By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 35 (1) of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinances, 1892 to 1909," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the date hereof, direct that the Sanitary Board town of Udappu, the limits of which are defined and set out in the schedule hereof, shall be a school division for the purposes of "The Rural Schools Ordinance, 1907," and that the last-named Ordinance shall be in force in the said town.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of Udappu.

North by the southern boundary of the village of Andippana.

North-east by the Mundel lake and the western boundary of the village of Pulichchakulam.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations framed under Sections 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1898 regarding Registration of Cattle.

- 1. On or before January 15 of each year every owner of cattle shall give in triplicate in the Form G. A.—K 4 a list of all cattle in his possession to the Registrar of the division in which such cattle are kept. In cases where such cattle are kept partly in the division in which such owner resides and partly in another division, the list shall be given to the Registrar of the division in which he resides.
- 2. The Udaiyars and Koralas shall be ex-officio Registrars of cattle within their respective divisions, provided that the Government Agent may remove them from office or may limit their jurisdiction and appoint special Registrars for the whole or any part of such divisions.
- 3. The Registrar shall register the lists in the order in which they are received by him, entering the particulars in a register as near as is material in the Form A in the schedule hereto. One copy of the list shall be filed of record by the Registrar in his office, the second copy shall be delivered to the owner of the cattle, and the third copy shall be forwarded by the Registrar, within a week of its registration, to the President of the Village Tribunals having jurisdiction over his division.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the Registrar to compare the list tendered for registration with the corresponding list of the previous year, and otherwise satisfy himself that the number and description of the animals given therein are correct.
- 5. The Registrar shall, on the application of the owner of cattle, and on payment of the fee prescribed in rule No. 10, issue in all cases of transfer a certificate of the registration of such cattle as near as is material in the Form B in the schedule hereto.
- 6. No voucher for the transfer of cattle shall be executed by any headman or other officer, except on production of the said certificate of registration from the Registrar, or of the voucher on which such cattle were transferred.
- 7. The headman or other officer who executes the transfer voucher shall annex the certificate of registration to the counterfoil of the voucher, which is returned to the Kachcheri, and insert the number and date of the certificate and the name of the Registrar issuing the same against item 5 of the transfer voucher Form G. A.—K 1.
- 8. Vouchers for the transfer of cattle belonging to temples, mosques, and pansalas, or to recently deceased persons, or to minors, or to persons of unsound mind, shall be attested by the President, by the Chairman of the Village Committees, or the Chief Headman of the division. In case of a lunatic or minor it shall be the duty of the officer executing such vouchers to satisfy himself that the grantor is the legal or natural guardian of the lunatic or minor, and that the transaction is in the interest of such lunatic or minor, and in no such case shall cattle of the value of Rs. 50 and upwards be transferred, except by a curator duly appointed by the District Court.
 - 9. The Registrar shall keep a register of certificates of registration issued by him as near as is material in the Form C in the schedule hereto, and send a copy of it quarterly to the President of Village Tribunals having jurisdiction over his division.

GREETING.

WHEREAS Sabatino Aboaf, of the Bristol Hotel, Colombo, has, under the provisions of "The Naturalization Ordinance, 1890," applied to Us, Sir Robert Chalmers, K.C.B., Governor of Ceylon, in Our Executive Council, that the privileges of naturalization may, in terms of the said Ordinance, be conferred on the said Sabatino Aboaf, and We, in Executive Council, acting in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by section 3 of the said Ordinance, have made an order bearing date the Twenty-ninth day of April, 1915, granting such application:

And whereas the said Sabatino Aboaf has taken the oath of allegiance prescribed by section 4 of the said Ordinance, and has produced to Us a certificate of his having taken and subscribed such oath and of the date of his taking and subscribing the same, and We are satisfied that the said Sabatino Aboaf has taken the prescribed oath within the period specified in the said section of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We do hereby grant to the said Sabatino Aboaf all the rights and privileges of a British subject, and declare that the said Sabatino Aboaf shall, within the limits of this Colony, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a nature 1-born British subject is entitled or subject.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, under the Public Seal thereof, this Sixteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 15, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 112 (13 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 23.6, as against 24.9 in the preceding week, 24.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 101 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·3, as against 18·1 in the previous week, 26·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 101 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nine deaths from Pneumonia were registered as in the previous week, against 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in Wellawatta, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. One death from Bronchitis was registered.

- 2. Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Kollupitiya, 2 in Maradana, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in New Bazaar.
- 3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered (in Kotahena), as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Two deaths from Smallpox were registered as in the previous week. Of these, I was in New Bazaar and the other in Wellawatta. One case was reported, as against 4 in the previous week.
- 5. No deaths from Plague have been registered during this or the preceding four weeks. Two cases were reported during the week.
- 6. Sixteen deaths from Debility were registered, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 9 from Enteritis, 6 from Worms, 2 from Diarrhæa, 2 from Dysentery, and 34 from Other Causes.
- 7. Six cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 4 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported.

Statz of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 85.7°, against 83.3° in the preceding week and 85.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.760 in., against 29.746 in. in the preceding week and 29.778 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.73 in., against 7.43 in. in the preceding week and 0.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
