ROBERT CHALMERS.

K NOW Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 2 of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," do hereby prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of all vessels to the extent specified in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date January 27, 1893, a tract of forest land, as set forth in the schedule to the said Proclamation, and within the limits therein specified and set forth, was, under the provisions of section 19 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," declared to be a reserved forest subject to certain rights:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that certain portions of the said land so reserved as aforesaid should cease to be reserved:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by sub-section (2) of section 6 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1907, do hereby direct that the portions of the said land specified and set forth in the schedule hereto shall cease to be reserved as from and after the date hereof.

And We do in all other respects confirm the said Proclamation of January 27, 1893.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

Notification.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is satisfied that there is danger of an outbreak of plague at Rameswaram, in the Ramnad taluk of the Ramnad district, if persons from the infected portions of the Anantapur, Bellary, Coimbatore, North Arcot, Salem, South Canara, and Trichinopoly districts, the Mysore State, the Bombay Presidency, the town of Colombo in Ceylon, and other parts declared to be infected with plague are permitted to visit that place on the occasion of the ensuing Masi New Moon festival:

All persons proceeding to the said festival in contravention of this notification will be turned back.

14. The Government reserves to itself the right to cancel the contract on one month's notice, if same is not conducted in accordance with the conditions and to complete satisfaction of the General Manager.

15. All alterations or erasures in tenders should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

16. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

17. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

18. Before tender forms are supplied to persons wishing to tender, they will have to satisfy the General Manager or person delegated by him that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, and for this purpose they must be prepared to produce documentary or other evidence if called for.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 6, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 151 (1 European, 22 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 20 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 31.8, as against 31.6 in the preceding week, 23.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.8, as against 29.5 in the previous week, 26.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 50 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Pettah, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Two deaths from *Smallpox* were registered as in the previous week. Of these, 1 was in Slave Island and the other was that of a non-resident in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta. Twelve cases were reported, as against 1 in the previous week.

4. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kollupitiya and the other in Wellawatta.

5. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's. There were none in the previous week. Four cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

6. Seventeen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 9 from *Diarrrhea*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

7. Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 10 in the previous week. Two cases of *Measles* were reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·8°, as in the preceding week, against 79·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·866 in., against 29·879 in. in the preceding week and 29·909 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·05 in., against 0·01 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
