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**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE  
MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1914.**

**REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.**

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 32 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

**Births.**

2. The births numbered 1,224 (637 males and 587 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 26·35 per 1,000, against 26·56 in the preceding month, 30·81 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·27 the monthly average since July, 1907. The rate ranged from 7·45 in Kalpitiya to 54·65 in Moratuwa.

3. In the city of Colombo the births numbered 436 (249 males and 187 females), and were equal to an annual rate\* of 21·82 per 1,000, against 20·78 in the preceding month, 22·61 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24·66 the monthly average. The rate ranged from 6·80 in Kollupitiya to 30·16 in Kotahena.

**Deaths.**

4. The total deaths registered during the month amounted to 1,567 (873 males and 694 females). There were 1,301 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate of 30·53 per 1,000, against 26·48 in the preceding month, 31·92 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·76 the monthly average. The rate ranged from 88·12 in Badulla to 9·30 in Tagalla.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 564 (317 males and 247 females). There were 503 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate\* of 29·20 per 1,000, against 25·34 in the preceding month, 31·85 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·93 the monthly average. Kollupitiya showed the lowest death-rate, viz., 13·99, and Wellawatta the highest, 35·24.

6. Stillbirths numbered 81 (42 males and 39 females), against 79 in the preceding month.

**Infantile Mortality.**

7. The infantile mortality was equal to a rate of 253 per 1,000 births registered, against 222 in the preceding month, 352 in the corresponding month of last year, and 267 the monthly average. Infant mortality rates calculated on the number of births and deaths that occur in any one town of small population are misleading, and such rates are omitted from the table.

8. The infantile mortality in the city of Colombo was 289 per 1,000 births registered, against 249 in the preceding month, 473 in the corresponding month of last year, and 318 the monthly average, and ranged from 563 in San Sébastien to 259 in Kotahena.

**Causes of Death.**

9. The highest mortality was from *Debility*, to which 10 per cent. of the total deaths were due, 8 per cent. each were due to *Convulsions*, *Pneumonia*, and *Diarrhaea*, 7 per cent. to *Phthisis*, 6 per cent. to *Dysentery*, 4 per cent. each to *Enteritis* and *Anchylostomiasis*, and 3 per cent. to *Bronchitis*.

10. In the city of Colombo the highest mortality was from *Phthisis*, which caused 10 per cent. of the total number of deaths in the city. 9 per cent. each were due to *Debility* and *Convulsions*, 7 per cent. to *Enteritis*, 6 per cent. to *Pneumonia*, 4 per cent. each to *Plague* and *Bronchitis*, 2 per cent. to *Anchylostomiasis*, and 1 per cent. each to *Smallpox* and *Diarrhaea*. The total number of deaths registered from *Plague*, was 25, against 23 in the preceding month.

11. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The most prevalent infectious disease during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 85 cases were reported (64 in Colombo, 8 in Galle), followed by *Chickenpox* 61 (47 in Colombo, 5 in Kandy, 4 in Galle, 3 in Kalutara), *Smallpox* 43 (in Colombo), *Enteric Fever* 34 (25 in Colombo, 3 in Galle), *Plague* 25 (in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 17 (10 in Colombo), *Dysentery* 12 (11 in Moratuwa), *Diarrhaea* 3 (2 in Colombo), *Measles* 2 (in Colombo), *Whooping Cough* 2 (in Jaffna), *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo), *Mumps* 1 (in Jaffna).

**Meteorology.**

12. *Rainfall.*—Batticaloa recorded the highest rainfall (25·25 inches), followed by Negombo (21·43 inches). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 4·18 inches in Tangalla to 15·96 inches in Jaffna.

13. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 61·2° in Nuwara Eliya to 80·8° in Mannar, and was 80·4° in Colombo.
