The Inventor states:—This invention is a composition consisting of the pith and short fibres of the commit husk ground to a coarse powder. To this is added crude petroleum. The whole is then thoroughly mixed and subject to a pressure of from 20 to 80 tons.

For lightly smoking the rubber, the crude petroleum may be left out of the mixture, but to obtain a very good result the mixture should preferably be in the following proportions.

Ground coconut fibre and pith 100 parts.

Crude petroleum from 2 to 7 parts according to shade of rubber required. When the composition is ready for use it can be burnt in any ordinary fire place either in one compressed block, or by being broken into little pieces without in any way reducing the quantity of smoke produced.

The advantages of this invention are that it will burn without any trouble and will produce a large quantity of smoke without flame at a very small cost, and it can be used not only for smoking rubber of the py other substance which it is desired to smoke, but will drive away mosquitoes and other insects.
