 In a hydraulic machine, as set forth in claim 1, having a cylinder body or roter rotating within a casing divided into suction and delivery chambers by bridges, the provision of removable bridges and interchangeable liners for finitely adjusting the bridges to enable wear to be readily compensated for substantially as specified.

orthes. Rubber or any other suitable material may be employed for the fitting in of this disc, so that the contents of the bottle or similar vessel cannot pass beyond it. Through the centre of the stopper or disc is fitted a hollow tube in such a manner that the lower end of the tube can be passed down into the bottle or similar vessel as far below the disc as may be desired. The top end of the tube may be left open for the insertion of a wick. The tube is to be attached to the mouth of the bottle or similar vessel by any suitable contrivance, so as to strengthen

The tube is to be attached to the mouth of the bottle of similar vessel by any subtuble contrivance, so as to strangthem the whole apparatus and keep it in position and prevent any unnecessary strain on the discs and so render it impervious to any possible leakage. The tube must be passed through the disc in such a way that it does not admit of any leakage between the outside of the tube and the disc at any point of contact, and this end could be attained by the use of rubber washers—or any suitable contrivance for preventing leakages. Where it is not desired to vary the length of the tube below the disc, the leakage difficulty at this point will not occur, as the tube can then be soldered or otherwise permanently fixed into the disc or made in one piece with it.
