NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:—

No. 1,437 of December 9, 1914.

William James Melhuish.

"Improvements in the manufacture of vegetable milk and its derivatives."

Abstract:—

This invention relates to improvements in artificial or vegetable milk, such improvements being based on the idea of making the said milk more closely resemble cows' milk in taste, in use, and in keeping qualities.

The people of the East make an emulsion of the soya bean, more or less milk-like in consistency, and containing a due proportion of albumen and fat. It is, and apparently always has been, a nauseous beverage to the Western palate, but its food value is beyond all question. The nature of the improvements according to the present invention are found in the claims.

The claims are:—

1. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from the soya beans or soya seeds, the separation of the oil by crushing the oils from the beans or seeds prior to making the meal, or from the meal itself prior to the extraction of the casein, or after the casein extraction is completed, by passing the resulting liquor through a centrifugal separator, substantially as herein described.

2. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from the soya beans or soya seeds, thoroughly emulsifying the milk to prevent the cream from ever separating out and rising to the top, except by prolonged chemical and mechanical means, substantially as herein described.

3. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from the soya beans or soya seeds, the improvement in the colour of the product by substituting for the dark malt extract previously employed a dry crystalline or powdered form of maltose, or a grape sugar, or dextrin, substantially as herein described.

4. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from soya beans or soya seeds, the building up of the oils in order to produce a synthetic cream similar in character to cows' milk cream by the addition of such fatty acids as may be necessary to make the said oils into a synthetic cows' milk cream, substantially as herein described.

5. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from soya beans or soya seeds, the addition of citric acid to form a citrate of calcium for the production of a sharp or clean flavour and to render the milk antiscorbutic, substantially as herein described.

6. The production of a lactic culture for addition to artificial or vegetable milk made from the soya beans or soya seeds by development of the bacteria in sterile (or pasteurized) synthetic milk from day to day, substantially as herein described.

7. Lengthening the life of artificial or vegetable milk made from the soya beans or soya seeds in which a lactic culture has been developed by pasteurizing same after the development of the culture, substantially as herein described.

8. In the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from the soya beans or soya seeds, increasing the proportion of cream in the milk for the production of artificial butter, or for making a thick, clotted cream in the Devon or Cornish style, by building up the cream by the addition of solid, semi-solid, or liquid fats to make a thick cream, substantially as herein described.

9. A process for the manufacture of artificial or vegetable milk from the soya beans or soya seeds of various qualities and grades, substantially as herein described.

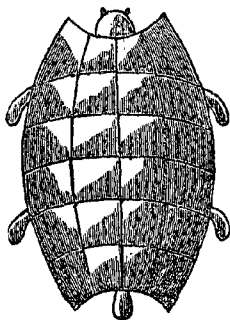

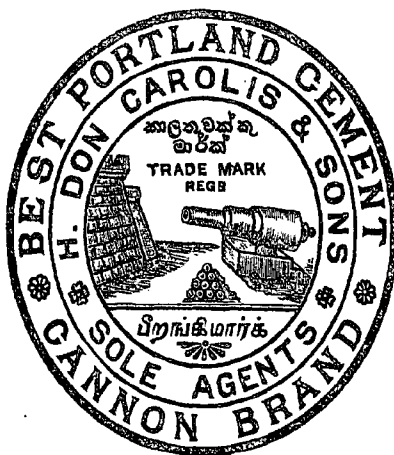

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 16, 1915, at 8 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 12, 1915.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 19, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1913 to December 31, 1914, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for December.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for December.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during December.

4. Correspondence :—

(i.) Letter No. 3 of January 7 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Colonial Auditor intimating that he has been nominated by His Excellency the Governor to be Auditor of the Municipal accounts for the year 1915, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(ii.) Letter No. 17,579 of December 21 from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, stating that he is unable to recommend that permits be issued to roadside vendors within the Municipal limits.

Resolved—That sites 1 to 12, excluding 2 and 5, in list submitted by the Chief Inspector be approved, and that permits for their temporary occupation be given in terms of section 233 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910."

5. Report of Special Committee appointed to consider the duties of the officers of the Health Department.

Resolved—That the report be adopted with the following amendments :—

- (i.) *Duties of the Sanitary Superintendent* : Add the words "in ink" after the word "initial" in item 4.
- (ii.) *Duties of Sanitary Inspectors* : Add the words "and the drains" after "scavenging" in item 11.

6. Papers *re* renewal of electric lighting contract. Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by Mr. LaBrooy—"That no fresh contract be entered into at the present time, but that the Colombo Gas and Water Company be requested to continue the lighting of the town for another year on the same terms as at present.—Carried.

7. Papers *re* transfer of a portion of the Municipal Fund from the Mercantile Bank to the National Bank of India, Limited, Kandy Branch. On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee, and it was resolved that a sum of Rs. 75,000 be placed in the fixed deposit in the Mercantile Bank for a term of 1 year, and a sum of Rs. 50,000 placed in the fixed deposit in the National Bank of India, Limited, Kandy Branch, for a term of 4 months from February 1, 1915.

The Council resumed, and the resolution passed in Committee was adopted.

8. Papers *re* encroachment opposite No. 14, Matale road. Mr. LaBrooy proposed.—That the Council do authorize Mr. G. F. Buultjens, Superintendent of Municipal Works, to enter the premises to effect the removal of the encroachment. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried unanimously.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Municipal Works.

(1) That a vote of Rs. 78 be allowed to meet expenditure on account of the Municipal cattle sheds.

(2) That the following estimates be sanctioned :—

- (a) Silt trap at the head of the lake, Rs. 248.75; (b) Silt trap near the Judge's Bungalow, Rs. 100.34.

(3) That the following application for house service pipes on usual terms be allowed :—

- (1) S. Kitchillan, 9A, Slaughter-house road; (2) Rev. E. E. Taylor, St. Paul's school; (3) D. A. Perera, 9, Kirk street (for an Aerated Water Factory).

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

10. To sanction leave in excess of 30 days granted to the following officers :—

- Mr. V. Pereira, Accountant 3 days; Mr. J. Maleappah, Inspector, 3 days; Mr. A. S. Goonewardene, Supervisor of Conservancy, 18 days.

Resolved—That the leave be sanctioned.

11. Papers *re* lease of toll house at Katugastota.

Resolved—That Dr. H. Huybertsz be requested to sign an agreement in accordance with the conditions of the sale.

12. With the leave of the Council Mr. LaBrooy moved—"That the Superintendent of Municipal Works be asked to submit at an early date an estimate for the erection of a railing round the market as recommended by the Special Committee on Markets and adopted by the Council." Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.—Carried.

13. With the leave of the Council Mr. Beven moved—"That this Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the services to the Council of the late Chairman, Mr. G. S. Saxton, and of the late Members, Messrs. R. W. Jonklaas and L. H. S. Pieris, and to thank them for the same. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried unanimously.

14. The election of Standing Committees for the year resulted as follows :—

- (a) *Law and General Subjects* : Messrs. E. Beven, C. A. LaBrooy, and D. E. Weerasooria.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of January, 1915.

I HAVE the honour to submit the Report of the Public Health Department for the month of January, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the town of Kandy in January, 1915, were 70 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 38 Sinhalese, 4 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 25·58, as against 29·83 in the previous month.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 105 (54 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 10 Moors, 3 Malays, 3 Burghers, and 3 Others), of which 22 were of non-residents. The death-rate (crude) on 83 (excluding 22 non-residents) per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 30·75, as against 29·83 in the previous month.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the total of 105 deaths, 19 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 15 last month.

Stillbirths.—The number of still births registered during the month was 6.

Principal Cases of Death.—10 deaths were registered from Phuenonia, viz., Peradeniya road 2, Halloluwa road 1, Castle Hill street 1, Madawela road 1, Deyanawela 1, Katugastota road 1, and Government Civil Hospital 3. Thirteen deaths were registered from Phthisis. Of these, 3 were from Peradeniya road, 1 from Cross street, 3 from Cemetery road, and 6 from the hospital. Four deaths from Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 7 from Dysentery, 8 from Diarrhoea, 5 from Tetanus, 8 from Immaturity, 1 from Malaria, 2 from Continued Fever, 1 from Marasmus, 1 from Smallpox, 5 from Bright's Disease, 7 from Anchylostomiasis, 1 from Execution, 3 from Accidents, and 19 from Other Causes.

Infectious Diseases.—Thirteen cases of Smallpox, 2 cases of Chickenpox, 4 cases of Enteric Fever, and 5 cases of Continued Fever were reported during January as against 4 cases of Smallpox, 4 cases of Chickenpox, and 1 case of Measles reported in the previous month.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of the air was 75·03°F, as against 74·9° in the previous month. The total rainfall in the month was 8·75 in., as against 14·25 in. during the previous month.
