WHEREAS the Governor in Council is satisfied that there is danger of an outbreak of plague at Rameswaram, in the Ramnad taluk of the Ramnad district, if persons from the infected portions of the Anantapur, Bellary, Coimbatore, North Arcot, Salem, South Canara, and Trichinopoly districts, the Mysore State, the Bombay Presidency, the town of Colombo in Ceylon, and other parts declared to be infected with plague are perimitted to visit that place on the occasion of the ensuing Masi New Moon festival: In exercise of the powers delegated to him under the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, the Governor in Council prohibits the attendance at the said festival from February 8 to 19, 1915, inclusive, of persons from the said parts, and further directs that, between the said dates, no tickets to travel by railway shall be sold at the stations of Mangalore, Singanallur, Sulur, Hosur, Kelamangalam, Noyal, Pugalur, Karur, Senapparetti, Puliyur, and Kattalai on the South Indian Bailway, and the stations of Bellary, Bellary Cantonment, Obalapuram, Rayadrug, and Adoni on the Madras and South Manaratta Railway for the stations of Madura, Madura East, Silaiman, Tiruppuvan, Tiruppachetti, Muttanendal, Manamadurai, Partibamur, Kamudakkudi, Paramagudi, Pondikanmay, Satirakudi, Ramad, Valantaravai, Uchipuli, Mantapam, Pamban, Tangachimadam, Rameswaram, and Dhanushkodi Jetty on the South Indian Railway to any person intending or believed to be intending to be present at the said festival. All persons proceeding to the said festival in contravention of this notification will be turned back.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 6, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 151 (1 European, 22 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 20 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 31.8, as against 31.6 in the preceding week, 23.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.8, as against 29.5 in the previous week, 26.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 50 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average of last year.

Stillbirths .-- The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.-Seventeen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Pettah, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiye. 2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Two deaths from *Smallpox* were registered as in the previous week. Of these, 1 was in Slave Island and the other was that of a non-resident in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta. Twelve cases were reported, as against 1 in the previous week.

4. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kollupitiya and the other in Wellawatta.

5. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's. There were none in the previous week. Four cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

6. Seventeen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 9 from Diatrhæa, 3 from Enteritis, 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, and 57 from Other Causes.

7. Thirteen cases of *Ohickenpox* were reported, as against 10 in the previous week. Two cases of *Measles* were reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.8°, as in the preceding week, against 79.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.866 in., against 29.879 in. in the preceding week and 29.909 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.05 in., against 0.01 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
