north and east of the Weralupe minor road, the paddy fields to the north of the Outer Circular road, the paddy fields and tea plantations between the Malwala and Gilimale roads, and the paddy fields between Ketan-dola and Koraliwala totupola.

## NOTICE TO IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS.

THE attention of importers and exporters is directed to "The Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2," proclaimed in Ceylon on September 21, 1914. By the provisions set out in this Proclamation all persons resident, carrying on business, or being in His Majesty's Dominions are warned "not directly or indirectly to supply to or for the use or benefit of, or obtain from, an enemy country or an enemy any goods, wares, or merchandise; nor directly or indirectly to supply to or for the use or benefit of, or obtain from, any person any goods, wares, or merchandise for or by way of transmission to or from an enemy country or an enemy; nor directly or indirectly to trade in or carry any goods, wares, or merchandise destined for or coming from an enemy country or an enemy."

2. With a view to preventing breaches of this Proclamation, it is hereby notified that the Principal Collector of Customs has been authorized by His Excellency the Governor to require at his discretion certificates of origin or declarations of ultimate destination respectively to be presented in respect of all goods, wares, or merchandise imported into or exported from Ceylon in trade with any foreign place in Europe or on the Mediterranean or Black Seas, with the exception of those situated in Russia, France, Spain, and Portugal.

The certificates and declarations referred to must be in the form prescribed by the Schedules I. and II. hereto.

Any goods, wares, or merchandise imported from the above-mentioned foreign places unaccompanied by certificates of origin will be liable to detention by the Principal Collector of Customs until the requisite certificates are produced. The Principal Collector of Customs is, however, authorized in such cases, and at his discretion, to allow delivery of the goods on the security of a deposit or of a bond to the amount of three times the value of the goods with a view to the production of the necessary certificates within a prescribed period, provided that he sees no reason for suspecting that the goods emanate from any enemy country.

In addition to requiring declarations of ultimate destination as above provided, the Principal Collector of Customs is authorized to detain goods, wares, or merchandise sought to be exported until a bond to the amount of three times the value of the goods is given as security for the landing of the goods at the declared destination,

and the production within a specified time to the Principal Collector of Customs of a landing certificate substantially in the form prescribed in Schedule III. hereto in proof of such landing.

*Note.*—The following goods will be exempt from these requirements :—

- (a) Goods imported under license.
- (b) Goods shipped for Ceylon on or before February 28, 1915.
- (c) Goods in respect of which Customs export entries have been accepted before the publication of this notice.

### VITAL STATISTICS.

#### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 30, 1915.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 150 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 31.6, as against 26.4 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 140 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 16 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.5, as against 33.3 in the previous week, 31.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average of last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 140 total deaths, 50 were of infants under one year of age, as against 44 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average of last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of still births registered during the week was 4.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 21 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospital), 2 in Pettah, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar.

2. Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in Fort and Galle Face, and 1 in Slave Island. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Two deaths from *Smallpox* were registered (in Kotahena), as against 5 in the previous week. One case was reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

4. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered (in New Bazaar), as against 4 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. No deaths from *Plague* were registered. There was 1 in the previous week. Three cases were reported as in the previous week.

6. Twenty-two deaths from *Debility* were registered, 14 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 from *Tetanus*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, and 53 from *Other Causes*.

7. Ten cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 18 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 79·8°, against 80·4° in the preceding week and 80·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·879 in., against 29·914 in. in the preceding week and 29·879 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·01 in., against 0·18 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
