### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on December 19, 1914, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 15, 1914.

*Present:* The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. La Brooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 21 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

## 2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1913 to November 30, 1914, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for November.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of November.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for November.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during November.

## 4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 21 of November 19, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* triennial election of Councillors.—Read.  
 (2) Letter No. 22 of November 25, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Government is prepared to pay the cost of providing fire plugs at the Kaolcheri, District Court Buildings, Police Station, and the Public Offices at Bogambra.—Read.

(3) Letter of December 3 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Director of Public Works *re* fire extinguishing apparatus, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 23 of November 26, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that it has been found necessary to reduce or delete the grants made on account of certain works.

Mr. Beven proposed—That application be made to Government for even half the vote for the conservancy of the lake if the full amount cannot be granted. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter No. 24 of November 27 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* re-nomination of nominated Councillors.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 25 of December 11, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* acquisition of a strip of land for widening the road at the entrance to the cemetery.—Read.

(7) Letter No. 26 of December 12, 1914, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction the placing of such portion of the Municipal Fund as the Council think fit in the National Bank of India (Kandy Branch).—Read.

(8) Letter of December 11 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Mr. N. I. Lee appointing him to act as Municipal Magistrate from December 24, 1914, to January 3, 1915, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(9) Letter No. 174 of December 4 from the Hon. the Treasurer requesting remittance of the sum of Rs. 3,550 already paid on account of maintenance of Lady Horton's walk and conservancy of lake.

Resolved—That no action be taken pending reply of Government to application for half the vote for the conservancy of the lake.

(10) Letter No. 16,126 of November 24, 1914, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, *re* increased Police bill for the year 1914.—Read.

(11) Petition from the residents of Lady Anderson's road and its neighbourhood asking that a few street lamps be put up and steps taken to render the road fit for vehicular traffic.

Resolved—That the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit an estimate for 6 kerosine oil lamps.

5. Papers *re* alleged sale of sand from the Kandy lake by Overseer Simon.

Resolved—That the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works be approved, and the matter left entirely in the hands of the Chairman.

6. Papers *re* subsidy of Rs. 1,200 a year to the Kandy Public Band.

Mr. Wijegoonewardene moved—That the subsidy be withdrawn from January 31, 1915. Mr. Weerasooria seconded.

Mr. LaBrooy moved as an amendment—That the subsidy be withdrawn from March 31 if there is no marked improvement. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

7. Papers *re* removal of trees in Ward street.

Resolved—That the three trees opposite Messrs. Pláte & Co. and the Mercantile Bank be removed at once.

## 8. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Municipal Works.*

(1) That the post of Assistant to the Superintendent of Works, which the Council sanctioned on Rs. 1,200 rising to Rs. 1,800 a year, be styled Inspector of Works, and that applications be called for.

Mr. Beven moved—That the appointment be not filled for six months, and the matter be brought up again at the May Meeting of Council. Mr. La Brooy seconded.—Carried.

(2) That a nominal rent of Re. 1 a year be charged for the encroachment opposite premises No. 20, Hill street.

(3) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to 28/29, Trincomalee street, S. Meeyan; No. 1014, Peradeniya road, D. Vaidatilleke; No. 726-738, Peradeniya road, J. W. Samara-weera.

Resolved—That recommendations (2) and (3) be adopted.

9. Supplemental Budget No. 2 of 1914.

Resolved—That the Budget be passed.

10. With the leave of the Council Mr. Pieris moved—That the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, be requested to start the first passenger train from Kandy to Matale at 7.15 A.M., instead of 5.45 A.M., and the last passenger train at 5.45 P.M., instead of 5 P.M. Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.—Carried.

11. With the leave of the Council the Chairman moved—That a Special Committee be appointed to consider the list of duties framed by the Medical Officer of Health for the officers of the Health Department, and also to draw up duties for the Revenue Inspectors. Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded, and the following Committee was appointed :— Messrs. Beven, La Brooy, Pieris, Dr. de Saram, and the Chairman.

## Health Officer's Report for the Month of December, 1914.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Slaughter-house.—Clean and well kept.

Night Soil Dept.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food Supply.—Good. During the month 585 cattle, 107 buffaloes, 25 sheep, and 330 goats were passed. Six head of cattle, 3 buffaloes, and 8 goats were rejected.

The following organs were condemned and destroyed :—Three livers and 2 lungs of cattle, 4 livers and 1 lung of buffaloes, 2 livers of sheep, 3 livers and 12 lungs of goats.

The health of the town during the month was good. Four cases of chickenpox, 1 case of measles, and 4 cases of smallpox were reported. All necessary precautions are being taken to stamp out the last-named disease.

Vaccination.—All the market stall-holders, space-holders, coolies, and their families and servants were vaccinated, and are kept under observation.

Rats and Snails.—1,712 rats and 832,000 snails were destroyed during the month.

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

"An improved apparatus for coagulating rubber latex and drying rubber."

*Abstract*:—An endless flexible wire rope, or leather core, passing over pulleys travels vertically through a receptacle containing rubber latex. The latex adheres to that travelling core, and as the core travels it passes through a vertical tube in which it is made to meet a current of smoke or other fumes by which it is coagulated and dried. The invention is the manner of making the receptacle to contain the rubber latex and allow the flexible core to pass through the bottom of it without leakage of the latex. One or more flexible diaphragms pierced to allow the flexible core to pass through them are used for the bottom of the receptacle. The vertical tube where coagulation and drying takes place is also claimed.

The claims are:—

1. In apparatus for coagulating rubber latex and drying rubber a receptacle for holding rubber latex, constructed substantially as described and illustrated, so that the latex is contained in the receptacle and cannot leak out while the flexible core is passing vertically through the receptacle substantially in the manner described and illustrated in the specification and drawings.

2. Apparatus for coagulating rubber latex and drying rubber by the taking up of the latex on to the flexible core passing vertically through the receptacle, thereby ensuring the deposit of an even coating of latex on to the flexible core substantially in the manner described and illustrated in the specification and drawings.

3. A vertical tube for coagulating rubber latex and drying rubber by creating a continuous even draught of smoke passing upward through the vertical tube containing the flexible core, which draught of smoke coagulates the latex and carries away the moisture from the coagulated film on the flexible core, thereby ensuring the proper and thorough coagulation of the latex and drying of the coagulated film substantially in the manner described and illustrated in the specification and drawings.

4. A combined apparatus for coagulating rubber latex and drying rubber, comprising the receptacle, flexible core, and tube referred to in claims 1, 2, and 3 substantially as described and illustrated in the specification and drawings.

"Improvements in apparatus for withering, or welking, or for drying tea leaf and the like."

*Abstract*:—The inventor states:—

My invention relates to apparatus for withering, or welking, or for drying tea leaf or the like (I will refer to it as leaf), and is especially adapted for treating green tea leaf preparatory to rolling it.

According to my invention I provide a withering, welking, or drying chamber (preferably an elongated rectangular chamber), in which are travelling webs or other suitable carriers of material such, for instance, as reticulated or perforated metal, or tilting louvre-trays, or the equivalent, for carrying the leaf through the said chamber, and I combine, with the said chamber, an air heater from which the heated air is received at the adjoining end of the said chamber, so that the heated air passes in efficient contact with the leaf carried along by the travelling webs, trays, or the like, and the said heated air can be forced by an impelling fan along the said chamber to the feeding end thereof, where it may escape through an opening or door in the roof or other suitable part of the said chamber, through an exhaust fan which I provide at the feeding end for use when required.

The claims are:—

1. In apparatus of the kind aforesaid for withering, or welking, or for drying tea leaf or the like, the combination with the air-heating appliance and the withering, welking, or drying chamber, of an impelling fan and an exhaust fan arranged substantially as hereinbefore explained.

2. In an apparatus in accordance with the preceding claiming clause, the combination of means for working the impelling and exhaust fans conjointly, or independently, substantially as hereinbefore explained.

3. The arrangement and combination of parts constituting an apparatus in accordance with either of the preceding claiming clauses, the said apparatus being constructed, or arranged, substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
