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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, January 15, 1915.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 8, 1915.

*Present*:—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. C. S. Burns; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; and Capt. P. W. Mathew, R.A.M.C.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 18, 1914, having been previously printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of December 18, 1914, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice the Chairman read the following:—

#### *Statement re Plague.*

Only 23 further cases have been reported since the last meeting of Council, of these 22 have proved fatal, 20 were septicaemic in character and 3 bubonic. Only 11 infected rats have been found. These were trapped at Bridge street, Canal Row, Uplands road, Wellawatta road, Malay street, Akbar's lane, Mohandiram's lane, Nagalagam street, and Silver-smith street. The areas affected by human plague during the period are Kochchikade, San Sebastian, Layard's Broadway, Wolfendahl, Maligakanda, 2nd Cross street, Forbes lane, Gintupitiya street, and Colpetty road.

#### *Smallpox.*

Mr. C. P. Dias asked that the public may be kept informed of the localities in which smallpox occurred, as this would tend to make the inhabitants of the infected areas more watchful in guarding against the spread of infection.

The Chairman undertook to furnish this information and give it all the publicity possible:

#### *Motions.*

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. A. Perera moved that a Committee be appointed to consider and report on the new Vehicles Ordinance.

On the suggestion of the Chairman Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the matter be considered by the Law and Finance Committees.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. A. Perera moved that a Special Committee be appointed—
- To formulate a scheme for reducing the cost of establishment without impairing the efficiency.
  - To inquire into the present rates of pay of all Municipal officers with a view to ascertain the adequacy or otherwise of such pay.
  - To frame rules and regulations governing the appointment, duties, salaries, and promotions of all Municipal officers.
  - Generally to make such recommendations in regard to the working of the various departments as will ensure greater efficiency, coupled with a reduction in the cost.

Having spoken to his motion Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the Special Committee consist of Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. H. L. de Mel, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, Mr. C. S. Burns, Mr. W. C. S. Ingles, the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman, and the mover. Mr. C. S. Burns seconded.—Carried unanimously.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. E. V. Ratnam presented a petition from Mr. Ambrose de Alvis, the owner of premises No. 25, St. John's road, and moved that the permission prayed for be granted to the petitioner.

The petition was presented. The Chairman promised to consider the matter and stated that he would refer the petition to the Works Committee for consideration. A copy of the petition had not been forwarded to him.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene stated that if Dr. Ratnam pressed for the consideration of the matter by Council, he would second the motion. Dr. Ratnam thereupon wished it to be considered, and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded the motion.

Mr. J. A. Perera spoke in favour of the motion and formally moved that the petition be read. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

The petition was then read by the Secretary.

Mr. Arthur Alvis spoke against the motion.

Mr. C. S. Burns moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Works Committee for consideration. The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. S. Burns moved that, in view of the rapidity with which repaired surfaces of roads become bad again, it is desirable that a Special Committee be appointed to go into the question of road upkeep generally and report to the Council.

The Chairman explained the difficulties in dealing with this subject, which he said had been receiving the fullest attention of the Works Engineer and of the Acting Works Engineer. The former when in England recently had a special interview with the officials of the Road Board. So far no solution of the problem had been found. The policy of the Council was to replace gravel roads by metalled roads. The following are the principal local difficulties:—

- Local stone was not suitable for water macadam as it was of uneven grain and hardness.
- The want of foundations to Colombo roads which, for the most part, consisted of a thin crust on a sandy soil.
- The adverse climatic conditions.
- The bullock cart traffic; the thin metal tyres cutting into the surface like a knife.

The remedies are:—

- The discovery of suitable tar macadam or some tar binding preparation—such as Tarco. Mr. Kilmister, when in Australia, had made himself acquainted with a very satisfactory preparation, Kiton, with which he had successfully experimented on a small section of our roads, but, unfortunately, this preparation being a German one was no longer obtainable.
- The extension of granite setts to carry the bullock cart traffic.
- A law for enforcing the widening of bullock cart tyres.

The Chairman suggested that the matter be referred to the Works Committee for their consideration, and that the Hon. the Director of Public Works be kindly asked to assist that Committee in their deliberations.

Mr. C. S. Burns agreed to the Chairman's suggestion by way of an amendment to his motion. Mr. J. A. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

#### *Election of Committees.*

7. The Council proceeded to elect Members to form the four Standing Committees for 1915 in terms of section 94 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, voting by ballot. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman as follows:—

- Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects:—Mr. L. B. Fernando, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, and Mr. J. A. Perera.
- Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets:—Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, and Mr. F. R. Senanayake.
- Standing Committee on Finance:—Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. H. L. de Mel, and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene.
- Standing Committee on Municipal Works:—Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. J. A. Perera.

8. To re-appoint the following Special Committees:—

- Special Committee on Drainage Works.
- Special Committee to consider the Government Housing Bill.
- Special Committee of inquiry with regard to the Waterworks Contract.

With reference to the Special Committee on Drainage Works, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that Dr. W. P. Rodrigo be appointed in place of Dr. David Rockwood. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the Special Committee to consider the Government Housing Bill, and the Special Committee of Inquiry with regard to the Waterworks Contract be re-appointed.

9. To consider the proposed street lines for Regent street.

The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., thanked the members for postponing the consideration of this question at the last Meeting owing to his absence and said that he would, with the permission of the Council, withdraw the remarks he had made on the papers bearing on the subject in the light of the further information he had since received from the Chairman with regard to Norris Canal road.

The Chairman moved that the proposed street lines for Regent street be passed and forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for sanction. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., left the meeting at this stage.)

10. To sanction the renewal of Messrs. Delmege Forsythe's contract for the supply of Motor Spirit.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the renewal of the contract be sanctioned. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

11. To cancel the unexpended portion of leave granted to Mr. N. M. Ingram, Works Engineer.

The Chairman moved that the unexpended portion of leave be cancelled. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 12, 13, and 14 on the agenda. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.

(Council in Committee.)

12. To consider an application from Messrs. Boustead Brothers for the erection of a temporary overhead electric line at Elibank road.

Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Law, Finance, and Municipal Works. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

13. To consider a proposal by the Provincial Engineer to raise the Jawatta road, the cost of which will be borne by Government.

Mr. J. A. Perera raised the question as to what effect the raising of the road would have on adjoining private lands, and moved that the matter be deferred and referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.

The Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman explained that the road is below flood level, and so is the land on the eastern side, and that Government was merely anticipating what he understood to be a proposed Municipal improvement.

The motion was put to the Meeting and, on a show of hands being taken, it was declared carried. (At this stage the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman and Capt. P. W. Mathew, R.A.M.C., left the Meeting.)

14. To sanction the recommendations embodied in the following report of the Retrenchment Committee:—

*The Report of the Retrenchment Committee.*

The Special Committee on Retrenchment appointed by the Council on August 28, 1914, met on the following dates, viz., November 20, 1914, and December 16, 1914.

The following recommendations are submitted by the Committee for the consideration of Council:—

- (1) Recommended that the contribution towards the Volunteer Band be discontinued as from January 1, 1915.
- (2) Recommended that the contribution towards the Law Library be suspended as from January 1, 1915.
- (3) Recommended that the St. Paul's Ward Dispensary be discontinued, after due notice has been given to the landlord and the dispenser and staff.
- (4) Recommended that no fresh uniforms be issued from the commencement of the year.
- (5) Recommended that the suggestions of Works Engineer be adopted, and that the work at the workshop be carried on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and that it be closed from Friday night to Tuesday morning.
- (6) Recommended that the Financial Assistant's suggestions be adopted, and that the following votes be reduced as follows:—E.—(c) 16 to be reduced by Rs. 6,500; H.—(a) 1 to be reduced by Rs. 3,000, (b) to be reduced by Rs. 10,000, (c) to be reduced by Rs. 10,000, (d) to be reduced by Rs. 1,600, (e) to be reduced by Rs. 3,500, (f) to be reduced by Rs. 1,000; I.—(b) to be reduced by Rs. 6,000, (d) to be reduced by Rs. 14,000, (e) to be reduced by Rs. 5,500, (f) to be reduced by 10,000, (g) 36 to be reduced by Rs. 10,000, (h) to be reduced by Rs. 8,000, (i) 55 recommended that the use of electric fans be discontinued except for Heads of Departments, (k) 1 to be reduced by Rs. 6,000, (l) 7 to be reduced by Rs. 5,000.
- (7) Recommended that Mr. South's services be dispensed with and that he be given three months' notice.
- (8) Recommended that the stores mentioned in the list submitted by the Financial Assistant be sold by public auction by the Financial Assistant, after advertisement in the local papers (English and vernacular) and by handbills.

The Committee also recommend that the votes of the various departments be reduced by the amounts set out in the annexed statement.

I agree to the report generally, but so far as the Ferguson's road bridge is concerned I entirely disagree. This vote is altogether different from those in which retrenchment has been suggested. Retrenchment should be exercised only in cases of improvements, the postponement of which will cause no inconvenience to the public, but the re-opening of Ferguson's road is a matter of great urgency and special need. This road has been closed to the public for a number of years to the great inconvenience of the residents of the locality and the public generally. I strongly protest against this work being further postponed.

*Resolutions.*

With reference to item No. 1, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the recommendation should stand. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved as an amendment, that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that, in the meanwhile, the Chairman should ascertain from the responsible officers whether they can give any assurance that, in the event of the contribution being continued, the Band will not be disbanded. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The amendment was then put to the meeting as the substantive motion and declared carried 9 voting for it and 6 against.

With reference to item No. 2, the Chairman explained that this recommendation cannot be passed, as it is definitely laid down in the Ordinance that this sum must be paid to the Law Library.

Resolved that the recommendation be deleted.

With reference to item No. 3, Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the recommendation be deleted from the report and be referred to the Sanitation Committee, and that the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health be obtained on the subject. Mr. F. R. Senanayake seconded.

The Chairman stated that the Medical Officer of Health was strongly opposed to the retrenchment. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Mr. H. L. de Mel supported the motion. The motion was put to the Meeting and declared carried.

Resolved that the recommendation under item No. 4 be adopted.

Resolved that the recommendation under item No. 5 be adopted, and that the word "namely" be inserted in place of the word "and" in the first line.

With reference to I. (i) 55—Electric fans and lamps—it was resolved that, with the exception of those used by Heads of Departments, electric fans be discontinued in all departments other than in the Town Hall and the Assessor's office.

With reference to item No. 7, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the recommendation be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendation under item No. 8 be adopted.

The statement showing the votes of the various departments and the reductions proposed was then considered *seriatim*.

Resolved that under C. 8—Telephones—the proposed reduction of Rs. 880 be not made; under H. 9—Library—the proposed reduction be deleted.

With reference to I. (c)—Roads, bridges, culverts, drains, &c.—Mr. T. L. Villiers moved that the details of the proposed reduction of Rs. 50,000 be submitted. Mr. C. S. Burns seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared *lost*.

With reference to (k)—Extraordinary—Ferguson's road, Rs. 12,500, Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the vote be maintained and that the proposed reduction be not effected. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias spoke in favour of the motion.

The motion was put to the Meeting and, on a show of hands being taken, 7 voted for it and 7 against.

The Chairman gave his casting vote against the motion.

Thereupon Mr. L. B. Fernando called for a division and the Council divided as follows :—

The Chairman then moved that the heading be allowed to remain on the budget, and that the money should be voted to carry out this work as soon as funds are available. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the Chairman be authorized to effect retrenchments as shown in the statement with the exception of those specially mentioned. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume, and that the recommendations as amended be adopted. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

#### *Council Agenda (continued).*

The Chairman, in Council, moved that the recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

15. To authorize the Chairman to forward to the Hon. the Attorney-General copies of the recommendations of the Special Committee on the Government Housing Bill, to be submitted to the Members of the Special Committee of the Legislative Council for their consideration. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the authority be granted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

16. To sanction the application for six months' leave from Dr. L. F. Hirst, Municipal Bacteriologist.

The Chairman, with the special leave of Council, moved that the leave be granted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

17-18. Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the following items on the agenda, namely, Nos. 17 and 18, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(17) To sanction excess leave of 2 days over 42 days granted to Mr. D. W. A. Wickremasinghe, Head Draughtsman City Sanitation Department.
