"Improvements in rotary pumps and motors."

Abstract.—The inventor states :—

This invention relates to improvements in rotary pumps and motors and has reference to pumps and motors having radial bodily diametrically opposed cylinders, whose connected pistons co-operate with an internal eccentric, so that the working fluid is received into the outer ends of the cylinders during one part of the revolution of the cylinder body and expelled from those cylinders during the other part of the revolution.

The present invention comprises a particular construction of such apparatus designed for simplicity of manufacture, steadiness of delivery, and efficiency of operation, and involves essentially a casing divided into suction and delivery chambers by bridges in contact with which the cylinder body rotates and a plurality of piston structures reciprocate at angles one to the other. This type of apparatus has previously been employed for pumps of very small size with two cylinders and a single piston structure co-operating with an eccentrically situated pin, but it will be readily understood that since with one piston structure there can only be one suction stroke and one delivery stroke per revolution, the delivery would be subject to considerable pulsation. To remedy this it would be necessary to increase the number of cylinders and piston structures, but hitherto this has not been accomplished. With the single piston structure extending right across the centre of the machine it has hitherto been impossible to employ more than one such piston structure, and the primary feature of my present invention is the construction and arrangement whereby a plurality of piston structures reciprocate at an angle to the other piston structure or structures in the same plane of rotation. In order to accomplish this I provide a construction whereby the trunks or members of the piston structures connecting the opposite pistons are arranged in different planes, and each piston structure co-operates in a different plane with the eccentric from which the reciprocation of all the pistons is derived. In order to eliminate friction I provide each piston structure with a separate roller or sleeve rotatable upon the eccentric common to all the pistons, so that each piston structure has its own eccentric roller which can rotate relatively to similar rollers with which the other piston structures reciprocate. The reciprocation of the piston is, as aforesaid, derived from rollers or cylinders mounted eccentrically to the axis of rotation of the cylinder body, which is, of course, the primary axis of the machine, and it will be understood that the stroke of the pistons will depend upon the degree to which the one axis is eccentric to the other, and in order to provide for variation of delivery and reversal of flow in this type of apparatus, I propose to provide means for varying this eccentricity in order to vary the stroke of the pistons. This variation of stroke may be effected by bodily sliding the eccentric rollers relative to the primary axis of the machine, or by providing these rollers on compound eccentrics, so that the rotation of one eccentric about the other will cause variation of the eccentricity. It will be understood that if provision is made for adjustment of the eccentric centre to either side of the primary axis of the machine reversibility can also be provided for with the cylinder body rotating always in one direction. The cylinders can all be arranged in the same plane, or more than one row of cylinders can be provided, in which case the cylinders of one row or plane may be staggered in position relative to those in the other row or plane.

The claims are:—

1. A rotary hydraulic machine of the type wherein the cylinder body rotates in contact with bridges dividing a casing into suction and delivery chambers characterized by each of the piston structures forming two pistons which reciprocate in unison, and the reverse piston structures in the same plane reciprocate at angles one to the other.
 2. A hydraulic machine of the type wherein the cylinder body rotates in contact with bridges dividing a casing into suction and delivery chambers characterized by the employment of a plurality of piston structures reciprocating at angles one to the other in the same plane by reason of the co-operation of each piston structure with its separate roller, the rollers for each piston structure being carried upon a common eccentric, and each piston structure comprising two diametrically opposed pistons which reciprocate in unison.
 3. A rotary hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, characterized by the provision of a non-rotary eccentric pin common to all the piston structures, said non-rotary eccentric pin supporting rotary rollers or sleeves arranged side by side, so that each piston structure co-operates with its own roller which can rotate relatively to the rollers co-operating with the other piston structures.
 4. A rotary hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, characterized by the provision of one bridge of greater circumferential length than the other bridge, whereby the shock due to liquid pressure upon one side of the machine precedes the shock due to vacuum on the other side of the machine as the cylinders pass the bridge.
 5. A hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, wherein means are provided for varying the eccentricity of the piston actuating eccentrics.
 6. A hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, having cylinders in different planes of rotation, all the cylinders being associated with common suction and delivery chambers.
 7. In a hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, having a cylinder body or roter rotating within a casing divided into suction and delivery chambers by bridges, the provision of removable bridges and interchangeable liners for finitely adjusting the bridges to enable wear to be readily compensated for substantially as specified.
 8. In a hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, a compound eccentric having one eccentric member provided with an internally toothed flange mounted upon a disc slidable within limits upon the face of the said eccentric member, a second eccentric member provided with teeth, and a pinion gearing the two eccentric members together, whereby the rotation of the pinion causes the relative rotation of the two eccentric members and the varying of the effective eccentricity.
 9. A hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, wherein the eccentricity of the eccentric devices actuating the pistons is rendered variable by bodily movement in either direction in a plane at right angles to the axis of the machine.
 10. The rotary hydraulic machine as described and illustrated.

"An improved apparatus for burning oil or spirits in lamps, stoves, or heaters."

Abstract.—The inventor states:—

My invention is for rendering bottles or similar vessels containing oil or spirit used for lamps or burners or stoves absolutely safe by preventing all chance of the unintended escape of the oil or spirit in case such vessels are accidentally upset.

The object above described is attained by the use of a stopper or disc, which may be made of any material or any shape, so constructed as to fit tightly into the neck of a bottle or similar vessel a few inches or less than an inch below the orifice. Rubber or any other suitable material may be employed for the fitting in of this disc, so that the contents of the bottle or similar vessel cannot pass beyond it.

Through the centre of the stopper or disc is fitted a hollow tube in such a manner that the lower end of the tube can be passed down into the bottle or similar vessel as far below the disc as may be desired. The top end of the tube may be left open for the insertion of a wick.

The tube is to be attached to the mouth of the bottle or similar vessel by any suitable contrivance, so as to strengthen the whole apparatus and keep it in position and prevent any unnecessary strain on the discs and so render it impervious to any possible leakage. The tube must be passed through the disc in such a way that it does not admit of any leakage between the outside of the tube and the disc at any point of contact, and this end could be attained by the use of rubber washers—or any suitable contrivance for preventing leakages. Where it is not desired to vary the length of the tube below the disc, the leakage difficulty at this point will not occur, as the tube can then be soldered or otherwise permanently fixed into the disc or made in one piece with it.

The claims are:—

1. A tube combined with the stopper or disc through which a wick can be passed into the oil or spirit contained in any bottle or similar vessel intended for use as a lamp or heaters for stoves or burners substantially as herein before described.
2. The combined apparatus of a stopper or disc and tube referred to in claim 1 for the purpose of preventing the unintended escape of oil or spirits contained in bottles or similar vessels intended for use as lamps, burners, or stoves, substantially as hereinbefore described.

"Improvements in and relating to portable houses."

Abstract.—The inventor states:—

This invention relates to portable houses, huts, or tents, and has for its objects to provide a structure which when dismantled occupies a comparatively small space, so that it may be readily transported, and which is capable of being quickly assembled, erected, and dismantled. A further feature of the invention consists in that the construction is such that the area of the floor space may be readily increased or diminished by the addition or removal of sections.

The claims are:—

1. A portable house, hut, or tent, having each side and end wall hinged longitudinally and midway of its depth, a roof hinged longitudinally and midway of its width, and a floor hinged longitudinally and midway of its width, substantially as herein described.
2. A portable house, hut, or tent, comprising foldable separate side and end walls terminating in vertical posts, means for securing the posts together at each corner, a foldable roof supported upon said walls, and a foldable floor within said walls, substantially as herein described.
3. A portable house, hut, or tent, comprising a roof side and end walls, each composed of a framework foldable horizontally and covered on the outside with canvas or like material, and a floor composed of a foldable framework boards carried in said framework, and a covering of matting or like material, substantially as herein described.
